World War I's Veterans Meet In Santa Maria

In this decade of the seventies, the 70-year-olds see their ranks thin. As they close them, day after day, they often meet to talk about a war fought more than 50 years ago in lands across a great ocean.

Today, they met in Santa Maria—the Veterans of World War I, to close the ranks again. A few score men, all in their seventies, and their wives who have formed an auxiliary, they closed the ranks a little tighter as they met in the Santa Maria Inn.

Scotty Rae, for example, is 79. In the Anderson barracks, of which he is a member, 22 World War I veterans died last year—"more than we had when we started."

Some are here in couples. Dr. Wellington N. Jenkins, 74, and his wife, Beatrice, 67, are delegates from Apple Valley. They've busied themselves, too, in organizational activity. He's the assistant department chief of staff and she's the Ninth District historian.

Clarence H. Nietsch, of Redlands, is 69 and active, too, in the affairs of Barracks 1370.

Like all organizations, the World War I men have their "brass." Among those in Santa Maria for the convention are Edgar G. Burkhardt, national commander, who'll speak tonight at the barbecue in the Santa Maria Club; Halsey Fink, department commander;

And yet these old soldiers are men of spirit. Scotty, who survived the sinking of the troopship *Tuscania*—mistaken for the *Leviathan* by a German U-Boat—has just been to Portland, Ore., where 34 other survivors of that maritime disaster met with him to reminisce.

"It's about all I do, these days," Scotty says, "getting together with the boys."

Frank Sellars of Oceano, "past 74", is here for the convention, too. He heads the Department of Americanism for the veterans. In World War I, after he signed up, he was "sent to Texas to fight the war."

Yancey Shields, department adjutant; and Harvey Steinhoff, department judge advocate.

Host barracks for the meeting is Santa Maria's 1436, and Jack Torbron and William Weiss have co-chaired the committee arranging the reunion.

In their 70s, all, these men are busy planning more reunions. Santa Maria is bidding for another convention of the World War I men.

"But don't count on our getting it," a member says with a grin. "There's a powerful lot of politicking going on in these meetings."

There, he became a boot sergeant, training the troops for the war in France. When it came his time to leave Texas, they sent him up to Washington, where he became a boot sergeant all over again, much to his disgust.

Andrew "Scotty" Rae of Anderson died Tuesday at Shasta General Hospital in Redding. He was 86.

Funeral services for Rae will be conducted at 2 p.m. Friday at Lawncrest Chapel in Redding.

He was born May 4, 1891, in Kirkcudbright, Scotland.

He was the former owner-operator of Scotty's Drive In and Donut Shoppe in Anderson.

He was the past commander of the World War I Barracks 1031 of Redding and was recently the secretary-treasurer of the World War I Barracks 3250 of Anderson. He was also a life member of the American Legion and the Trinity Lutheran Church of Redding.

He leaves his wife, Catherine of Anderson; two stepsons, Carl B. Adams of Anderson and Charles L. Adams of Redding; two stepdaughters, Clydine Adams Massaro of San Jose and Charlotte Adams Taylor of Santa Rosa; and a brother, Charles Rae, and two sisters, Belle Coltart and Jean McCall, all of Kirkcudbright.

Pastor Rudi P. Lenser of the Trinity Lutheran Church will officiate at the services.

Burial will be in Lawncrest Memorial Park in Redding.

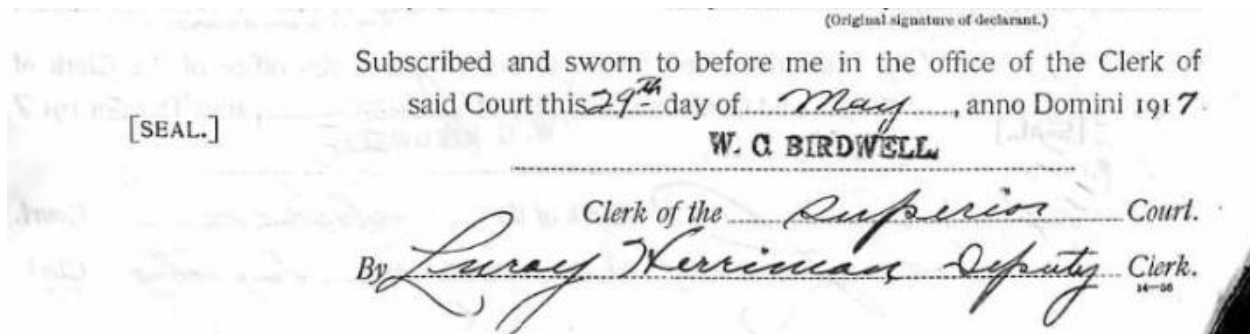

Cafes Remove Union Cards As Strike Enters Second Day

The second day of the culinary workers strike against some members of the Shasta County Hotel and Restaurant association saw the following developments:

1. Five places remained picketed—the Rite Spot cafe, Loop Inn restaurant, Golden Eagle hotel, Temple hotel and the Pantry.

2. One place, the A-1 cafe, was closed. Mrs. George Johnson, co-owner with her husband, said they closed down yesterday shortly after the pickets were placed.

4. Wayne B. Leitzell, association representative, sent a letter to Charles R. McDermott as representative of the joint executive board of the two unions involved, saying that by striking only individual members the unions had violated their recognition of the association as a sole collective bargaining agent, and that their agreement had therefore been broken.

5. Backing up this step, the association itself took union cards

out of members' windows, turned them into the union, and placed signs instead which claimed violation of the contract.

(Leitzell said this morning that the action was not a lockout—that no employee had been dismissed because of the strike. Workers remained on the jobs in the non-struck establishments, on orders from McDermott.)

5. McDermott had received complaints that picket lines were stopping in some unrelated adjacent businesses. He was work-

ing to correct this situation this morning.

6. The association was planning to set up an employment office Monday in an attempt to replace workers who had gone on strike.

McDermott declined comment on the possibility of more places being picketed, saying only that "strategy from now on will have to develop itself."

Twenty-two of the 23 members of the association appeared to be affected by the strike or the association's own card withdrawal, the exception being the Danish Maid, whose owner, Elton "Mel" Odell, was drowned in Shasta lake yesterday.

Unions involved in the dispute are Culinary, Bar and Hotel Service Employees Local 470 and Bartenders Union Local 549.

Woolworth fountain, Golden Bird confectionery, Golden Eagle hotel, H. & M. cafe (Anderson), Hotel Casa Blanca, Hotel Redding, Loop Inn cafe, Lorenz company, McColl's fountain, the Pantry, Rite Spot cafe, Scotty's drive-in (Anderson), Temple hotel, The Dons drive-in, Towne's Coffee shop,

Western hotel, Carl's Donut shop, U-Name-Us drive in, A-1 Cafe, Shasta Maid and Danish Maid.

Cafe Picket List Grows

The two Anderson members of the Shasta County Hotel and Restaurant association were picketed Saturday in the dispute between the association and AFL hotel, bar, and culinary workers, Wayne B. Leitzell, association representative, said this morning.

Pickets appeared at the H and M Cafe and Scotty's drive-in Saturday afternoon.

Leitzell said that the dispute was going "as expected." He stated that the association was opening up an employment office this afternoon at 1 p. m.

Charles R. McDermott, business representative of Culinary, Bar and Hotel Service Employees Local 470, could not be reached for comment today.

The two establishments bring to eight the number of places picketed since the dispute began Thursday.
