Lindenhurst is anxiously awaiting further news of Lawrence Negretti, one of its young men, who was aboard the Tuscania when she went down in the Atlantic off the coast of Ireland.

Negretti was 18 years old and the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Negretti. He enlisted in the Aviation Branch of the service only three months ago, ~~and was assigned to the 213th Aero Squadron at Mineola.~~

Three weeks ago the young man was called here to attend the funeral of a younger sister and nothing had been heard of him since his leave of absence until his name appeared as one of those on the Tuscania.

The sister who died 3 weeks earlier appears to be Mary, who died 15 Jan 1918 - “Brooklyn Times Union” Saturday 9 Feb 1918 p 2

Lindenhurst, Oct. 16.—All Holy Name societies in the 32d Long Island District participated in the rally and parade held in Lindenhurst yesterday afternoon. About 750 members of the organizations from churches in the western portion of Suffolk County, marched with their banners, escorted by the Lindenhurst Fire Department, and members of the village board.

Services were held in Our Lady of Perpetual Help R. C. Church, following the parade. The sermon was delivered by the Rev. John R. O'Mahoney, of Bohemia. The rally was arranged as a public manifestation of Catholic men opposed to profanity.

The Rev. T. E. Farrenkopf, pastor of the Lindenhurst, was in charge of the arrangements for the demonstration. Robert C. Kienle, president of the local Holy Name Society, was grand marshal of the parade, assisted by Frank Slover of Brentwood, Vincent Delaney and William Bonn, of Lindenhurst; John Dietz, of Amityville; Frank Kazda, of Babylon; Fred E. Lindenhurst Man Killed as Train Hits Car at Unguarded Crossing

Lindenhurst—Trapped in his stalled automobile, a 78-year-old Lindenhurst man died under the wheels of an eastbound Long Island Rail Road passenger train at the unguarded South 8th St. grade crossing here yesterday morning.

The dead man was identified as John Dietz, a retired carpenter of 34 Herbert St., here. He died instantly, crushed to death in the wreckage of his car.

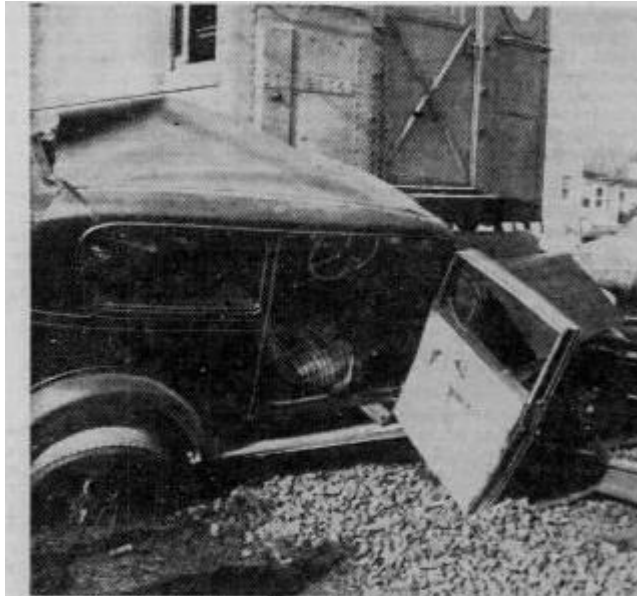
Lindenhurst Police Chief Otto Goercken, who placed the time of the accident at 9:45 AM said that Dietz apparently failed to see or hear the eight-car passenger train as he approached the grade crossing from the south.

As he mounted the crossing his car stalled in the center of the tracks. Seconds later the train roared through, smashing the car and dragging it 375 feet down the tracks before it could be brought to a halt. Dietz' body was found in the wreckage.

Vamps at Scene

Men of the Lindenhurst Fire Department Rescue Squad were called to the scene but there was little they could do. Dr. Isaac Schlamm Lindenhurst physician, pronounced the man dead at 10:10 AM. The body was removed to the Lindenhurst Funeral Home on permission granted by Coroner Marshall W. Brown.

Walter Helling Lindenhurst oil dealer who was delivering fuel oil to a warehouse a block from

the crossing was an eye witness to the tragedy.

He told William Coleman, DA's investigator, that Dietz stalled on the crossing when the train was less than 100 feet away. The motorman blew two warning blasts on his whistle but it was too late. On his way to the nearest telephone where he called the police, Helling heard a loud crash and grinding of metal.

Questioned by the police but not held were James W. Markin, the motorman of Astoria, and George Murtaugh, conductor, of Flushing.

It is estimated that the train, which was to have stopped at the Lindenhurst station, was moving at about 45 miles per hour when the crash occurred.

No Gates

Police pointed out that the tragedy might have been avoided if the LIRR had installed automatic gates at the crossing, plans for which were approved three months ago. The only work that has been completed so far is the installation of concrete footing for the gates.

Guarded by only a stop look and

listen sign, the crossing is doubly hazardous since visibility from the south side of the crossing is obstructed by a six-foot high wire fence running parallel to the tracks and a large steel box housing electrical apparatus.

A report having reached District Attorney Young, that Oluinda Negretti, 16 years old, daughter of John Negretti, of Upper Wellwood avenue, Lindenhurst, was missing, he got in touch with Deputy Sheriff Amzi Biggs, who started an investigation. The girl left home Thursday morning, and it is rumored she took the 1:06 train that afternoon from Lindenhurst station going west. Just before the train left the station she was seen in the company of Benny Cristianati, 18 years of age, who until a week ago conducted a barber shop at Copiague. His residence was at Farmingdale. He is also missing. The missing girl weighs about 110 pounds, is 5 feet 2 inches in height, light complexion, blue eyes and wore a black silk dress and brown Oxford ties. Cristianati is 5 feet 6 inches tall and has a dark complexion.

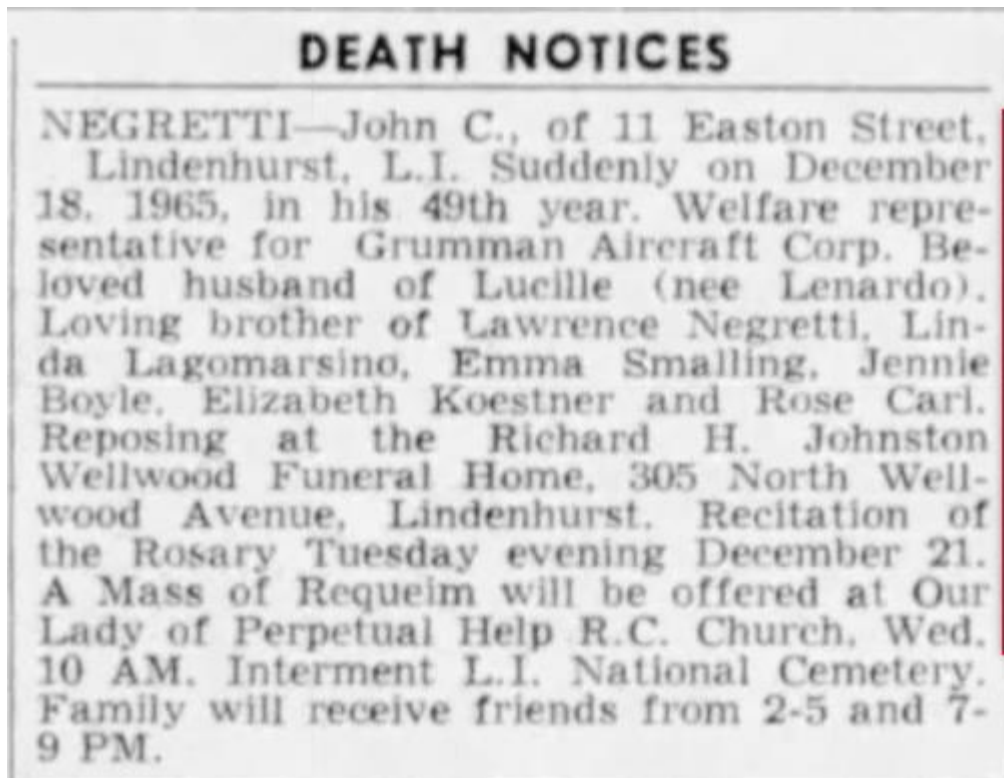
