Tenant Hangs Self

(Special to The State Journal)

DURAND, June 7—Floyd E. Smith, 58, tenant on the Rex Post farm north of here, committed suicide Thursday by hanging himself to a rafter in the granary. His body was found by the widow, Mrs. Anna Smith, shortly before 1 o'clock Thursday afternoon, when she went in search of him after he failed to return to the house at the usual time.

Smith had suffered a nervous breakdown some time ago and had recently been melancholy, it was said. Mrs. Smith said the heat of the past few days had seemed to affect him.

Smith was born in Flushing March 25, 1882, the son of Eddie and Electa Smith. He lived in Flushing for eight years, in Lennon nine years, Vernon township 25 years and in Venice township for the past 10 years. He was married November 30, 1904, to Miss Anna Durling. He was a member of the Methodist church. He had been a tenant on the Post farm for five years and previous to that time worked on the Dr. E. J. Carney farm.

Surviving besides the widow are two daughters, Mrs. Frank Smith and Mrs. Bruce Miller; his mother, Mrs. Electa Smith; two brothers, Arthur Smith of Owosso and Bert Smith of Saginaw, a sister, Mrs. Arthur Wilbur of Swartz Creek and four grandchildren. Funeral services will be held Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the farm home with the Rev. Mr. V. H. Coe officiating. Interment will be in Greenwood cemetery at Vernon.

HAROLD E. SMITH

Harold E. Smith was born on a farm near Lennon, Clayton township, Genesee county, Michigan, Aug. 7th, 1899 and died at the State Sanatorium at Howell Oct. 10, 1927.

He attended the country school near Lennon until he was sixteen when he entered the high school at Lennon, Finishing high school he took a position with the Buick Motor Company, where he worked until the reactionary period following the World's War. At this time and before he had returned to his work his health failed and he was forced to spend several months recuperating. After regaining his health he was employed by the State Sanatorium at Howell, later moving to Howell where he was employed in the office of the Dodge Sales, and later in the Cook & Reed Creamery office.

Removing to Flint he was employed by the Bingman Dairy Co. It was while working for the dairy company that his health gave out the second time and he was forced to return to the State Sanatorium at Howell for treatment. Although he was not able to leave the Sanatorium he was optimistic and cheerful and planning for the future. He was quite a reader of the scripture and was prepared when called.

Mr. Smith was married to Verle Grant December 6, 1924. Besides his wife and son Gerald there survives his mother of Flint, one sister, Mrs. Arthur Wilber near Swartz Creek and four brothers, Floyd near Durand, Bertie of Saginaw, Byron of Flint, Arthur of Owosso. His father, one sister and one brother preceded him to the great beyond.
