Employee was engaged most of the day interviewing draft not deserters and among others interviewed Gabor Santase, age 23, 608 E. 92nd St., Chicago, Ill., a Hungarian and has first papers. His serial No. is 2316, order No. 546, was called by local board for the city of Galveston, Texas, on September 5, 1917, to go with increment moving to Camp Travis, San Antonio, Texas. Santase came to Chicago from Galveston, Texas, shortly after the registration and claims that before leaving Galveston he notified the proper authorities at the City Hall at Galveston of his leaving Texas and gave them his Chicago address. However, it seems that this information was turned over to the local board at Galveston, as Santase had in his possession when apprehended by an agent of this department notice to appear for examination and notice of having been selected for military service, sent

him by his board. He claims that no notices were received by him to prepare for entrainment or notice to go to camp. Santase appears to be loyal to this country and willing to join the army. Santase was apprehended on advice received from the Department of Justice, Galveston, Texas. He was this day turned over to the military authorities.

Pursuant to instructions from Acting Division Superintendent Furbushaw, Employee proceeded to 608 E. 92nd Street, Chicago, and learned that he is rooming with a Mr. Batjansky, and that he was employed in the Illinois Central Car shops in Burnside, as boiler maker helper. Employee proceeded to the Illinois Central car shops and apprehended this man and turned him over to the Bureau office for final disposition.

Continuing his investigation, Agent interviewed John Sanko, at 4318 Ave G, the former address of Santase while in Galveston. Sanko stated that he was informed by Santase through a letter that he had been examined at Chicago, although he did'nt state whether he had passed the physical examination or not. He stated that he was living at 608 E. 92nd St., and that he had heard from him at this address about two weeks ago. That Santase had been sick in a hospital with a broken arm, but that he was back at work again. Santase is a Hungarian and apparently a naturalized citizen. Sanko stated that Santase had been gone a couple of months. A copy of this report is being sent to Chicago for whatever action they might desire to take. This man was called with the National Army in the increment which left Galveston September 4th.

Bathtub Blow Recital Wins Singer Divorce

Diane Richards, 22, blond singer and actress, yesterday divorced John Sentesi, 31, musician and composer, who, she said, once pulled her from her bathtub and struck her.

"He struck me on several occasions and threatened to all the time," she testified in the court of Superior Judge Arnold Praeger. "He humiliated me by calling me all kinds of names and he took jobs away from me when I auditioned."

Trouble With Employer

Sentesi caused trouble with her employers, she told Judge Praeger.

"He came down to one club where I was working," she said, "and he tore a gown I was wearing and struck me. He followed me to my mother's home and broke in. Once he pulled me out of my bathtub and struck me."

Her sister, Mrs. Mary Rogers, questioned by Atty. John H. Marshall, told the judge Miss Richards "was not able to go to auditions half the time for her husband would hear about it and ruin it for her."

Judge Praeger awarded Miss Richards \$100-a-month alimony and the decree. The couple had been married two years.
