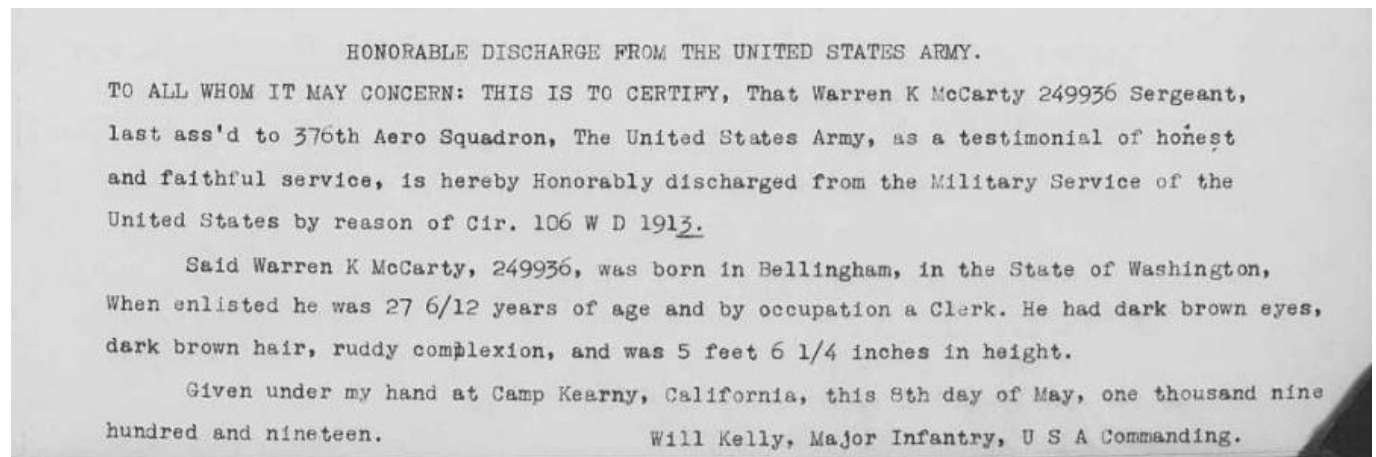

Dear Mr. Smith:

I wish to express my appreciation of your article entitled: "SEVEN YEARS AGO: THE TUSCANIA" in the January 30th edition of the American Legion Weekly. Quite a number of us who were survivors of that ill-fated voyage were rather irritated over the article by William Cobb in the Saturday Evening Post a short time later, and to which you make reference. I am glad to see that you have at last given out the truth of the matter.

The writer was a member of the 100th Aero Squadron at that time. We had given up our quarters to form a hospital section for the men suffering from mumps and were ourselves quartered on the bottom deck at the time we were hit. I was out in the middle of the hatch on this bottom deck rolling up my blanket roll preparatory to landing the next morning. I certainly agree with you that the non-coms who had electric flashlights were a wonderful help to us in finding those narrow stairways in the dark.

I finally got to the boat station and into a life boat, which as you say, up-ended, spilling nearly everyone out. I fortunately grabbed a seat and stayed with it. Then, when we hadn't much more than reached the water, a loaded boat smashed down upon us. I don't know how it missed me. It tore part of one side off our boat. Anyway, I stayed with it, along with perhaps a dozen others, as I had failed to locate my life preserver in the darkness. We drifted away with one oar between us, and some two hours later were fortunately drifted into and were rescued by the destroyer, "H.M.S. GRASSHOPPER" which landed us next morning at Londonderry.

Would be very glad to hear from you some time. I know a Post Adjutant may have some spare time for personal correspondence. At any rate accept my best regards.

NOTE: The sides of a destroyer near the smoke stacks are fairly low, and from that point the life boats were pulled close by the seamen. Every time a wave brought the lifeboat closer to the side of the destroyer, we made a jump for the rail, and the sailors did grab your wrists and jerk you aboard like a sack of flour - that's how I was rescued. I immediately was pushed aside and in the darkness sat down near a smokestack. Immediately a seaman warned me that I was sitting on a "hot seat" and I immediately got up to avoid being burned in the buttocks. Down below another seaman passed whisky around in a bowl and each of us took a healthy swig and felt warmed up a little.

S. A. RESIDENTS TO ATTEND CORONATION OF KING GEORGE

Attending the coronation of King George VI as a guest of an English lord will be the pleasant and memorable experience of Attorney and Mrs. C. B. Diehl, of 2309 Bonnie Brae Santa Ana, who plan to sail March 20 on the Furness line S. S. Pacific Reliance for London by way of the Panama Canal.

Mrs. Diehl's nephew, Lord Hyndley, of London, already has procured their seats at the colorful coronation ceremony, which is scheduled May 11.

The Diehls will be guests of the peer, and also of Mrs. Diehl's sister, Mrs. Westoll, of Coniscliffe Hall, Durham, in the north of England.

Through Lord Hyndley's influence, Judge Diehl expects to secure opportunity to observe the English courts and parliament, to which he is looking forward with keen interest. He also will stop at Lord Hyndley's shooting lodge on his Northumberland estates

along the River Tyne for hunting and fishing.

The Diehls expect to tour Scotland and the continent, particularly Germany, while abroad. They will return home through Canada, stopping at Montreal for a visit.

Other Santa Anans who expect to attend the coronation include Mrs. Warren K. McCarty, and her two children, Marguerite and Warren, Jr., 821 Lowell street. Mrs. McCarty, a native of England, was the war bride of Warren McCarty, American goldier, and has not seen her homeland since coming to America with her husband after the war.
