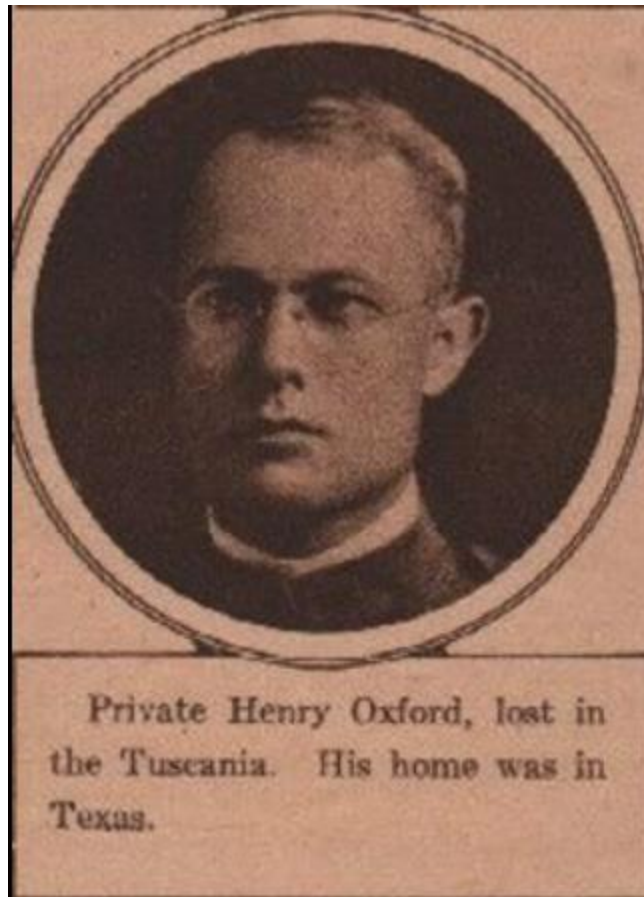

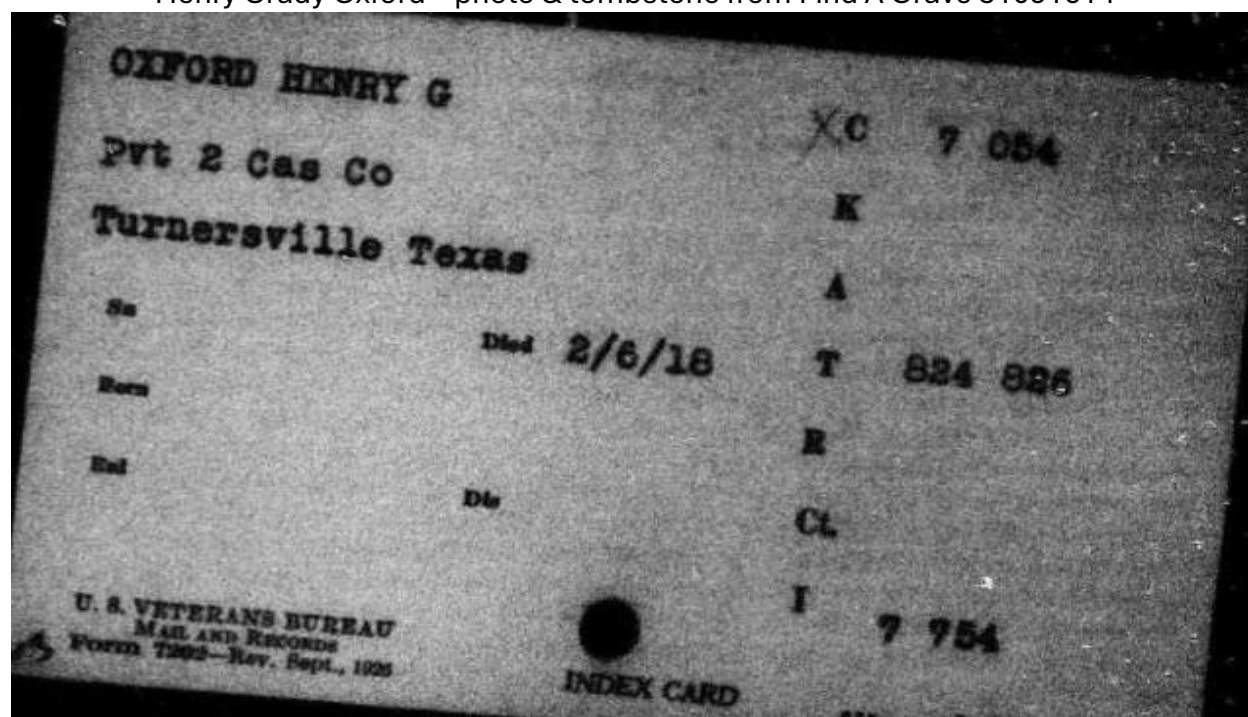

— Henry Oxford of Turnersville drowned when the Lusitania sank on May 7, 1915. His body was returned home and was given a military burial in Prairie View Cemetery.

J. S. Oxford, Teacher, Dies

**Missionary Had Spent 32
Years in Japan; Funeral
Services Will Be Today.**

J. S. Oxford, 63, 2220 Lincoln, teacher-missionary to Japan for 32 years and for 30 years principal of the Palmore Institute of Kobe, died at a hospital at 11 a. m. Monday after an operation which followed an illness of three weeks.

Mr. Oxford returned to the United States in December, 1940, and was transferred to the Panama

mission field and served there until six months ago when he came back to Fort Worth on a furlough. He had planned to go to Costa Rica on mission work Oct. 1.

The part of Mr. Oxford's life which was not spent in Japan was rather closely linked with Fort Worth. A native of Hico, La., he was married 35 years ago to Miss Ruby George, daughter of W. L. George, Fort Worth druggist of that time who has retired and still lives here. Mrs. Oxford, who survives him, went to Japan with him and taught English, music and Bible in the school of which he was the head.

The Women's Missionary Society of the First Methodist Church supported Mr. Oxford's work in Japan for 20 years.

While in Japan, Mr. Oxford also was treasurer of the Methodist Japanese Mission Board and had charge of the disbursement of all mission funds of the church in that country.

Mr. Oxford was educated at Daniel Baker College, Vanderbilt University and Poughkeepsie University.

A son, Wayne Oxford, 18, also survives. He was born in the United States, while his parents were on another furlough, but has spent most of his life in Kobe. He is in the Army, assigned to University of Michigan for training as a Japanese translator. He came home when his father became sick.

Other survivors are three brothers, Thomas Oxford of Brownwood; Sidney Oxford of Houston, and Dr. J. W. Oxford of Floresville, and a sister, Mrs. Velo Homan of Crawford.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Tuesday at the First Methodist Church. Dean E. B. Hawk of SMU, former pastor of the First Methodist church and a classmate of Mr. Oxford at Vanderbilt, will officiate. He will be assisted by Rev. Warren Johnston, pastor of the church; Rev. Marcus M. Chunn, pastor of Central Methodist Church, and Rev. L. Bowman Craven, pastor of Boulevard Methodist Church.

Burial will be in the Garden of Memories.

At the request of Mr. Oxford, active pallbearers will be selected from the Dr. Eugene Stegall Men's Bible Class. When it became apparent he might not survive, he also made the request that no flowers be sent to the funeral.

Mr. Oxford died at 3:20 p.m. Monday in the Brownwood Community Hospital following a long illness.

Born Jan. 25, 1882 in Hico, La., he was a retired clothing salesman for Betts and Gibbs. He had lived in Brownwood since 1902 and was married to Virginia Morris in Brownwood July 3, 1910. He was a member of the Union Presbyterian Church and a 1906 graduate of Daniel Baker College.

Survivors include his wife; two daughters, Miss Virginia Oxford and Mrs. Vernon Ellis, both of Brownwood; a sister, Mrs. Vela Homan of Gatesville; two great-grandchildren.
