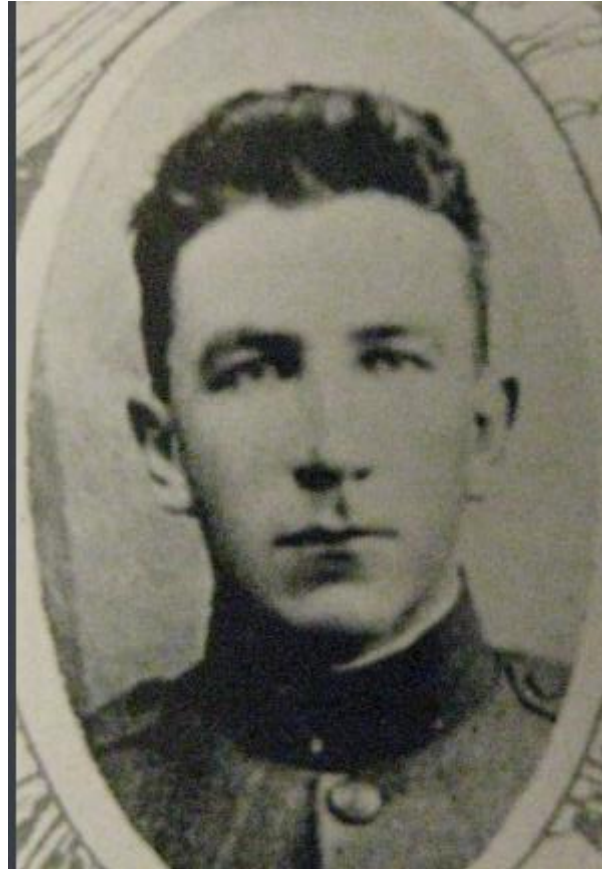

POY SIPPI — When Poppy Princess Carol Jane McCue represented the American Legion Auxiliary of Poy Sippi on Poppy Day, last week, she also represented an impressive and significant background of service to her country by members of her family.

During three wars, her relatives have served in the armed forces.

Her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Leland McCue are Gold Star parents having lost their two sons, Allen and Donald during World War II.

McCue, a World War I veteran served abroad and is a survivor of the sinking of the Tuscania. Another son, LeRoy, also served in World War II.

Carol's father, Leland Jr., is a Korean war veteran and received a Purple Heart after being wounded in enemy action in 1950.

Her uncle, Dwaine Glass, served for nine years in the Air Force, during the Korean War period. During the Berlin Air Lift crisis he served in Germany.

Princess Carol's promotion of poppy sales had a strong family backing and her first sale was to the chairman of the town, Harold Madison.

Three sons of Mr. and Mrs. Leland McCue, R. 1, Adell, are serving in the armed forces overseas. They are Pfc. LeRoy, Pvt. Allen and Pfc. Donald.

Pfc. LeRoy M. McCue, 23, entered service Nov. 14, 1941, and was stationed first at Fort Sheridan, then at Fort Knox, Ky., and then at Fort Bragg, N. C.

Finishing his training at Fort Bragg he was then transferred overseas and arrived at Casablanca and later took part in the

invasion of Sicily. He has since been transferred to England and is now in a hospital recuperating from an attack of malaria.

Pvt. Allen O. McCue, 22, entered service Dec. 2, 1942, and was sent to Camp Grant. He was then transferred to Camp Roberts, Cal., where he received all his training, and is now somewhere in the southwest Pacific.

Pfc. Donald L. McCue, 20, joined the armed forces on Dec. 28, 1942,

and was sent to Fort Sheridan. He later took his training at Camp Walters, Tex., and Camp Stoneman, Cal., and was transferred overseas last May. He is in action somewhere in the southwest Pacific.

Because of government restrictions, addresses of boys serving overseas cannot be published, but any friends of the McCue boys who wish to write to them can get their correct addresses by contacting the parents.

SOLDIER GRANDSON OF POY SIPPI WOMAN REPORTED KILLED ON BIAK

Poy Sippl, Wis.—(Special)—Information has been received here by Mrs. Cora McCue, that her grandson, Pvt. First Class Allen McCue, son of Mr. and Mrs. Leland McCue, of Addell, was killed in action during the battle of Biak island, May 28, off the coast of New Guinea. His wife survives. Two brothers are also in the service.

Pfc. Donald L. McCue Killed In Action On Luzon April 20

Adell. — Pfc. Donald L. McCue, 21-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs Leland McCue, route 1, Adell, was killed in action on Luzon April 20, according to an announcement released Friday by the war department.

His reported death was the second war fatality to strike the McCue household in one year. On May 28, 1944, another son, Pvt. Allen O. McCue, 23, lost his life on Biak Island in the South Pacific while fighting in defense of his country.

According to the official communication from Washington, Pfc. McCue was killed instantly when struck by Japanese artillery fire. Complete details were withheld, but army officials indicated that further information would be forwarded to the parents relating details of death and burial.

Private McCue was inducted into the army on Dec. 28, 1942, and was sent from Fort Sheridan, Ill., to Camp Wolters, Tex., for basic infantry training. Subsequently, he received additional instruction at Fort Stoneman, Calif., and left for overseas service on May 7, 1943. Since that time, he participated in combat action on Bougainville in the Solomon island group and in the Philippines. For "exceptional

gallantry" in action against Japanese forces on Bougainville he was awarded the Bronze Star medal.

Pvt. McCue was born at Poy Sippi, Wis., on Feb. 25, 1924, and attended school in that community. Nine years later he moved with his

family to Town Scott where he completed his elementary education and enrolled in the Waldo High school. Before his graduation from high school he enlisted in the army. For several months he had been employed at the Lakeshire-Marty company, Plymouth.

Survivors include his parents; two brothers, Sgt. LeRoy McCue, a war casualty now hospitalized in an American base hospital in Germany, and Leland, at home, and two sisters, Violet and Eva Rae, both at home.

Pfc. Donald L. McCue Given Bronze Star Medal By Army

For exhibiting "exceptional gallantry" in action against Japanese forces on Bougainville in the Solomon Island group last March, Pfc. Donald L. McCue has been awarded the bronze star medal, according to word received here on Thursday by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leland McCue, Route 1, Adell.

According to information forwarded to Mr. and Mrs. McCue, following receipt of news of the presentation, the Adell soldier, an assistant mortar gunner, and an Illinois ammunition carrier, displayed exceptional gallantry and courage in volunteering to man a machine gun, the crew of which had been injured by enemy fire.

The dispatch said, in part: "To reach the gun, they dashed about 75 yards through a veritable hail of enemy machine-gun and rifle fire, with enemy mortar shells bursting around them. Taking turns as gunner they fired frequently through the next 24 hours, despite the fact that they had been slightly wounded by an enemy mortar shell landing near their position."

"Their gallant action was of great assistance in a counter-attack against the enemy in pinning the Japs down so the attack could proceed and in covering withdrawal after the enemy had been driven back."

A member of an infantry unit with American troops in the

Southwest Pacific, Private McCue was inducted into the service on Dec. 28, 1942. After receiving army training at Fort Worth, Tex., and Fort Stoneman, Calif., he was sent overseas on May 7, 1943. Prior to his induction he was employed at the Lakeshire-Marty company, Plymouth. His brother, Pvt. Allen McCue, was killed in action at Biak Island in the Pacific theater on May 28.

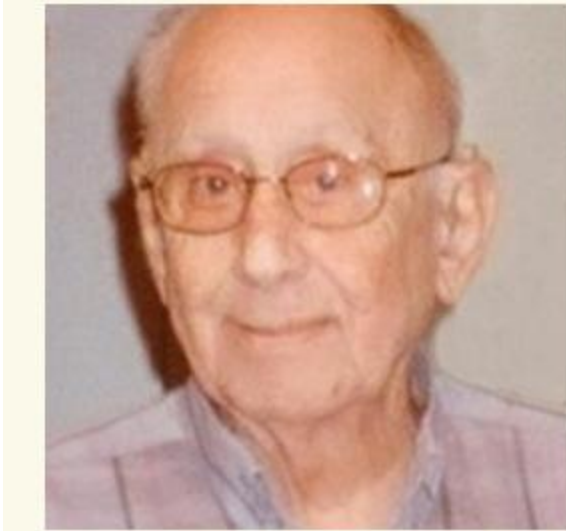
The bridegroom was attended by Leland McCue Jr., brother of the bride, and Clifford Zuge, brother of the bridegroom.

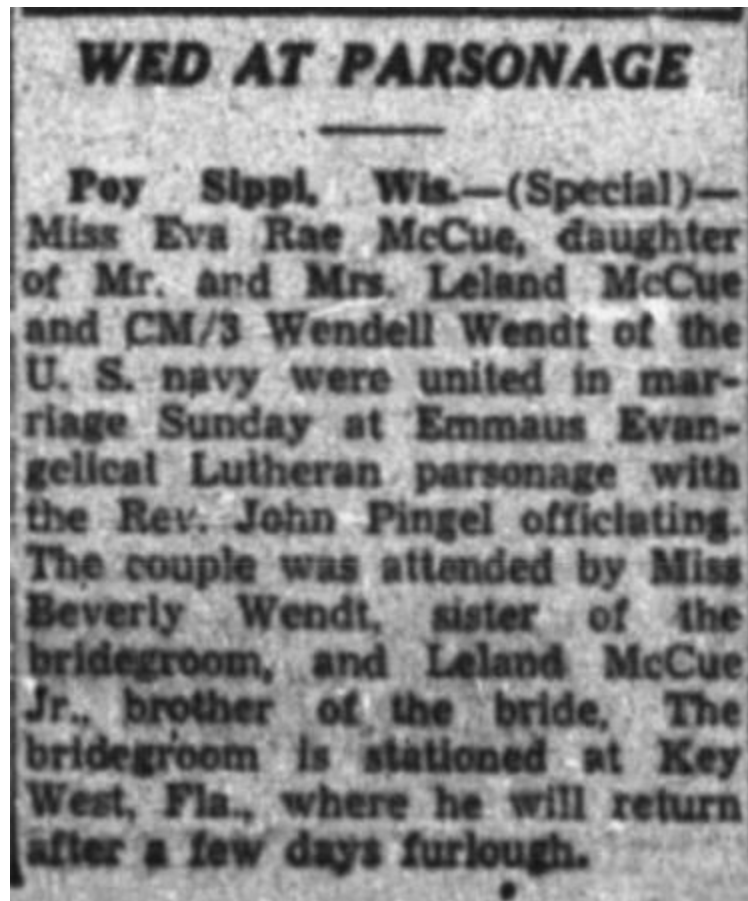

Wendell and Eva Wendt will celebrate their 65th wedding anniversary with family and friends March 30 at their home in Lewiston.

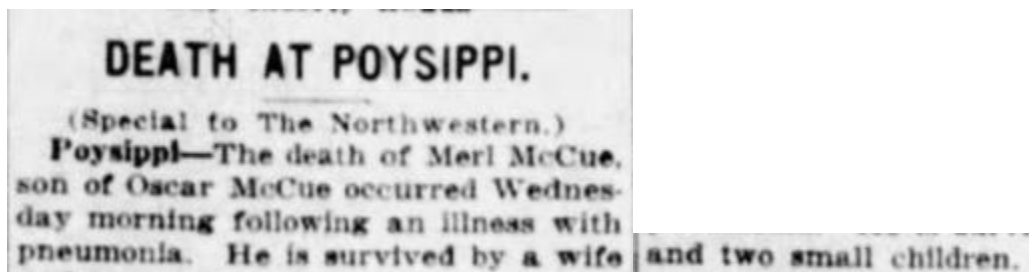
