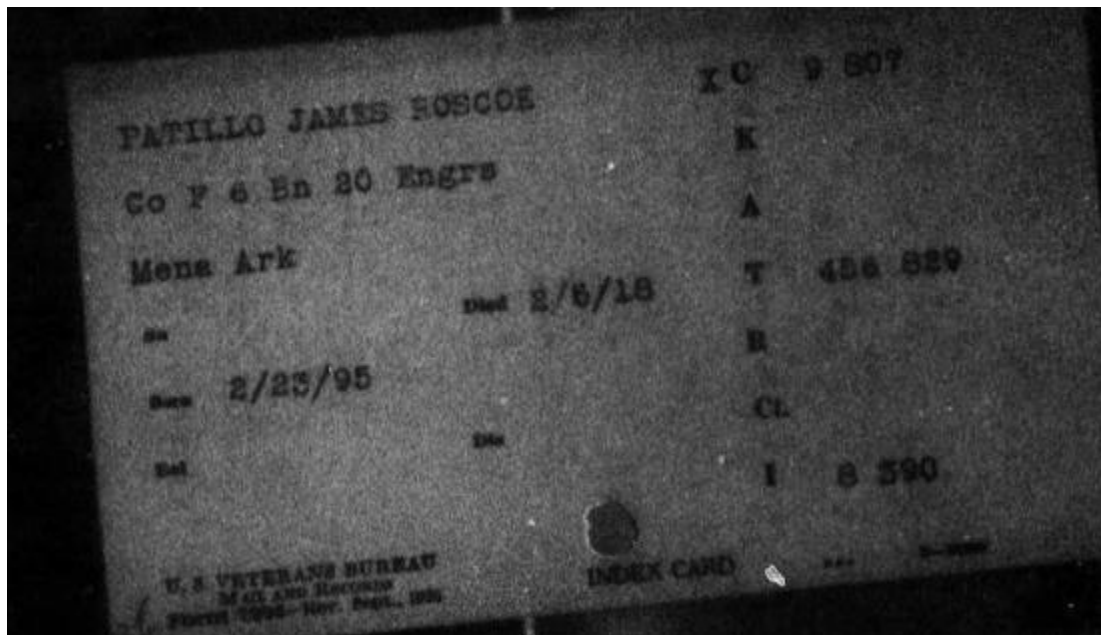

SIX ARKANSANS LISTED AS AMONG THE MISSING

Washington, Feb. 10.—Eighteen hundred and thirty-two names of American soldiers rescued from the torpedoed liner Tuscania had been reported tonight to the war department, leaving 345 of the soldiers on board unaccounted for. No official report has reached the department to change the estimate that all except 113 of the men were saved, but the names have been coming in very slowly over the cables and there is no assurance as to when the list will be complete.

Six Arkansans who were on board are among those not yet accounted for. Their names may be added later to the list of survivors.

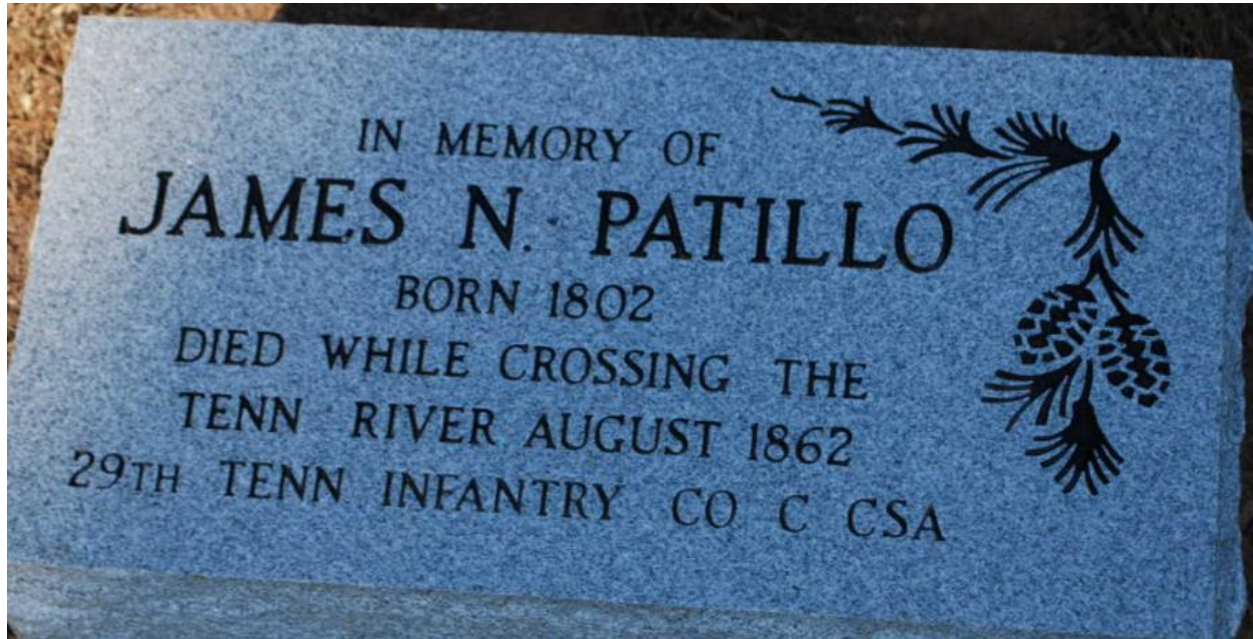

This headstone for his paternal grandfather James N. It is an ironic twist that his grandson James Roscoe Patillo drowned in World War I on Tuscania in the North Channel of the Atlantic Ocean –
