ACCUSED OF FIGHTING OFFICER

Spirit Lake Men to Face Trial in District Court.

COEUR D'ALENE, Idaho, Nov. 5.—District court will begin Monday, following the recess to allow the adjourned term of the supreme court to convene here, and will hear first the cases of the Gilmore brothers and Connie Peterson, Spirit Lake.

The men are charged with resisting an officer at Rathdrum, during the progress of which one of the Gilmore brothers was arrested and his brother, with the aid of young Peterson, is said to have succeeded in getting him away from the officer. Marshal Satchwell, the officer involved, was struck in the mouth, suffering severe cuts, and his club was taken from him, according to the complaint.

In the late afternoon of a February day 27 years ago, a German torpedo struck amidships the British transport Tuscania, bringing death to 113 of the 2500 American service men aboard and giving America its first World war casualty list.

Today, anniversary of that war-time disaster, still carries tragic connotations for the northwest, for a large number of the troops on the Tuscania had been recruited from Washington, Idaho, Montana and Oregon.

She lived with her son and daughter-in-law, Douglas and Joanne Peterson, at Mukilteo the past nine years.

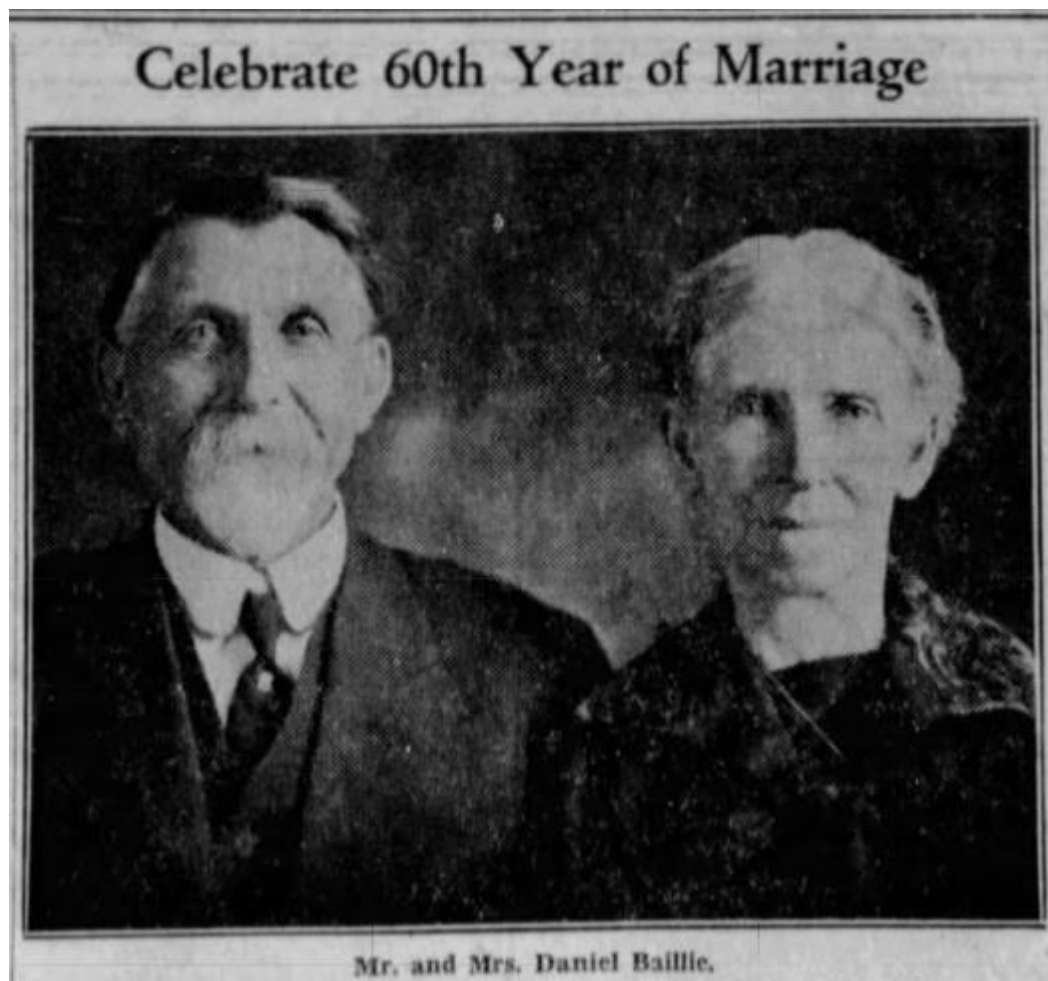
She played the organ for and was a member of the Presbyterian Congregational Church and was a past director of volunteers at St. Joseph Regional Medical Center, both in Lewiston.

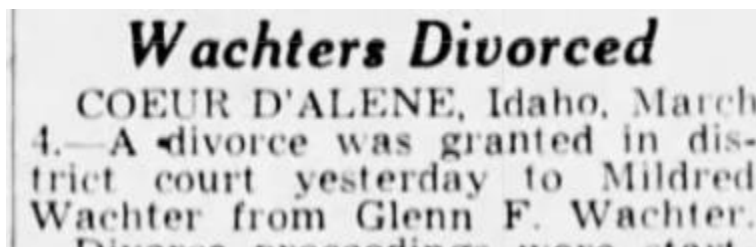

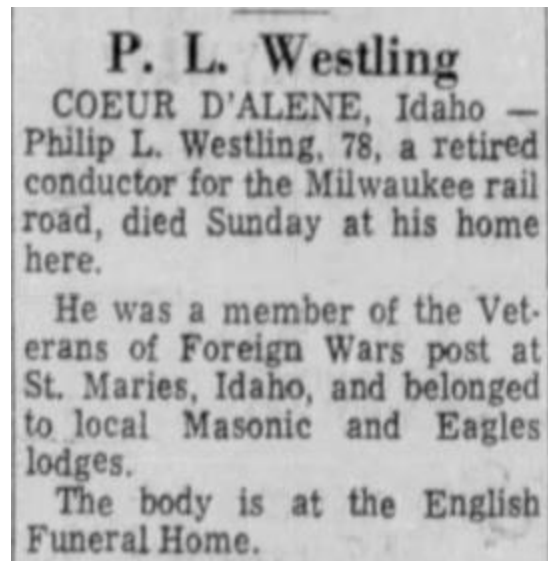
