YAKIMA, Wash., Feb. 18.—Eugene W. Snyder, a Yakima boy, is listed among the missing American soldiers on board when the Tuscania was torpedoed. Snyder was aged 20 and enlisted at Rimrock, where he was a logger in the employ of the reclamation service.

His father, Joseph Snyder, also in employ of the reclamation service at Rimrock, received this picture, taken in the east, where the 20th Engineers were in training just before embarking for France.

Snyder was born in Helena, Mont., and reared in Tacoma, where he has a sister, Mrs. William E. Ault. While with the reclamation service he was active in Y. M. C. A. work and in athletics. In the Fourth of July games last year he was the runner up in the log-rolling contest, second only to a veteran champion.

Rimrock Man Among Missing.

YAKIMA, Wash., Feb. 11.—Only one Yakima man is in the list of missing on the Tuscania, as reports now stand. Eugene W. Snyder of Rimrock, son of J. C. Snyder, is not yet accounted for. Young Snyder was an employe of the reclamation service when he enlisted in the 20th engineers. He is 20 years old and was prominent in Y. M. C. A. work while at Rimrock.

NAME OF TACOMAN FOR LEGION POST

YAKIMA, July 16.—(Special)—A new post of the American Legion organized at Rimrock near here will bear the name of a former Tacoma man if plans of the organizers are carried out. Eugene Snyder, who enlisted in 1917 from Rimrock and lost his life when the troopship *Tuscania* was torpedoed off the Irish coast, is the man whom his comrades desire to honor in naming their post.

The new group of Legionnaires is composed entirely of men employed at the construction camp of the Reclamation service storage dam at Rimrock. Some of them were working at the camp when they went away to war and now back on their old jobs. Rimrock's service flag had 77 silver stars and one gold one. The gold star stands for Snyder who, so far as known, was the only Rimrock man who died in the service during the war.
