TUSCANIA SURVIVOR HAS THRILLING STORY TO TELL OF WRECK AND ESCAPE

A graphic account of the wreck of the Tuscania is contained in a letter from Harold Roberts son of Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Roberts, which they just received this week. The postmark bore the stamp "Shane's Park," and the letter was written February 9. Excerpts from his letter follows:

"The ship we were on was torpedoed about 5:45 Tuesday night, Feb. 5th. I was about four decks above my quarters, just starting to shave when she hit.

The lights immediately went out and everybody rushed on deck, to our lifeboat stations. I was without my hat, coat, overcoat and life belt. After standing there about ten minutes while the boat crew was working with the boats up on the deck above us, I went down to my quarters and got my overcoat, gloves, hat and life belt and right back on deck again.

Our squadron was to go in the No. 10 boats, on the port side. The ship was hit on the starboard, or right side, and was listing pretty heavily toward that side. There was some difficulty in handling the boats on our side, and when they put No. 10-A over the side she capsized with two or three men in her. They got out all right on the life ropes. No. 10-B was launched with about 40 men in it, and 10-C was down at our deck, about half full of men, and before I had a chance to

get in, (I was supposed to go in 10-C) the rope broke, and 10-C dropped right on top of 10-B, and I guess most of the 40 men in 10-B were killed. Then the ship was listing so much that they couldn't get any more boats over that side. Our officers told some of us to go up and help the boat crews as they didn't have enough men. Then a torpedo boat destroyer came alongside and the ship took off about four or five hundred. I was up on the boat deck trying to help out there. They got two or three more life boats off the other side of the ship, and then they couldn't seem to move any more of them, and there were still several hundred of us on the ship. Then another destroyer came up and took off all but about sixty of us.

We sixty got to work and rigged up some new tackle, and got one more lifeboat over, on the lower side. We knew it was our last chance, as the ship was very low in the water, and listing heavily. We all got into the one boat, which was only supposed to hold forty, and after picking up two or three out of the water, rowed away from the ship. We were in the last boat to leave the ship and as far as I know got off everyone who was alive. We got away about 8:30, and as soon as we were a safe distance away from the ship, stopped rowing, and began to bail out the water with

and began to bail out the water with our hats, as the boat was leaking badly, owing to the overload.

I lost my overcoat and life belt as I took them off while I was working, so that I could do more. I bailed water with my hat for about two hours, and was so wet and cold that I had to let someone else take my place, and I laid down on the seats and several others who were dry laid over me, and so I got warm again. We had to lie down as much as possible so we would have room in the boat for everyone.

About an hour later, after having been adrift about three hours, we were picked up by a trawler, and taken into port on the coast of Ireland, where we arrived at six in the morning.

We had only been gone from the ship about three quarters of an hour when the boilers exploded, and broke her in two pieces, and we saw no more of her.

When we arrived in port we were immediately taken to one of the hotels, where we had breakfast, got warm, dry, clothing and some sleep.

We were treated royally by the people there, and after staying there two nights, this afternoon we came down to this place which is in a barracks. There are some Scottish troops here, who have seen service in the trenches and are wounded.

We don't know where we will go when we leave here, nor when; but of course we must stick around this part of the country somewhere until we can get some more clothing from some U. S. Supply Depot. I lost everything I had, except what clothing I have on.

All of our service records went down with the ship, as did our payroll

and I think the money for our pay. Thus it will take several months before these things can be looked up, and until that time we will receive no pay.

There were several boys whom I know, aboard the ship: Clarence Norgren, Phil Custard's older brother, "Tad" Wilson, Lewis Hall and his brother, and perhaps some more. Clarence Norgren was landed at the same port as myself, but I have't heard anything about the others, yet.

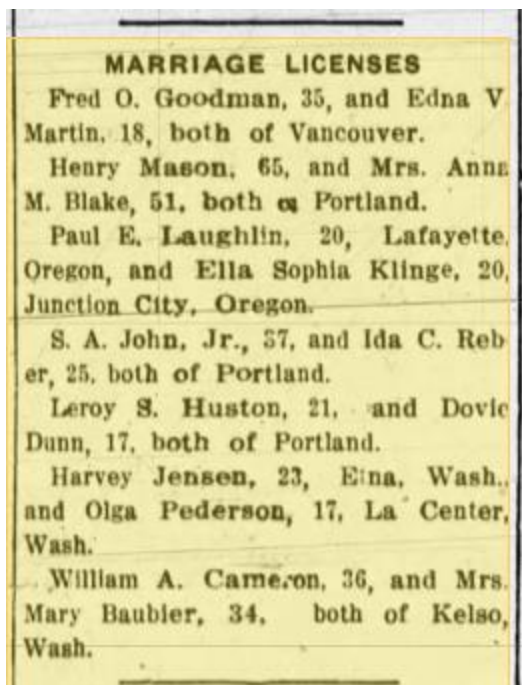
Out of 2500 troops on the ship, all but about 200 are accounted for, and perhaps some of these will turn up later.

The people here are surely treating us fine and we appreciate it very much.

Of course we were like evryone else, we didn't think it could happen to us, but it did.

Listed as missing was M-Sgt. Harold J. Roberts, son of Harold J. Roberts Sr., formerly of Vancouver, and now living in St. Paul, Minn.

The missing career airman is a nephew of Mrs. Oscar L. Hanson of Vancouver, and is also related to the O. A. Turk family of the Mill Plain District, said Oscar L. Hanson.

It was recalled here that the father was rescued during World War I when he was aboard the troop ship Tuscania, which was sunk off the coast of Ireland.

An Air Force master sergeant, the son of a St. Paul couple, has been presumed dead following the collision last week of two B52 bombers over the North China Sea.

Mr. and Mrs. Harold J. Roberts Sr., 633 Short St., received word from their daughter-in-law that Harold J. Roberts Jr., 43, of Sacramento, Calif., was lost in action while on a 6,000-mile mission from Guam to hit a Viet Cong target in South Viet Nam.

Hanson died Wednesday in Meadow Glade. He was 83.

He was born May 25, 1896, in Washburn, Wash.

Hanson was a resident of Yacolt, where he also was postmaster from 1921 to 1938. He served as Vancouver postmaster from 1953 to 1966.

His last residence was at 2014 E St.

In the 1930s, Hanson promoted the idea of building Lewisville Park. He later helped build the park and became its first superintendent.
