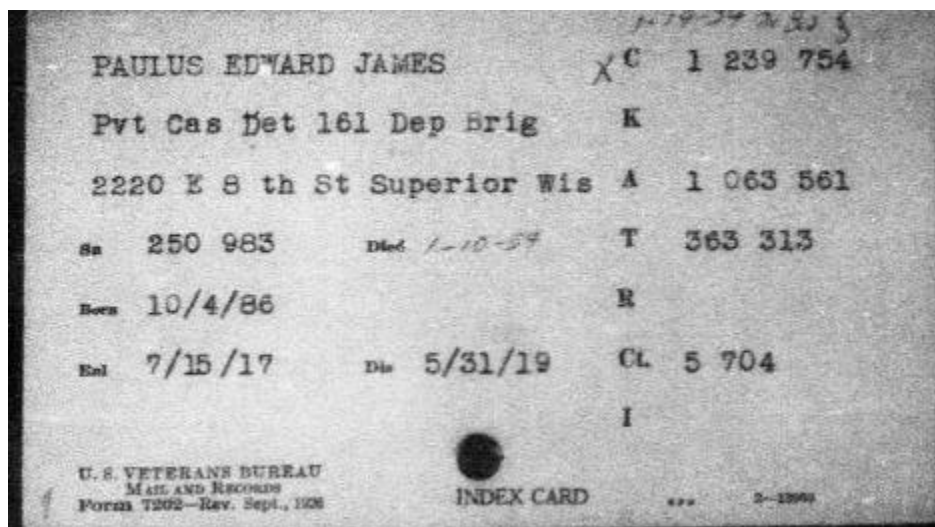

PAULUS RITES

Edward Paulus, who died last week at Superior and was buried there on Thursday, was a former resident of Bloomer and a veteran of World War One, leaving Chippewa Falls with one of the three military units, which later became part of the Thirty-second division. He was one of those rescued when the liner *Tuscania* was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland.

Joseph Paulus, 74, passed away at his home in Bloomer Friday night at 10:30 o'clock.

Mr. Paulus was born June 7, 1871, at Cham, Bavaria, and at the age of 13 came to the United States directly to the Bloomer community where he had since resided. In 1904 he was married to Miss Lillian Crissman at Bloomer, five children being born to them, three of whom preceded him in death. Mr. Paulus is survived by his wife, one son and

one daughter, Leon, of Colfax and Mrs. Walter Scheidecker of Cooks Valley; four sisters and two brothers, Mrs. Francis Baker of Douglas county; Mrs. Theresa Gundt, Chippewa county; Mrs. Mary Scarp-enby of La Cross, Wash., Mrs. Felix Boyle, Medical Lake, Wash.; Geo. She & her next-oldest sibling, Joseph, emigrated in May 1884. Her mother & the next 4 siblings (born in Germany) followed in 1885. In Feb 1892 Francis married Nickolaus Baker (Backes) in Superior, Douglas WI, also an immigrant from Germany. The couple had 4 children between 1892 & 1899. By the 1900 census, the 4 children are living in a Roman Catholic orphanage in La Crosse WI while Francis is in an asylum in Dane Co. WI. The 4 children were adopted, 3 going to 1 family and one child to another. They are listed above (taken from her Find A Grave record). An asylum in Parkland, Douglas WI opened in 1906 & Francis resided there from the 1910 to 1940 censuses. There is no headstone for her in the St. Francis Cemetery, Superior, Douglas WI where she is reportedly buried. F: 213086756
