Wartime:

Everett J. High, Fred Ross Park and Arthur Julius Chilberg, reported to the police as missing men by local exemption board No. 5, have entered the military service of the United States, it was reported yesterday by Detective Paul Bucholz. The giving of the names to the police was not intended as a reflection on the young men, it was stated, but intended to assist in clearing the record.

Fred Ross Park was not a draft "slacker" but was instead ready to sail on Tuscania – "Spokane (WA) Spokesman-Review" Friday 11 Jan 1918 p 8

Several hundred men for the Twentieth engineers, of which Companies D, E and F and headquarters detachment were on the torpedoed steamer Tuscania, were enlisted in Spokane. It is known that a number of men from here were members of these companies and are believed to have been on the ship.

Joined Engineers Here.

Fred R. Park, formerly superintendent of the Phoenix box factory and planing mill, enlisted in Company F, sixth battalion, 20th national engineers, December 17, at Fort Wright. He was stationed at the American university at Washington D. C. Word was last received from him January 22.

MAN HAS NO VESTED RIGHT TO END LIFE

(Special to The Herald.)

OLYMPIA, April 23.—That a fraternal society has a right to change its rules, and that it is hardly to be considered that a man has a vested right to commit suicide are conclusions reached by the supreme court in reversing the Spokane superior court and ordering a new trial in the case of Floretta Klein against the Knights and Ladies of Security, appellant. It is alleged that Gustave A. Klein died a suicide on January 20, 1912, at a time when he had been a member of the order for two years and seven months. The company protested paying his life insurance policy on the ground that the rule of the company had been changed so that there could be no recovery if a member committed suicide within five years after joining, the time limit for suicides having been two years when Klein joined. It is alleged that Klein had notice of the change. The supreme court orders a new trial.

One Says: "Goodby Children;" the
Other: "Look on Dresser for
Purse."

"Goodby, children. Papa."

When the family of Gus Klein, 2318 Broadway, reached home this morning at 12:30, after attending a dance at Forester's hall, they found the above note on the dresser, and the father and husband, who had undressed and gone to bed, dead by his own hand. Poison of some kind had been taken several hours before, but just what the death potion was had not been determined last night.

Early in the evening Mrs. Klein, a daughter and son, and a young man who boarded with the family, went down town to attend a dance, Mr. Klein saying he was going to lodge meeting. As he was a member of Mount Carlton lodge, I. O. O. F., and was accustomed to attending all its meetings, being treasurer of the lodge, nothing was thought of his statement that he would probably return before the family got home.

According to members of the family, who were interviewed late this morning, Mr. Klein was subject to spells of melancholy, but had seemed to be in good spirits for the last few weeks. Another note was found, on which had been written:

"Look on the dresser for the purse."

The purse, with \$65 in it, was found as indicated.

Mr. Klein conducted a market at Monroe and Broadway and had resided here for a good many years.

INSURANCE RULE VALID

**SUPREME COURT HOLDS LODGE
MAY CHANGE CLAUSE.**

**Widow of Gustave Klein Will Get
but \$200 Account of a
Suicide.**

A fraternal insurance society may legally reserve right to change rules on which it will pay beneficiaries, the supreme court decided yesterday, reversing Judge Bruce Blake of Spokane county in the case of Floretta Klein versus the Knights and Ladies of Security.

Under this decision Mrs. Klein stands to lose all but \$200 of a \$1000 policy held by her late husband, Gustave A. Klein, who died by suicide, it is alleged, January 30, 1912.

Two and one-half years before death Klein took out a policy insuring him for \$1000 unless he died by suicide within two years, under which circumstances the widow would recover only \$200.

Before his death the society extended the suicide rule to cover five years instead of two. Judge Blake held the change of rule invalid, but the supreme court says the society reserved the right to make the change.

Vivian was the first child of Myrta Maze Riddle and George Happell. She was 19 at the time of her mother's death. "Vivian had black hair and eyes and was a teacher in Jeannette, Pa., Tonawanda, N.Y., Euclid, Oh., and other areas. Vivian had many talents, such as creative designing of clothing, sewing, writing verse and children's stories. She conducted a private nursery school in Ohio, and during World War II worked in a munitions plant."⁴¹

"Vivian and her first husband, Michael Joseph Camizzi [b. 14 Apr 1894, Buffalo, Erie Co., N.Y., of Italian parents], were married on 7 Dec 1916 in Rochester, Monroe Co., N.Y., and they lived with Mike's parents in Farnham, Erie Co., N.Y., until they were divorced. They had one daughter—Maze Francesca, named after her two grandmothers."⁴¹ Michael died on 16 Mar 1965 in Los Angeles Co., Ca.

On 9 Mar 1928 in Cuyahoga Co., Oh., Vivian married Fred Ross Park, who was born on 17 Feb 1890 in Cleveland, Cuyahoga Co., Oh., and at the time of their marriage, Vivian's surname was Henry. Fred was a son of William James Park (b. 25 Feb 1859, Oh.,¹² d. 24 Nov 1938⁴¹⁵) and Madge Dysart (b. 15 Aug 1861, Oh.,¹² d. 18 Dec 1950⁴¹⁵). During World War I, Fred served in the U.S. Army; and in 1930, he was a director/superintendent at St. Clair Oil. "Vivian and her husband, Fred Ross Park, lived in Mt. Vernon, Wooster and Sandusky, Oh. They had two daughters—Vivien Marguerite and Ann Ruth Grace."⁴¹ Fred died on 12 Dec 1954 at his home in Sandusky, Oh., and is buried at Oakland Cemetery in Sandusky, Erie Co., Oh.⁴¹

"After Fred died, Vivian lived for a while with her younger sister, Marguerite Happell Polak, before moving to Fl. During later years, she lived with her daughter, Vivien Park Niehoff, in Newport, Ct., and Hendersonville, N.C."⁴¹ Vivian died of myocardial failure and colon cancer. She is buried at Shepherd Memorial Park in Naples, Henderson Co., N.C.⁴¹⁵
