Huntington, L. The society is the result of the energy of the pastor of the church, the Rev. Dr. J. Jeffrey Johnstone, and the idea was well received by the people of the church. At the organization meeting at the manse there were about thirty present, and after the formation of the society the following officers were elected: President, the Rev. J. Jeffrey Johnstone; vice presidents, George A. Brush, Allison E. Lowndes; secretary, J. Jeffrey Johnstone, jr.; treasurer, Alvah M. Baylis; members of the executive committee, Clifton Sammis, Arthur Stanbrough, Roswell S. Baylis.

A meeting room for the society has been arranged in the rear of the manse, and visitors will be welcome. The first meeting will be Thursday evening, November 2, and after Christmas it is hoped to hold the meetings weekly.

All sort of subjects will be offered for the debates, but Dr. Johnstone insists that for the sake of harmony in the society, all subjects dealing with local politics shall be taboo.

Huntington, Feb. 25.—The annual religious service of the Sons and Daughters of the American Revolution in this village was held yesterday morning at the historic old First Church. Isaac R. Swezey, Jr., was heard in a baritone solo, Kipling's Recessional, by Dr. Kavin. The anthem, "I Honor the Lord," with solos by Mrs. Moore, contralto, was also given as part of the musical programme. The Rev. Dr. Johnstone spoke on "Love of Country and Love of God," taking his text from Psalms 137, v.-vi., "If I forget Thee, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget her cunning. If I do not remember Thee, let my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth; if I prefer not Jerusalem above my chief joy."

Japhtha Lodge, No. 494, F. and A. M., attended the union service at the First Church in the evening to give thanks for the safety of their Masonic brother, Arthur L. Stanbrough, who was on board the Tuscania when she was torpedoed. The Rev. C. E. Cragg, of St. John's Church, gave the doxology and the thanksgiving prayer; the Rev. S. H. Seem, of the Central Church, led the Scripture and the Rev. C. H. Rannels, of the Baptist Church, made the prayer of adoration and intercession. Dr. Johnstone spoke on "Endure Hardness."

Thomas, Olin Davis, Raymond J. Cushman, Carleton E. Brewster, Jr., and William Barto. All charter members are of Bay Shore.

The posts previously formed are in Babylon, Patchogue, Riverhead, Greenport and Huntington. A membership rally and organization meeting of the Huntington post is to be held tomorrow evening. There will be speakers from State headquarters present.

166 posts of the American Legion were formed in New York State during the month of August, bringing the total on September 1 to 358. This will mean that about one out of every four men who went into service is a member of the veterans' organization.

A campaign drive to bring the national membership up to 1,000,000 will be undertaken by all posts throughout the country in the week of September 15 to 20.

Ruling Asked on Garage Permit

Arthur L. Stan Brough Jr., San Bernardino business man, announced yesterday that he will appeal to the mayor and city council from Wednesday night's action of the city planning commission in refusing to permit him to build and operate a new garage at the northeast corner of Fourteenth and E streets.

Acting upon the recommendation of Joseph E. Rich, the commission rejected the garage permit on the grounds that the "location is not proper for the special use proposed by the applicant." Under the city laws, garages and service stations can only be built and operated under special permission of the planners, even in business zones.

Mr. Stan Brough proposes to construct a concrete or brick building 35 by 48 feet at the rear of his lot extending along E street for 150 feet, zoned for business at that point.

The power of the plan board is limited to recommendation that a zone application be granted or rejected by the mayor and council. Final decision on the Stan Brough application rests with the mayor and council, and he said that he will carry the case before Monday night's session.

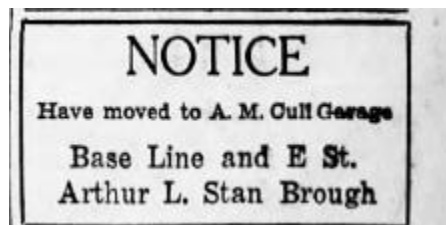

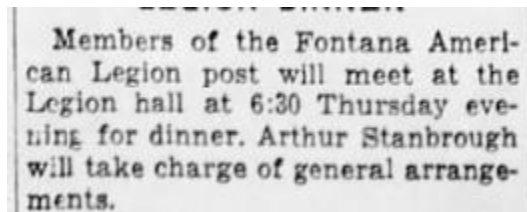

CROPSEY GIVES ADVICE.

**Justice Admonishes New Voters
to Forget Sex in Politics.**

Supreme Court Justice James C. Cropsey advised newly-enfranchised women of this borough to forget their sex in politics to aid good government, before a large assemblage at the closing night of the "Hints for Hyman" mock election fete at All Souls' Universalist Church, Ocean and Ditmas avenue, Flatbush, last evening.

"I don't think there will be another attempt to buy an election in a lifetime, at least in the lifetime of us who have reached middle life," Justice Cropsey declared.

The women candidates for office made a clean sweep of the "election."

Three of the latter whose names were written in defeated the regularly nominated male candidates. The amendment calling for a dry town of Flatbush was carried by a final vote of 3,545 to 2,880.

In the race for Fire Commissioner John B. Creighton and John J. Snyder were nosed out by Miss Esther E. Murphy, a secretary in the Park Department.

Miss Adele Conklin, secretary of the Legal Rating Bureau, entered in the race as a "black horse," easily defeated John H. McCooley and Alexander McKinny, candidates for Civil Service Commissioner. Mrs. Alice Parker Hutchings, editor of the "Woman's Law Journal," defeated J. Herbert Low, principal of Erasmus Hall High School, and Benjamin Butterworth in the contest for Park Commissionership.
