## JOHN M. LOVEJOY Was Seaboard Oil Chairman

John Meston Lovejoy, retired chairman of the Seaboard Oil Co., died Saturday at Greenwich Hospital. He was 79 years old and lived at Round Hill Road, Greenwich.

Mr. Lovejoy was graduated from the Columbia University School of Mines in 1911 and began his career as a mining engineer. He served overseas during World War I as a captain in artillery.

Following the war he was a co-founder with Everette L. DeGolyer, the late geologist, of the Amerada Petroleum Corp. In 1930 he became president of Seaboard and in 1953, he became chairman.

In World War II, Mr. Lovejoy served on the War Production Board and was a founder of the Oil Industry Information Committee. He served as president of the American Institute of Mining Engineers in 1936 and was awarded the DeGolyer Medal in 1964 by the Society of Petroleum Engineers. He also received the Eggleston Medal, awarded to Columbia University alumni and was active on the Columbia Engineering Council.

He is survived by his wife, the former Leslie Mackintosh; a son, J. Stuart; a daughter, Mrs. Leslie L. Simmons; two brothers, Donald M. and Harold B.; and seven grandchildren.

Notes : The family, especially sister Leslie Mackintosh Lovejoy, were socially prominent & appeared in the social news columns of New York City area newspapers – but biographical data on them has proved elusive. It is likely the Mackintosh name is misspelled which makes any “literal” spelling searches not productive.
