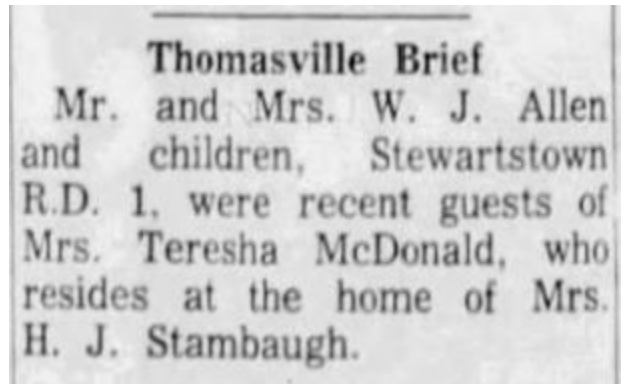

### **DRIVER ARRESTED**

A machine operated by Austin C. McDonald, 42, Stewartstown R. D. 1, crashed into the front of a vehicle operated by G. Malcolm Stoner, 21, Red Lion R. D. 1, Saturday evening about 8 o'clock in Stewartstown with resultant damages of about \$200 to each machine. No one was injured.

As a result of the collision, Mr. McDonald was placed under arrest by Private J. A. Welsh, who investigated for local state police, and arraigned before Justice of the Peace B. F. Lecrone, Spring-garden township, on a charge of drunken driving. In default of \$500 bail he was committed to jail to await a hearing, the time for which has not yet been set.

Private Walsh said Mr. McDonald was operating his machine on the wrong side of the road and crashed into Mr. Stoner's car after

the latter had come to a halt. Because of a string of parked cars along the curb the Mr. Stoner could not get out of McDonald's way.

**A. C. McDonald Acquitted**  
 A jury in Judge Sherwood's court acquitted Austin C. McDonald, Stewartstown, R. D., of a charge of drunken driving as preferred by Private J. A. Walsh, of the State Motor police, and directed that the costs of prosecution be paid by the defendant.  
 Corporal C. C. Naddeo, also of the State Motor police, and Private Walsh testified that they were called to investigate an accident near Stewartstown last May 3 and as a result of the accident they arrested Mr. McDonald for drunken driving. They admitted that they did not take McDonald before a 'squire in Stewartstown nor did they stop with him at any 'squire's office in Red Lion nor Dallastown, but drove the entire distance to York and took him before Justice of the Peace B. F. Lecrone, of Springgarden township, for arraignment.

McDonald's defense was a complete denial of intoxication, saying he had had only two beers and in this he was corroborated by former County Commissioner W. Everett Wiley, who was in McDonald's company several hours previous to the accident. Mr. Wiley testified that McDonald was not under the influence, and John Wolf, R. S. Evans and D. Ross Anderson were called as character witnesses. Attorneys William Luria and Charles H. Still defended McDonald.

## **Motorcycle-Car Collision Takes Life Of Man, 40,**

Charles L. Holtzapple, 40, Red Lion R.D. 3, died at the York Hospital at 11:35 p.m. Saturday, less than six hours after his motorcycle and an automobile collided on the Stewartstown-New Park road, a mile south of Stewartstown, near the Anderson Fruit Farm.

Dr. H. Malcolm Read, York County coroner, attributed death to a skull fracture.

Witnesses told police the crash occurred when a car driven by Austin C. McDonald, 68, Stewartstown R.D. 1, halted to turn into a roadside stand. After the collision with the McDonald auto, the motorcycle skidded and struck a parked car. McDonald also was taken to the York Hospital but was not treated.

The death of Holtzapple raised to 43 the number of persons who have died in highway traffic accidents on York County highways this year.

## WILLIAM WARD PIGG IS DEAD AT ECKMAN HOME

William Ward Pigg, aged sixty years, died at his home at Eckman, Sunday morning at 8:15 o'clock. His death although rather sudden had been imminent for several weeks. Mr. Pigg was born at Pigg Mills, Chatham, Va., Pittsylvania county.

# Marine Sergeant Is Killed; Former Eckman Resident

William H. Pigg Is Slain By  
Member Of National  
Guard In Managua

## OFFICERS SEEK TRACE OF MOTHER IN THIS SECTION

**Inquiry Develops Belief That  
Marine Suffered Mind Break  
Brought About By Work In  
Quake Relief; Nicaraguan  
Capital May Be Removed**

Word of the death of Gunnery Sergeant William H. Pigg, United States marine, former resident of Eckman, McDowell county, who was killed yesterday in Nicaragua, was received here late last night.

Efforts to locate Mrs. Mary Pigg, mother of the dead marine, were of no avail. Advices from Eckman stated Mrs. Pigg had moved away from Eckman sometime ago and her present residence had not been ascertained late last night by Eckman authorities who were trying to reach her in order to deliver a message from the navy department advising her of the death of her son.

The message signed by E. H. Fuller, major general, and addressed to Mrs. Mary Pigg, at Eckman, read as follows:

"Deeply regret to inform you radiogram Nicaragua national guard detachment states your son, Gunnery Sergeant William H. Pigg, died April 4 from gunshot wounds."

The telegram also requested Mrs. Pigg to advise the navy department as to what disposition to make of the body.

It was learned at Eckman last night that William Pigg was formerly employed as a clerk for the Virginia Supply company at Eckman and lived there for a number of years. He resigned his position sometime ago to enlist in the United States marine corps. It was understood that Mrs. Pigg had removed from Eckman some months ago and her whereabouts at present are unknown to the Eckman authorities.

Managua, Nicaragua, April 4. (AP) —Sergeant W. H. Pigg of the United States marines was shot and killed today by a member of the Nicaraguan national guard on police duty.

A military board of inquiry convened immediately to investigate reports that Pigg, breaking under the strain of rescue work, had become demented and threatened the guard. Colonel Frederic Bradman, marine commander, said the board had adduced no particulars of the shooting.

Ernest J. Swift, American Red Cross official in charge of relief work, told the Associated Press today the 15,000 persons still in Managua were being inoculated against typhoid and small pox. Lured by the promise of food, the hungry eat while others are being handled by doctors nearby.

Colonel Dan I. Sultan, heading the Nicaraguan canal survey is directing his men in the repairing of the

damaged water system, Mr. Swift said, and hoped to have the task finished by the end of next week.

"We are not feeding 8,000 persons," the Red Cross official said. "I am going to the outlying cities today where two-thirds of the populace have taken refuge and investigate their problems. It probably will be necessary for the relief committee to send workers to these points."

"I am doubtful about rebuilding the city on this spot. It is believed that Managua lays over the earthquake fault line. Some place within five or ten miles would be more adequate possibly. Various places such as Leon, Matagalpa, Masaya and Granada have been mentioned as temporary capitals."

The American consul at Corinto has reported that the American refugees are being successfully handled and that all are safe and sound, enjoying the sea breeze and attention from officers of the U. S. S. Rochester and the U. S. S. Chaumont, on which they will sail shortly for the United States.

An amusing incident occurred last night when General Trevinano, chief of the aviation squadron of the republic of Salvador, was arrested on the street by marines for carrying arms. Under the stress of his departure to aid in the relief work, he failed to get a permit which would allow him to be armed. Following on his trip to marine headquarters an explanation was offered and he was released.

In an executive decree today President Moncada directed that all funds received from outside sources for relief be deposited in the national bank for use by a special relief committee.

The committee he appointed to direct disposition of the funds includes Archbishop Jose Antonio Lezcano Yortega, Jose Dolores Estrada and your correspondent.

The West India Oil company already has contributed \$5,000, the president of Panama has sent \$3,000 and there have been other large gifts.

The Nicaraguan congress is to meet next Tuesday at Masaya to decide, among other things, upon the advisability of removing the seat of the government from Managua.

## Clash Over Shooting of U. S. Marine Averted

MANAGUA, April 4.—For the space of a few minutes today the nerves of this harassed city were tested sorely by the killing of Lieutenant William Hutch Pigg, a Marine non-commissioned officer, attached to the Guardia Nacional with the higher rank. He was killed by one of his own men in the "cuartel" (jail) just across the street from the building serving President Jose Maria Moncada as a temporary administration office.

Aroused by a burst of machine gun and rifle fire, Marines and men of the guard burst from their compound on the double quick. They saw Lieutenant Pigg on the ground and a wounded guardia soldier staggering towards the temporary palace.

Pigg died at the Marine hospital

two minutes after he was placed on an operating table. Two bullets had penetrated his skull and another had lodged in his chest. He was 35 years old, single, and had his home in Eck-nar, Va. His nearest of kin is his mother, Mrs. Mary Pigg. He was a gunnery sergeant in the Marine Corps and had been only recently detached for duty with the Guardia Nacional.

Hernandez, the guardia sergeant whom, it is believed, Pigg shot, is wounded seriously. The guardia sergeant in command of the Presidential guard has been placed under ar-

rest. He denied knowledge of the shooting, but a pistol from which three shots had been fired was found in his holster.

#### **Inquiry Ordered**

While no official findings as to the cause of the affair will be announced until a report is made by the board of inquiry, which Colonel Frederick Bradman, of the Marines, ordered convened, it is believed by General Calvin Matthews, director of the guardia, and by Matthew E. Hanna, American Minister in charge of relief work, that the blame can readily be assigned.

As the result of a preliminary investigation, they are of opinion that Lieutenant Pigg, his nerves strained to the breaking point by four days of arduous duty, lost control of himself and shot Sergeant Hernandez. On the basis of a personal investigation it is learned that the affair started when Lieutenant Pigg ran in pursuit of a guardia soldier, who had left the encampment contrary to orders. The soldier ducked into the little cuartel, where the Presidential guard was on duty, perhaps twenty feet from the palace, and Pigg upbraided the sergeant of the guard for not compelling the man to halt.

In the ensuing argument, according to an eye-witness, Pigg disarmed the sergeant of the guard and then shot. After that, according to the eye-witness, more shots came and the lieutenant fell. This man insisted he did not know who did the firing.

## American Soldier Killed in Managua Was Pittsylvanian

**Sergeant W. H. Pigg Born  
Near Danville; Boyhood  
Chum Recognizes Picture**

DANVILLE, VA., April 11—A press photograph of Sergeant W. H. Pigg of the United States Marine Corps, the only American soldier to be killed at Managua following the recent earthquake, was identified today as a son of Pittsylvania, born and reared seven miles from Danville.

Roy Payne, local motor dealer, boyhood chum of the victim, recognized him. He was a son of William Pigg, who many years ago operated the flour mills known as Pigg's Mill.

The family went to West Virginia soon after Mr. Pigg's death and W. H. or "Buck" Pigg joined the marines ten years ago. He has two brothers, Mezzie Pigg of Reidsville, N. C., and Sandy Pigg of West Virginia.

Sergeant Pigg was shot by a native policeman in Managua after the earthquake. A diplomatic incident developed when Commander William B. Hetfield exchanged warm words with President Moncado over the incident. Hetfield forced himself into quarters temporarily occupied by Moncada, where the body was taken. Later United States Minister Matthew Hanna intervened with an apology. Hetfield, dispatches say, has been disciplined.

## **BODY OF SERGT. PIGG WILL ARRIVE TODAY**

### **Death of Marine in Nicaragua Caused Altercation Between Officer and President.**

The body of Sergt. William H. Pigg, United States marine corps, who was killed in Managua, Nicaragua, April 4, will arrive in Chattanooga early this morning and will be taken to Coulter's funeral home, where funeral services will be held at 2:30 Friday afternoon, with Dr. John T. Debardeleben, chaplain at Fort Oglethorpe, officiating.

A military escort will have charge of service at the grave. Interment in National cemetery. Pallbearers will be selected from the troops at the post.

Sergt. Pigg is survived by his mother, Mrs. Mary S. Pigg; three brothers, A. R. and L. H., of Vivian, W. Va., and H. P. Pigg, of Lynchburg, Va.; two sisters, Mrs. J. D. Lawrence, of Bluefield, W. Va., and Mrs. W. A. Broyles, of 2714 Anderson avenue, Chattanooga.

The killing of Sergt. Pigg, who was a lieutenant in the Nicaraguan National Guard, caused a tense situation at Managua, according to the Associated Press account of the affair, and was marked by a clash between Lieutenant-Commander William Hetfield, of the marine corps, who was in charge of medical work at Managua following the earthquake, and President Moncado, of Nicaragua.

The Associated Press account of the killing, carried April 5, said that Pigg had apparently become demented as a result of the strain attendant on the horrors of the earthquake, and was shot during an argument near the house where President Moncado was residing. After the shooting he was taken into the president's house.

When Lieutenant-Commander Hetfield, who was engaged in relief and surgical work at Campo de Marte, near by, was told that a marine had been wounded and was in Moncado's house he rushed to the place, but was stopped at the door by Nicaraguan officials.

Hetfield was understood to have demanded entrance, and being refused, forced his way into the house, thinking a marine had been wounded and needed his assistance. When he found Pigg dead the marine officer and Moncado had some words, the latter having informed Hetfield, it was reported, that he was the president of Nicaragua.
