Mother:

Died—One of the old settlers of Neosho and Crawford counties passed away at her home at Hepler, Kansas, Thursday, December 10th, 1908. Mrs. Anna Markham was born in Lewis Town, Pa., September 9th, 1830, and had reached the good old age of 78 years, 3 months and 1 day. She moved from Pennsylvania to Bushnell, Ill., where she was married to M. V. Markham April 4th, 1867. In 1868 she came to Kansas with her husband and settled on a farm on Flatrock creek in Neosho County. Ten years later they sold their farm and bought a farm in Walnut township. Several years ago they left the farm and moved to Hepler, where they lived till she died. In her young womanhood days she was converted and united with the Presbyterian church. In 1878 she joined the Christian church and was baptized in Flatrock creek by Elder John Hibbs. The funeral services were held in the Christian church on Friday, conducted by Elder J. P. Childs. A large audience assembled, and there were many fragrant flowers on the casket. He spoke very touchingly of the beautiful life she had lived and of her many acts of kindness. Her mortal remains were buried in the Walnut cemetery. Mrs. Anna Markham was one of earth's noble women. She has resided here for forty years, and in all of those long years she was always the same kind and noble christian woman. In the hours of sorrow, sickness and death her loving heart and sweet christian spirit sympathized with the bereaved. But her pure and noble christian life was best seen in her home life. She was always kind and cheerful, scattering rays of sunshine as she went about her work. Her days on earth are numbered. She was ready to go when the messenger came and ushered her into the gates of heaven. She leaves her husband and other relatives and friends to mourn her death,

M V MARKHAM

M V Markham, aged 77 years, died at the home of his son, Homer Markham, on a farm near Buffalo, Kas., last Saturday.

M V Markham was one of the early settlers of Crawford county settling on a farm in Walnut township, where he lived until old age, incapacitating himself and wife from the active work of successful farming, they sold their farm and moved to Hepler, where they engaged in gardening and small fruit raising. A few years ago his wife died and Mr Markham sold the home at Hepler and went to live with his son and family near Buffalo.

The son and family were preparing to move to a farm in Oklahoma where there would be better opportunities for the growing children, when the aged father was taken suddenly ill. A few days later the sickness terminated in death.

The body was taken to Walnut Sunday afternoon and the funeral held from the Christian church of which faith he was a member. He was an old soldier and veterans of the Civil War served as pull bearers. The body was interred in the Walnut cemetery beside his deceased wife.

Mr. Markham took an active interest in political affairs of the state and county.

He leaves a son living near Chanute and two step-daughters, Mrs Frank Hoffman of Girard and E. F. East of Iola.—Pittsburg Headlight.

WAS A PIONEER SETTLER.

Mrs. Hannah Markham Had Resided in Walnut Township Many Years.

Hepler, Dec. 14.—Mrs. Hannah Markham, whose funeral occurred Friday, was one of the pioneer settlers of Walnut township. Mrs. Markham and her husband came to Walnut township in the '60s and had resided ever since in Hepler and vicinity, being among the most respected residents of this section.

Mrs. Markham died Wednesday, after a short illness, her death being due to old age.

Hannah Stevens was born in Philadelphia, Pa., Sept. 9, 1829, being 79 years of age at the time of her death. She was married to Solomon Snook, her first husband, in Pennsylvania, and they moved to near Macomb, Ill., where he died in 1865.

Three children were born to the first marriage, Mrs. Frank Huffman, of Girard, Mrs. E. M. East of Iola, and W. R. Snook, of Oregon City, Ore., all of whom are still living. The two former were with her at the time of her death.

She was married to M. V. Markham, in Illinois, in 1867, and soon after the marriage Mr. and Mrs. Markham moved west, settling in this county on a farm in Walnut township. Two children were born to the second marriage, both of whom are dead. They lived on the farm until a few years ago when they moved to Hepler where they had since resided.

Mrs. Markham was highly esteemed lady, a Christian woman and was loved by all. She was a member of the Christian church and Rev. Childs, formerly of Hepler, officiated at the funeral services. The remains were laid at rest at the Walnut cemetery. The funeral was a large one, the schools being dismissed for the occasion.
