Two Ohio Bell Pioneers To Retire

Two employees of Ohio Bell Telephone company, with a total of 81 years of service in the industry, have announced plans to retire.

John H. Monaghan, division revenue accounting manager, will have completed 43 years when he steps down Dec. 24.

J. Harold Robinson, traffic manager in the western division, will have served 38 years when he starts relaxing Jan. 13.

Monaghan will be succeeded by T. J. Budden, district revenue accounting manager at Toledo, and Robinson by R. A. Jenkins of Dayton.

Monaghan is a Columbus native, started working as a grocery clerk in 1913 and entered revenue accounting work in 1914 with Central Union Telephone company.

He has represented the telephone company in a number of

chapter of the Telephone Pioneers of America.

He is a member of the Chamber of Commerce, the Dayton Country club and the Dayton Bicycle club.

Like Monaghan, he is a World War I veteran. He is a member of the Gyro club, Executives' club and the YMCA.

Budden, with Ohio Bell 28 years, is a Miami university graduate who started with the company as an office boy. Jenkins, a Case Tech graduate and employee since 1946, came to Dayton in 1956 as district traffic superintendent, but has been on special assignment in Philadelphia part of this year.

Three Daytonians Injured In Crash Near Lebanon

LEBANON, April 8.—More than 40 stitches had to be taken in the head and face of a Dayton woman last night as a result of a car-truck collision four miles north of here on state route 48. She was Mrs. J. Harold Robinson, 46, 128 East Dickson avenue.

Injured with her were her 51-

year-old husband and 11-year-old daughter, Judy.

The accident occurred about 11 o'clock, while the three were en route to Dayton.

Robinson suffered a fractured kneecap, a cut over the eye and chest injuries. The child escaped with bruises. In addition to cuts, Mrs. Robinson had chest injuries.

All three were still at Blair Brothers' hospital this morning, where the adults' condition was reported fair. The child's was satisfactory.

The Robinson car crashed into the truck from the rear as it was parked along the highway due to engine trouble.

State Patrolman D. L. Osborn, who investigated the accident, said no charge would be filed against the truck operator, Carl Blackburn, Cuyahoga Falls.

Mrs. Robinson's head was thrown through the windshield. Her scalp was badly cut and 12 stitches were needed to close a gash in her cheek.

The car was damaged badly.

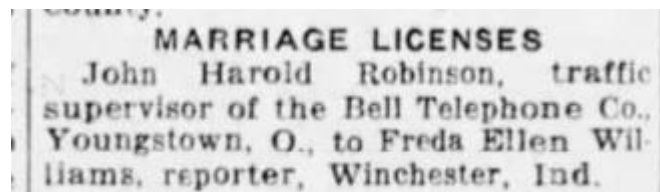

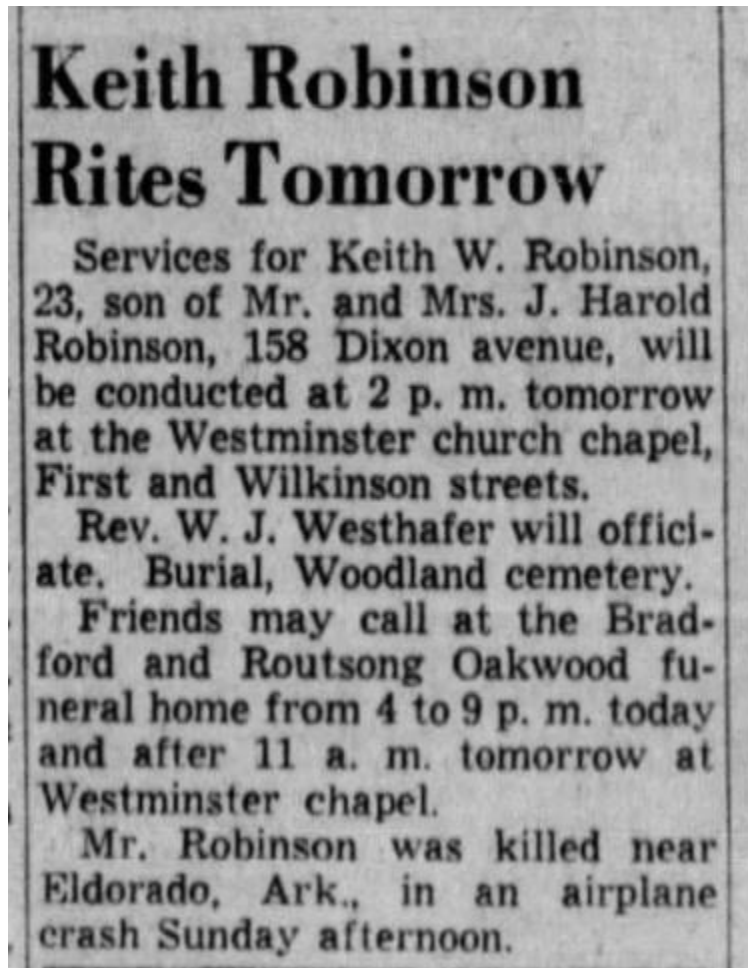

Plan Rites For Daytonian, 24, Crash Victim

Funeral arrangements were being made Monday for Keith W. Robinson, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Harold Robinson of 158 E. Dixon av., who was killed near Eldorado, Ark., in an airplane crash Sunday afternoon.

The crash is believed to have occurred as he was returning to Texas City, Tex., in a small plane piloted by a fellow employe of the K. W. Robinson Monsanto Chemical Co. where he had been working for the past 11 months. He was a physicist.

His father said Monday that last week his son informed him he was taking the plane trip to Pine Bluff, Ark., with the pilot who was to visit in Little Rock, Ark., over the weekend.

The plane is thought to have run into a storm, causing the crash.



ROBINSON was graduated from Oakwood high school in 1944 and from Denison university in 1948. He was a member of the track squad at both schools. He was a member of Westminster Presbyterian church and Phi Gamma Delta fraternity.

Besides his parents, he is survived by a sister, Judy, and his paternal grandmother, Mrs. W. H. Robinson of Cleveland.

Keith W. Robinson, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Harold Robinson, 158 East Dixon avenue, was killed in an airplane crash near Eldorado, Ark., yesterday afternoon. The family was informed last night.

He was presumed to have been returning to his work at Texas City, Tex., from a week end in Little Rock. He was a passenger in a small plane flown by a fellow employe of The Monsanto Chemical company.

The plane was observed to run into a storm, circle, and crash. The pilot, whose name was not learned, also was killed.

Mr. Robinson was a graduate of Oakwood high school, 1944, and of Denison university, 1948. He had been employed as a physicist at Texas City since September, 1948.

Born in Youngstown, he had been an Oakwood resident since 1938. He was a member of Westminster Presbyterian church, and of Phi Gamma Delta fraternity.

He is survived by his parents and one sister, Judy.

Jeri Callahan, age 80, passed peacefully the morning of April 10th in Shoreline, WA. Known to many as "the Houseboat Lady", Jeri found her niche in the floating home community of Lake Union where she resided for over 25 years. She offered tours by water of the floating homes and published the book *Staying Afloat*, a collection of vignettes about past & present daily life in Seattle's floating homes.

Jeri was born Judith Ellen Robinson in Columbus, OH to J. Harold and Freida Robinson. She grew up in Dayton, OH, went to Oakwood H.S. and graduated cum laude from the College of William and Mary, where she pledged Kappa Alpha Theta. She married Charles L. Callahan (deceased) of Seattle in 1958 and moved to Burien, WA, where they had 3 children.

Later, Jeri obtained a Teaching Credential from Pacific Oaks College and worked for the Seattle school district. In the late-90's Jeri became a snowbird, spending winters on the beach in Puerto Vallarta, often inviting folks to share her condo, and reading lessons at the local church. She loved the water, swimming and sunbathing. When in Seattle, she was active at St. Mark's and participated in several clubs, the local Theta chapter, and was known for entertaining at her houseboat most notably on the 4th of July.

Jeri is survived by her three children, Keith (Teresa) Callahan of Falls Church, VA, Constance (Jeff) Stubbins of Stanwood, WA, John (Denise) Callahan of Eugene, OR; and four grandchildren, Dolly Aguilar, Candace Sharp, Alex Stubbins, and Gustavo Callahan.
