Buffalo soldier on the Tuscania is landed safely

Joseph Neville of Twentieth engineers among transport survivors.

From The Express Bureau.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 9.—Joseph G. R. Neville, No. 22 Heward avenue, Buffalo, was among the survivors of the Tuscania disaster reported to the navy department tonight.

Joseph Neville is 22 years old and an inspector of lumber in the forestry division of the Twentieth U. S. Engineers. He was graduated from school No. 60 and then entered the employ of the Sullivan Lumber company. He was inspector of lumber for that company when he enlisted in Buffalo in the fall.

His father, Joseph C. Neville, received an official telegram from the navy department at Washington last night announcing the safe arrival of his son. "I hope that every other mother whose son was on the ship will get the same telegram," his mother said last night.

TELEGRAM TELLS PARENTS THEIR SON WAS NOT DROWNED

Rejoicing in a Buffalo family, in suspense for three days, since news was published of the successful attack of a U-boat on the Anchor liner *Tuscania*, of the Irish coast, was caused by a terse telegram from the war department yesterday.

It bore to Mr. and Mrs. John C. Neville of No. 22 Heward avenue word of the safety of their son, Joseph G. Neville, who is a private in the 20th United States Engineers, one of the units that sailed for Europe on the ill-fated British transport.

Neville enlisted in Buffalo last June. He was assigned to the engineering service because of his experience as inspector. He is twenty-two years old.

First knowledge that his unit had sailed for foreign service was obtained from press dispatches, which gave the 20th Engineers as included among the 2,179 American troops on board the liner.

Beyond the fact that Private Neville is safe, his parents received no word. It was assumed he was among 2,000 survivors, soldiers and sailors, landed at Irish ports.

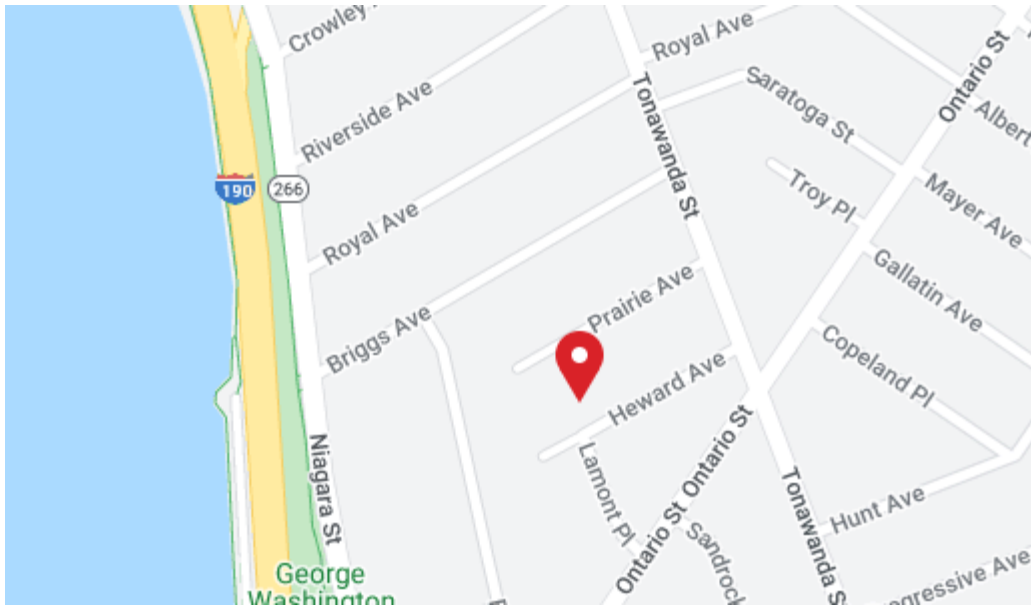
Private Neville is a graduate of school No. 60. He is a member of Company E of the engineering unit.

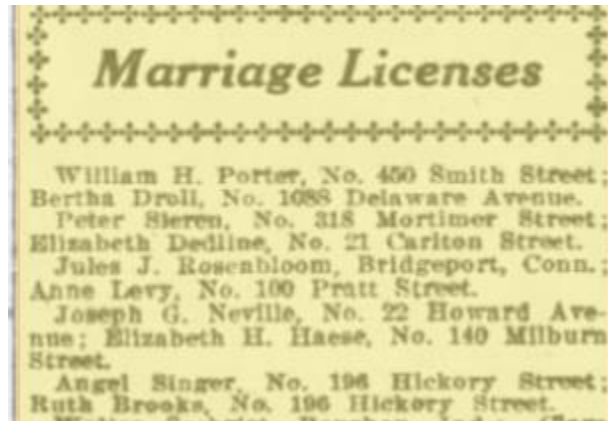

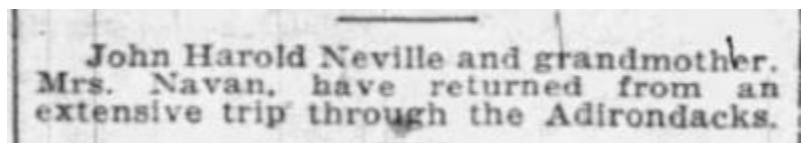

Gay paid his fine but the other boys were compelled because of a lack of the necessary funds to take ten days each in the Erie county penitentiary. The boys went to Niagara Falls Monday. They were stealing a ride on a New York Central passenger train home when they were ejected from the train at Tonawanda. As the train pulled away from the station the boys threw stones at it. They were arrested by Sergeant Diedrich.

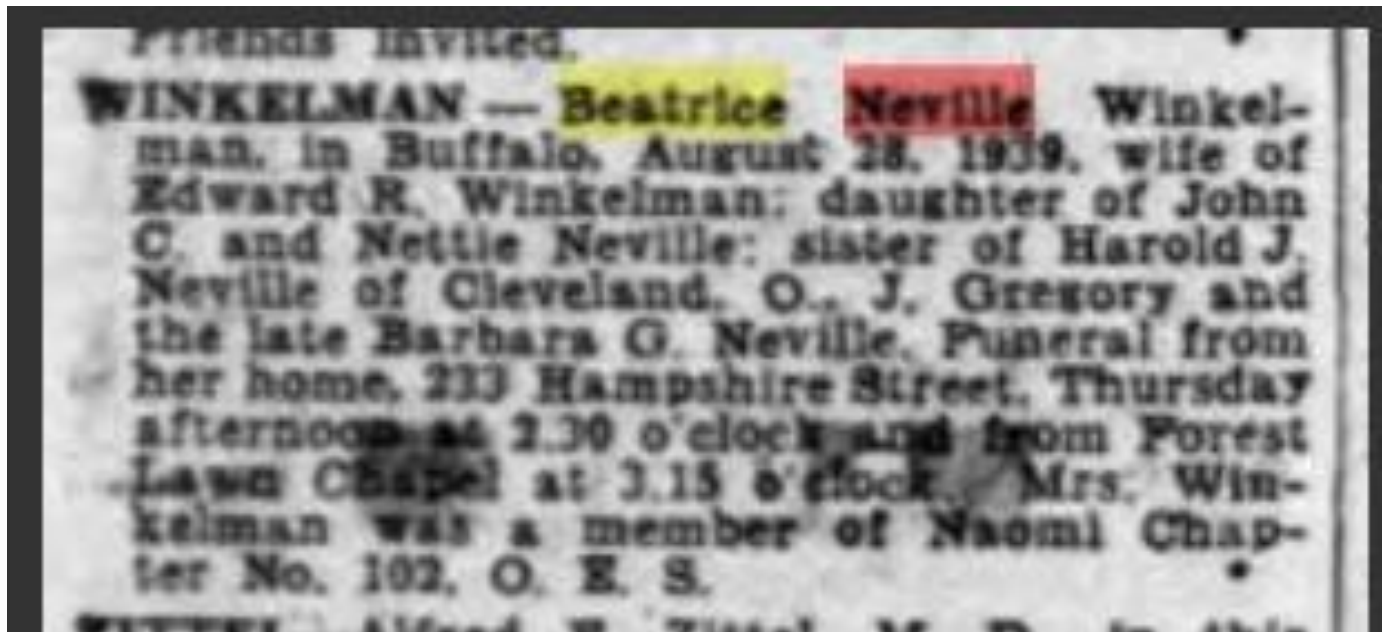
