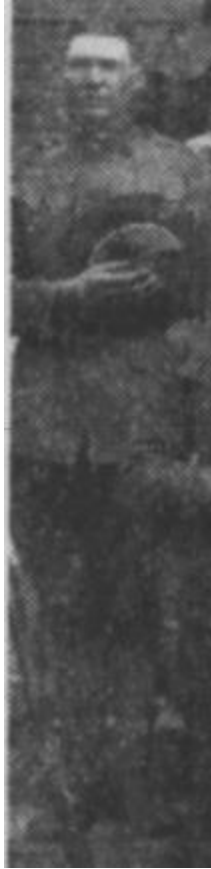

FAREWELL TO HER SOLDIERS

Lansford Honors Her Sons Prior To Their Departure to Join Army.

The citizens of Lansford gave her 34 soldier boys a farewell of a large parade and banquet last night. With the 34 men from Lansford was one from Coal Dale.

The banquet was served in the parlors of Lansford's fire company building. At the close of the banquet Attorney W. G. Thomas delivered an address and the Rev. Jas. B. May pronounced the benediction.

Another farewell party was held in the rooms of the Craftmen's Masonic Club, three of the departing men being members of that club. Nearly a hundred members of the club were present, when, after an address by Leslie G. Reese, president of the club; and by several of the members of the club, including the three departing members, Elmer Holmes, Jenkin Jenkins, and Elwood J. Reese. Con. McCool, Wilkes-Barre, was introduced. Mr. McCool is a public entertainer. A banquet followed the entertainment.

These 35 men are all volunteers and were enlisted by Sergt. Harry W. Wiley, Capt. Floyd R. Myers and Capt. Howard Wilson, of the Tamaqua recruiting station. Capt. Wilson goes today to the Harrisburg office, and the volunteers, in charge of Sergt. Wiley, left Tamaqua today at 11:11 o'clock for Harrisburg, from whence they will go to Columbus, Ohio, and finally Texas. All of the 35 men have been enlisted in the aviation branch of the service. Many of these men come from Lansford's oldest families, 22 of them being members of Camp 252, P. O. S. of A. and ten are members of the Lansford Fire Co. These members make the members gone out from Camp 252, P. O. S. of A., 79. More than 500 enlisted and drafted men have gone from Lansford into the service.

LANSFORD BOYS SAVED

Elmer Holmes and Floyd Price Rescued From Tuscania

Special to The Inquirer.

LANSFORD, Pa., Feb. 18.—Friends of Elmer E. Holmes and his chum, Floyd Price, have been relieved by receipt of the news that both boys, who were aboard the ill-fated transport *Tuscania*, are safe after a harrowing experience.

Holmes volunteered in the aviation service, despite the fact that he could easily have secured exemption from the draft, being engaged in an essential business and the only support of his aged parents. He was assigned to the 158th Aero Squadron.

The two survivors are part of a large patriotic section of Lansford, which, out of a population of 10,000 persons, has given over 800 boys to the service. Seven hundred of these were volunteers.

SURVIVOR OF THE TUSCANIA

**Writes of His Thrilling
Experience**

HIS NARROW ESCAPE

**Is Nephew of Mrs. R. N.
Wear of This City**

Brimful of interesting details of the sinking of the transport Tuscania, off the north coast of Ireland on February 6 in which several hundred men, including many American soldiers, went to watery graves, Floyd Price, of Longford, Calif., a nephew of Mrs. R. N. Wear, of 89½ Montagen avenue, this city, tells of the thrilling rescue from the sinking vessel. His letter, sent from Randalstown, Ireland, has recently reached the young man's mother and a copy of it has been received here.

"* * * I was very lucky, not even getting into the water as many of the poor fellows had to," writes Private Price. "At the time the torpedo struck the ship I was away down below decks in the storage mess hall where I was working the whole trip. This was below the water line on the ship. When she was struck the lights went out and everybody made a dive for the stairs and believe me I was with them. I had to get up a pair of stairs to get on the main deck and then three more to the place where my life boat was. It just took me three minutes to get there and when I got there my boat was not there. Where she got to I don't as yet know, but I thought I was stuck for a while but kept my eye open. The first boat lowered was upset and those in it were dumped into the water. The second was lowered to the water safely, but at the time she was lowered there was only a half load and I expected to see the rest of the men slide down the ropes, who belonged to the boat, but those who were in it started to row away and when I saw that I slid down the rope to it. After rowing around awhile we were picked up by a British destroyer, which was steaming around picking up other boats until about 10:30 p. m. Then we landed about 4:45 a. m. on February 6 in Ireland. There after receiving a warm breakfast we were given beds, believe me I slept like a rock. The funny part of it was Eimer and I left the Tus-

canla in different directions and different boats, but were lucky enough to be picked up by the same destroyer, but we did not meet each other until the next day. I thought that possibly he was a goner and he thought the same of me, but we are together and are happy. (Elmer is young Price's companion.)

"That young fellow I pointed out to you that day at Garden City who said he only lived three miles away, was a very good friend of mine. He and I slept together in the same stateroom. He had been sick for two days and five minutes before we were struck. I had his supper sent up to him. I have not seen him since the accident, but I am still hoping that he was among those saved as he is a fine fellow. There are forty-one out of our squadron here at this place but we understand there are more of them some place else. You should have seen us when we arrived here, we looked like a bunch of bums as some of us have sailor clothes on and some civilian clothes and some soldier clothes. I was in my shirt sleeves when I got away from the ship and had nothing on my head, but I had on a sweater besides my top shirt, but I was not cold at the time for it was cold at the time, but we rowed for all we were worth. I have a civilian cap on and a coat to a British uniform and I am all right.

"Well, so much for that. We landed in Ireland where we have been treated swell both by the Irish and by the Scotch, who look upon us as heroes. Nothing seems too much trouble for them to do to make us comfortable.

"Now don't worry about me. I am coming back home to you again. I am glad I went over there."

Anniversary of Sinking of Transport

LANSFORD—Fourteen years ago on Saturday, the American transport ship, Tuscania, with a consignment of American soldiers on board, including Elmer E. Holmes and Floyd Price, Lansford, was torpedoed and sunk off the coast of Ireland by a German submarine. The sinking of the Tuscania caused a loss of life estimated at nearly 290 but fortunately, Price and Holmes were among the survivors picked up by a British destroyer. They were rescued after several hours afloat in separate life boats. They were picked up by the same ship and each thought the other lost until they met sometime later.
