WORKMAN MAY LOSE ONE FOOT

**Vernon Rozell, 34, Painfully Injured
While On Way Home From
Marathon Mill**

Vernon Rozell, 34 years of age, 37 0Gruenwald avenue, Neenah, sustained a badly crushed right foot when he stepped on a coupling the moment a Soo Line railway hill engine started to push a northbound freight train from the company's west yards in Neenah shortly after 7 o'clock this morning.

Rozell was in the act of climbing between two box cars of the train, which had blocked the Chapman street crossing, when the mishap occurred.

Helplessly caught and his shouts drowned out by the noise of the moving train, Rozell frantically fought to release the coupling while the train traveled about three miles. Finally slack from the pusher engine from behind enabled him to pull the coupling pin.

Not until then when the air line was broken were members of the train crew aware of the accident.

Rozell was rushed to the Soo Line depot in the pusher engine from where he was removed in the city ambulance to Theda Clark hospital. His foot was crushed just below the ankle. The victim was returning from the Marathon Mills, Menasha, where he is employed, to his home when the accident took place.

The attending physician feared that amputation of part of the foot might be necessary. The member was badly crushed just below the ankle and was frozen.

Neenah Man's Foot Crushed In Coupling Of Car

Neenah, Wis.—(UP)— With the temperature at 10 degrees below zero, Vernon R. Rozell, Neenah, was carried four miles by a Soo Line train today with his foot caught in the coupling between two freight cars.

He had climbed between the cars when the train blocked his path while en route to work. A locomotive at the rear of the train tightened the coupling and his foot was crushed.

Unable to move, Rozell's cries were unheard as the train started up. The train stopped at Clayton Hill, four miles from here, and the coupling loosened. Rozell fell to the ground unconscious and was brought to Neenah by the railroad crew.

Blood which poured from the wound had frozen on his leg. Surgeons said it would be necessary to amputate the leg.

Condition of Man With Crushed Foot Shows Improvement

Neenah—The condition of Vernon J. Rozell, 390 Gruenwald-ave, who was taken to Theda Clark hospital Tuesday after his right foot was crushed when it was pinioned between couplings on box cars of a Soo Line freight train, was reported today as being much improved.

Rozell, 34 years old, was returning from work at the Marthon Mills about 8 o'clock Tuesday morning when he attempted to cross between the cars of the train which was blocking crossings near the west yards of the Soo Line company.

While his foot was on the coupling a hill engine in the rear of the train tightened the slack in the coupling, crushing his foot and pinioned him between the cars. Rozell was carried more than four miles into the country in sub-zero weather. At the top of Clayton hill the rear engine stopped moving the train and when the coupling connection was slackened Rozell fell from between the cars.

He was brought to the city by William Oberst, foreman of the hill engine crew, and was removed to Theda Clark hospital. Oberst declared that he believed it was only Rozell's determination to remain conscious which prevented him from falling over between the cars and being crushed to death.

INJURED MAN FIGHTS FOR LIFE

**Vernon J. Rozell, Marathon Mill Em-
ployee, Submits To Amputation
Of Leg Above Knee**

Vernon J. Rozell, millworker, whose right foot was badly crushed when caught in a coupling between two box cars, was fighting for his life today at Theda Clark hospital following amputation of the leg above the knee Friday afternoon at Theda Clark hospital.

Rozell's condition took a turn for the worse yesterday when a gas poison in the injured tissues, a rare complication, developed. His condition was described as fairly good by the attending physician this morning.

Rozell was injured several days ago when he stepped on the coupling the moment a Soo Line railway hill engine started to push a northbound freight train. He was carried four miles in 10 below zero weather before he was able to tear loose the coupling pin and bring the train to a stop. His foot was badly crushed below the ankle and was frozen. The complication necessitated the amputation above the ankle.

TRAIN VICTIM OUT OF DANGER

Vernon Rozell, whose right leg was amputated above the knee Friday to save his life after gas gangrene poisoning, a rare complication, developed, was pronounced out of danger today by Dr. T. D. Smith, his attending physician.

Rozell's condition took a turn for the worse Friday when the complication, the third such case on record at Theda Clark hospital, developed. The poison spread rapidly and immediately amputation of the leg was deemed necessary.

Gas gangrene serum was rushed here from Chicago and after the second dose of the serum, Rozell's condition improved.

Rozell was injured last Tuesday when his foot was pinioned between the coupling of two Soo Line box cars. His foot was badly crushed below the ankle and was frozen when he was carried more than three miles on the train.

His agony ride ended when slack from the pusher engine gave him an opportunity to loosen the coupling pin and break the airline, bringing the train to a halt.

He was rushed to the depot in the pusher engine and then removed to the hospital in the city ambulance. Physicians were hoping to save his foot when the gas poisoning developed.

Born in New London March 13, 1877, he lived many years in the Birnamwood area. He was mar-

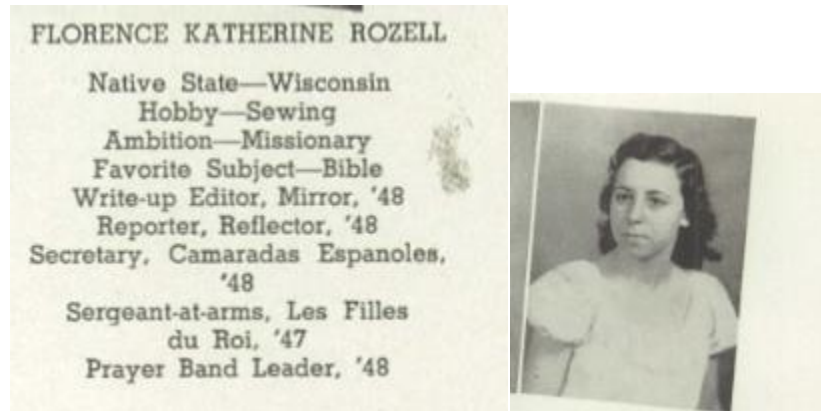
ried to the former Katherine Reed, who died about 20 years ago.

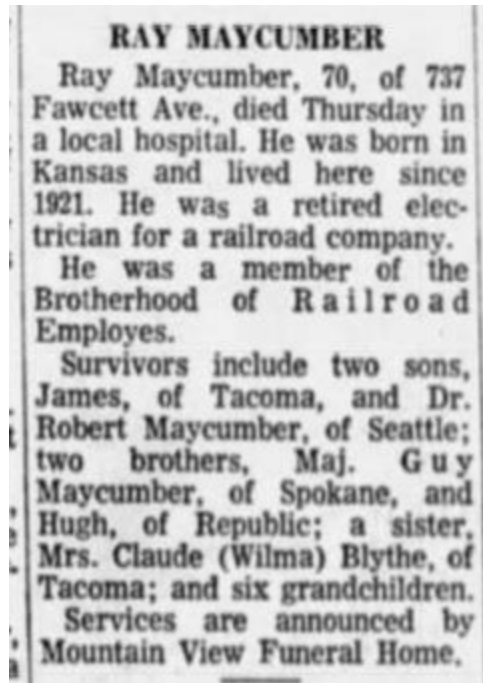
