ROBERT McCARTY

Robert McCarty, 72, a resident of New Auburn, died Monday evening at the Bloomer Memorial Hospital.

Mr. McCarty was born October 7, 1893 in the Town of Sand Creek. He moved with his parents to New Auburn in 1910. On April 11, 1917 he joined the Chippewa National Guard and served with them in France for two years. His marriage to Bertha Quale took place September 19, 1921 in Chippewa Falls.

Mr. McCarty was a member of Bethel Lutheran Church, New Auburn; a charter member of the American Legion Post of New Auburn; the Last Man's Club; the Tuscania Survivors; and the Modern Woodmen. He served as Clerk of the Town of Auburn for 26 years, and also served as school clerk for the Town of Auburn and church secretary. He farmed in the

Town of Auburn until 1963, when he retired and they moved to the village of New Auburn.

Surviving are his wife, Bertha; four sons, Laurence of New Auburn; Clyde of Minneapolis; Howard of Rice Lake; and Donald Michael, Eau Claire; four brothers, Asa, Rockford, Ill., Ernest, Eau Claire; Archie, Columbus, Ohio; and Phillip of Chetek, and ten grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, Mary and Edward McCarty; one infant brother, and two sisters, Mrs. Bessie Lund and Mrs. Mary Hoard.

Besides these was Martin Larson of Prairie Farm route, whose home is close to Dunn county. It has been reported that Harrison Joyce of this city was on the steamer, but the latest revised lists do not contain his name.

ORGANIZED SUNDAY—**

At an organization meeting Sunday at Chippewa Falls of the Northern Wisconsin Tuscania Survivors' club, Guy E. Wiseman of Menomonie, was elected president of the club; W. C. Brown, Cumberland, vice-president and Robert McCarty, New Auburn, secretary-treasurer.

There were 12 Tuscania survivors at the meeting of which Mr. Wiseman is the only one who had attended a meeting of the National Tuscania Survivors' association. It is estimated there are about 75 eligible members in northern Wisconsin for the club formed at Chippewa Falls and Mr. Wiseman is the only survivor of the Tuscania sinking in Dunn county.

The Northern Wisconsin Tuscania club will hold its 1941 meeting at Rice Lake on Feb. 6.

Purpose of organizing the Northern Wisconsin club is to bring the survivors together for a reunion once a year to talk over war days and especially the sinking of the Tuscania at 5 p. m. on February 5, 1918, by a German submarine. On that day when the Tuscania was sunk about 375 lives were lost and about 1,500 soldiers were rescued. Wiseman was one of many picked up by a destroyer after the Tuscania was struck. He was enlisted in Co. A 107 Supply Train, 32nd division at Chippewa Falls, April 7, 1917.

Members of the organization from Barron and Cumberland, as well as Rice Lake, also attended. Gereaux was elected president and Doege secretary-treasurer for the ensuing year. They invited members at Rice Lake meeting to attend the 27th anniversary convention at Chippewa Falls next year.

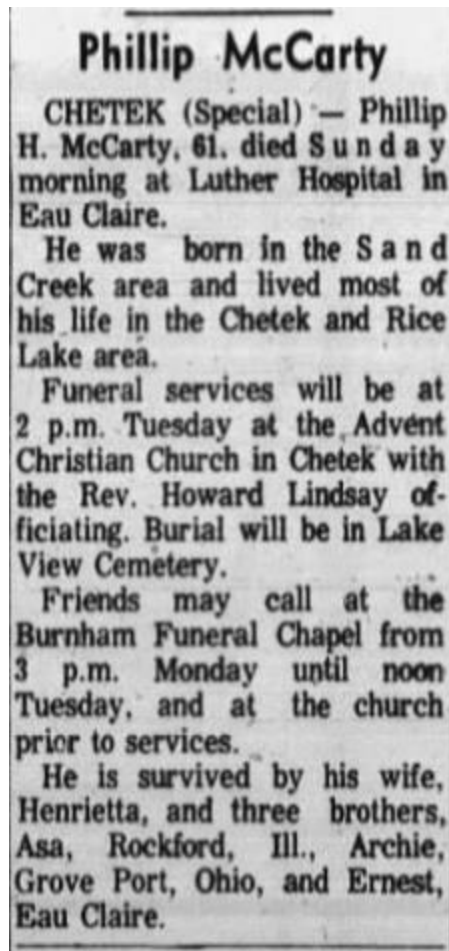
