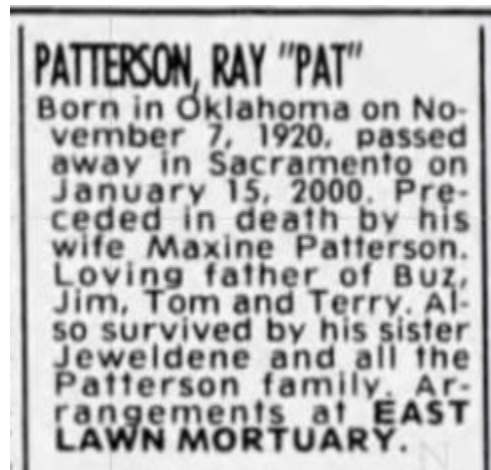

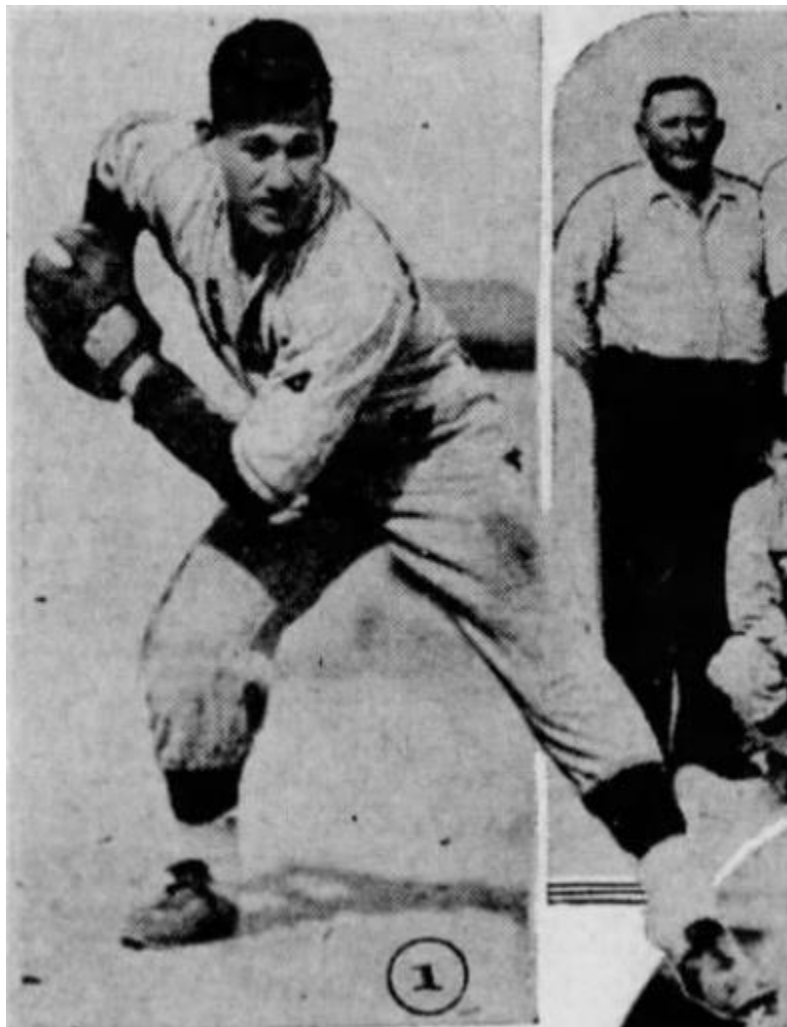

CHILOCCO INDIAN AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL.

Constructed in 1883 and known by various names (Haworth Institute, Chilocco Indian Industrial School, Chilocco Indian Agricultural School, Chilocco Indian School) this federal off-reservation boarding school was established to house, civilize, Christianize, educate, and transform American Indian youth. Thousands of Native children and young adults passed under the school's entryway arch, the architectural marker of "civilized" space since Greek and Roman times. In January 1884 Chilocco opened its doors to 150 children from the Cheyenne, Arapaho, Wichita, Comanche, and Pawnee tribes. By 1895 enrollment had increased to 352, and by 1906 students hailed from a wide variety of tribes across Oklahoma and the West. Significant enrollment from the so-called "Five Civilized Tribes" did not occur until after 1910, but by 1925 Cherokee constituted the largest single tribal affiliation at the school (26 percent of approximately nine hundred students). As public schools became more accessible to Indian children after World War II, Chilocco served students from more remote, inaccessible areas such as the Navajo reservation in Arizona and New Mexico and communities in Alaska.

Located between Arkansas City, Kansas, to the north and Ponca City, Oklahoma, to the south, Chilocco embodied many roles until its doors were closed in 1980. Home and haven to some, reformatory and prison to others, Chilocco was one of many federal schools designed to dissolve tribal identity and erase indigenous beliefs and practices. Judged by these federal goals, Chilocco both succeeded and failed. In the process, the lives of Native people were indelibly altered, and Chilocco alumni, whether they praise or curse its name, will always know themselves as Chiloccoans.

From 1884 until the early 1930s Chilocco operated according to a template devised by U.S. Army officer Richard H. Pratt at Carlisle Indian School in Pennsylvania. The large off-reservation schools used rigorous military discipline and stressed instruction in trades and manual and domestic labor—known as "actual work." Alumni from these years remember twenty-two bugle calls a day, government-issue uniforms, scanty meals, inadequate health care, and a paucity of individual attention. They also remember the bonds of loyalty and love that knit students together, and the rivalries of tribe, degree of blood, age, and language difference that cross-cut school society.

In 1928 an exposé of federal Indian Service mismanagement scathingly critiqued conditions in the boarding schools, and in the early 1930s some reforms were introduced. Boys and girls could sit together in the dining rooms, more attention was invested in academic work, and drudgery work devoted to school upkeep was cut back. Nonetheless, many aspects of student life endured: separation from home and family for years at a time, devotion to fellow students, strict discipline, and curricula that remained focused more on vocational than academic preparation.

Through the 1960s and 1970s changing social conditions, growing Native enrollments in public schools, critiques of boarding school conditions, and federal reluctance to fund and operate schools for American Indians (despite treaty and trust obligations) led to the closure of many institutions. Chilocco closed its doors in 1980. At the end of the twentieth century only a few of the flagship off-reservation schools continued to serve Indian youth: Sherman Indian High School in Riverside, California, Chemawa Indian High School in Salem, Oregon, and Chilocco's sister school, Haskell Institute in Lawrence, Kansas, as Haskell Indian Nations University. Since 1989 the Chilocco campus site has been leased to Narconon of Oklahoma, Inc., which operates Chilocco New Life Center, a drug rehabilitation program.

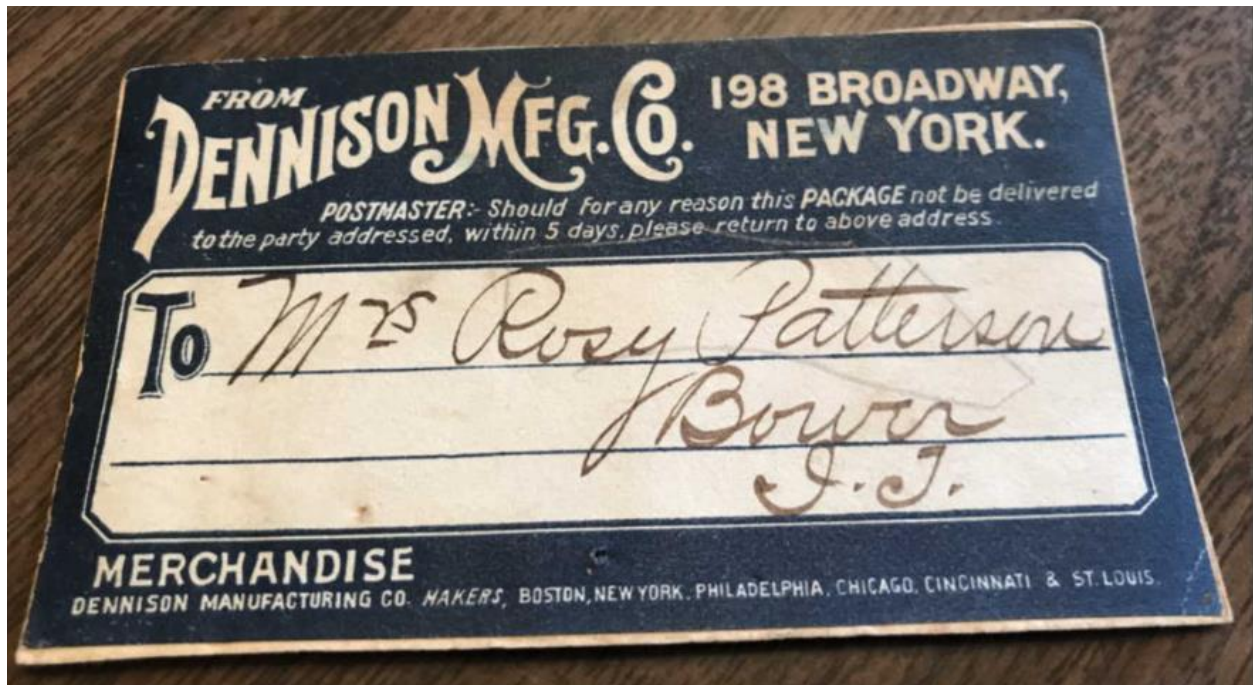

Q Did you ever draw any money in the Creek Nation? A No, sir.
Q Did your daughter, Fannie Patterson, ever draw any money in the Creek Nation? A No, sir.
Q Did you ever live in the Creek Nation? A No, sir.
Q Did your daughter, Fannie Patterson, and her children, ever live in the Creek Nation? A No, sir.
Q What degree of Creek Indian blood do you claim? A One-half.
Q What degree of Creek Indian blood has your daughter, Fannie Patterson? A One-quarter, I reckon.
Q What was the name of your father? A Jerry Weatherby.

Q What is your name? A Lucy Gentry.
Q How old are you? A I am Fifty-five years old.
Q What is your post office address? A Muskogee.
Q Are you a citizen of the Creek Nation? A Yes, sir.
Q Are you acquainted with Vina Farris, and her daughter, Fannie Patterson and Fannie's two children? A Yes, sir; I knowed her when she had her little girl.
Q You know Vina Farris, then, and Fannie Patterson? A Yes, sir.
Q Do you know whether Vina Farris and Fannie Patterson are full-blood Creek Indians or not? A Well, I reckon I couldn't say that, but I know their father, -- I knew Vina Farris' father.
Q What was his name? A His name was Jerry Weatherby, but he went by Marshall when I knew him.
Q Was he a full-blood Creek Indian? A Well, he was mixed.
Q What was he mixed with? A Mixed with colored and Indian.
Q Did you know Vina Farris' mother? A Well, I seen her, but I wasn't acquainted with her as well as I did her father.
Q Was she a full-blood Creek Indian? A She was dark.
Q Was she part colored? A Well she looked like she was all colored, to me.

Q Did you say your name is Mrs. Gentry? A Yes, sir.
Q You are a citizen of the Creek Nation? A Yes, sir.
Q Did you know the father of Mrs. Farris? A Yes, sir.

He is the same man I was acquainted with, he is not dead, I don't think, and it is her father (Pointing to Vina Farris), and I know that. I was just sitting here listening to her talk about her father--she don't know exactly where he is, because he told me so. He said her mother and him was parted for years.

Q Oh, you do know that is her father? A Yes, sir.

Q You don't know whether he got upon the roll or not? A No, sir; I knowed this one for twenty or twenty-one years; I knowed her in Texas, and then seen her right here.

Q She was born and raised in Texas? A Yes, sir; that is what she said. I couldn't swear about that. I am just telling from her, for her father was raised on North Fork; he went by Marshall.

Q Marshall? A Yes, sir; but his name was changed, you know; he changed his name by his Master's name, you know, by his Master's name.

VINA FARRIS, being recalled, testified as follows:

Q Are there any other statements you desire to make at this time with reference to the application made by you at this time for the enrollment of yourself, your daughter, Fannie Patterson, and your two grandchildren, Gussie and Georgie Patterson, as citizens, by blood, of the Creek Nation? A I don't know, sir, as there is.

DECISION.

The record in this case shows that on December 12, 1902, Vina Farris appeared before the Commission at Muskogee, Indian Territory, and made application for the enrollment of herself, her daughter, Fannie Patterson, and Gussie and Georgie Patterson, the two minor children of the said Fannie Patterson, as citizens, by blood, of the Creek Nation.

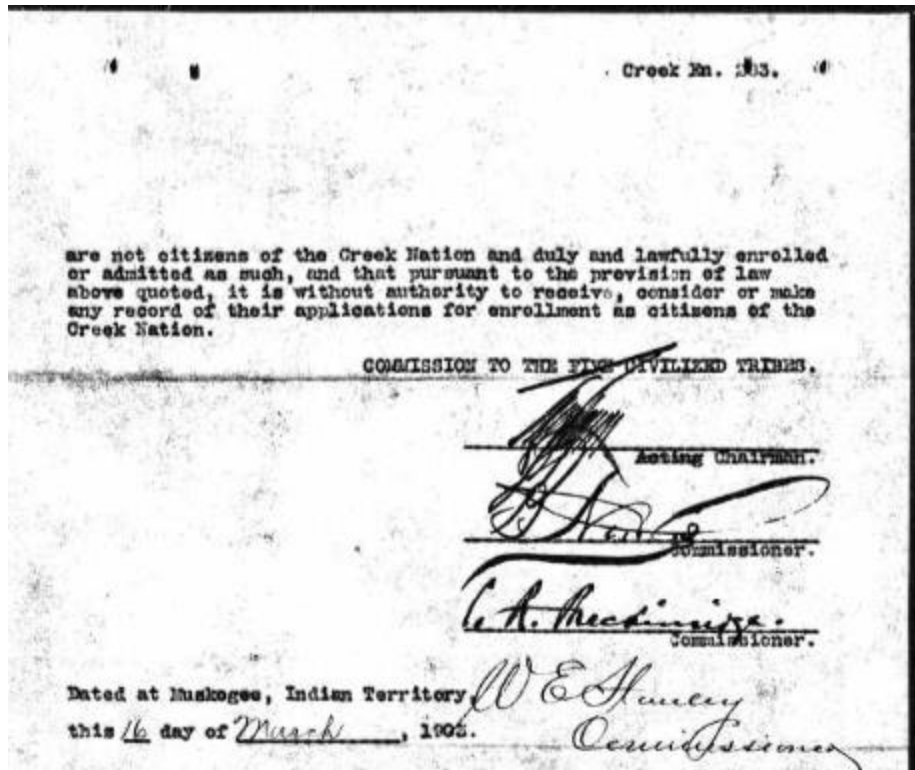
The evidence shows that all of the applicants were residents of the Territory of Oklahoma at the date of the application herein; that they had resided in said Territory of Oklahoma for about one year next before said application, and that for ten years immediately prior to their removal to Oklahoma they had resided in the State of Texas. It further appears that none of the applicants are full-blood Creek Indians.

It does not appear from the evidence in this case that any of the applicants herein have ever been enrolled by the tribal authorities of the Creek Nation, neither does it appear that they, or any of them, have ever been admitted to citizenship in the Creek Nation by the legally constituted authorities of said nation, nor does it appear that they, or any of them, have ever been admitted to citizenship in said nation by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or by the United States court in Indian Territory, in accordance with the provisions of the act of Congress of June 10, 1896 (29 Stat., 321).

The act of Congress approved May 31, 1900 (31 Stat., 221), provides:

"That said commission shall continue to exercise all authority heretofore conferred on it by law. But it shall not receive, consider or make any record of any application of any person for enrollment as a member of any tribe in Indian Territory who has not been a recognized citizen thereof, and duly and lawfully enrolled or admitted as such, and its refusal of such applications shall be final, when approved by the Secretary of the Interior."

It is therefore the opinion of this Commission that Vina Farris, Fannie Patterson, Gussie Patterson, and Georgie Patterson,



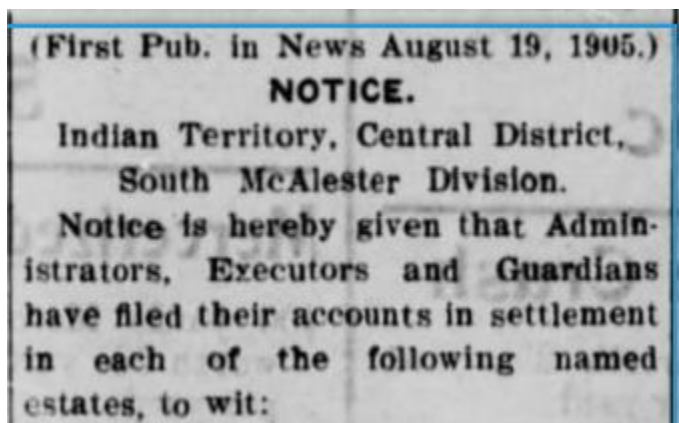

Body Of Fresnan Is Found Near Friant

The body of Henry Russell Robbins, about 40, of 1000 Millbrae Avenue, was found in his sedan near the rock dam two miles below Friant by Thomas W. Patterson, 1331 Shields Avenue.

The coroner's office said Robbins committed suicide after leaving a note giving domestic troubles as the reason for his act. He attached a garden hose to the exhaust pipe of his automobile and shoved the other end through the floor boards of the car.

It is believed his death occurred sometime after 6 o'clock last night.

Patterson was prospecting along the river and saw the car early this morning. When he saw the vehicle in the same spot later in the day, he investigated and found Robbins' body.

This doesn't agree with the data that George was dead. Vina was not sure if her father and/or mother was Native American or "colored." Her petition was denied 16 Mar 1903.

Pre-war:

Following the death of his father George Patterson in 1901, the four Patterson children (Thomas, Maude, Oscar, Ponder) were orphaned. Their guardian was E.C. Coker. This would appear to be Edward Cobern Coker, the brother of their mother, Rosa Coker Patterson. An extensive set of documents can be found on Ancestry.com with reports on his guardianship.

In his 15 Sep 1904 guardianship report, E.C. Coker reports Thomas (now likely 18 years old) is away at school. Oscar resides with his uncle, George Coker. Ponder Patterson is living with his now-married sister, Maudie Patterson (Pateron) Taylor.

Oscar is also noted as having H.G. Rowley (who had moved to New Mexico) as his guardian from 17 Jan 1907 to 24 Oct 1916.

Thomas is listed as attending an agricultural school, whose typed name is open to interpretation - This may be the Chilocco Indian Agricultural School. The name can be read as Thelocko Agricultural School. Or Thalcoko, Thelceko, Thalceko, Thelcoko, Thalcoko, Shelceko, Shelocko, etc. However, all records list Thomas & family as white.

E.C. Coker may be the Edwin C. Coker (1861 MO – 1942 OK, F: 127480137), son of Seaborn S. Coker & Amanda Predella Tucker, but his name also appears as Edward Cobern Coker, b. 1862. The "Stigler (OK) News-Sentinel" Thursday 6 Jul 1939 p 1 reports on the application for a marriage license of E.C. Coker (78) & Mrs. Luella Anderson (74), both of Poteau OK. They were married on 8 Jun 1939 by justice of the peace J.J. Riley. An E.C. Coker married 16 Dec 1916 in Pittsburg Co. OK to Bessie Orr.
