The continued case against Mary Moore, for the larceny of a ring, pair of shoes and pair of gloves, the whole valued at \$9, from Fred S. Alden was tried.

Fred S. Alden of 15 South street testified that Miss Moore worked at his house from Oct. 24 to Nov. 2, when she went away, as she said, to attend a funeral, but did not return; three or four days later my wife missed a ring, pair of shoes and a pair of gloves; I saw defendant in Frost's hall, last Saturday night; she said that my wife gave her the shoes and gloves.

Mrs. Ida Alden, wife of last witness, testified that defendant has her gloves, shoes and ring in her possession; the gloves are worth \$1 50, the shoes \$2 50, and the ring \$7; defendant admitted to witness that she took the gloves, but denied taking either the ring or the shoes.

Susie Merwin testified that she has roomed at Mrs. Alden's since last Friday; I saw a moonstone ring, with two stones on the side and one stone missing, on defendant's finger at Mrs. Royce's house.

Mrs. Alden was recalled and described the ring, her description tallying with that given by last witness.

Mary Moore, the defendant, took the stand and denied that she had Mrs. Alden's ring; she claimed that the ring that she had in her possession was one that she borrowed of a Miss Sawyer of Leominster, and it is now in Miss Sawyer's possession; that Mrs. Alden gave her both the gloves and shoes the day before she left the house.

Policeman Kendall testified that defendant does not bear a good name and he had told her she had better keep away from the waiting-room at the depot; she has a mother and brother, but does not live at home.

Mrs. Alden denied that she gave, or lent, defendant the shoes or gloves, the morning before she went away.

Chief Locke stated that Mary's mother refused to bail her on Monday. The case was continued to Wednesday for sentence.

FOUR CAUGHT IN A RAID.

Result of Foxboro Police Finding a Man Asleep in a Carriage, With a Jug of Cider Beside Him.

FOXBORO, June 22—Chief White was called to North Foxboro last evening. A driverless horse had been found attached to a two-seat wagon. Huddled up, unconscious, on the rear seat was a Foxboro man. On the front seat was a jug of cider.

Chief White placed the man under arrest on a charge of drunkenness and then assisted by policemen secured a warrant and visited the Staples house of North Foxboro. The search was for liquor, but they found none.

As a result of the raid the police placed four more men under arrest on drunkenness charges. Four of the five men slept in the lockup. The other was released on bail. A warrant was issued charging Ida Staples with keeping a disorderly house.

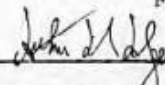
Last, I appoint my son Albert Warren Staples to be the executor of this will and request that he be not required to furnish a surety or sureties on his official bond.

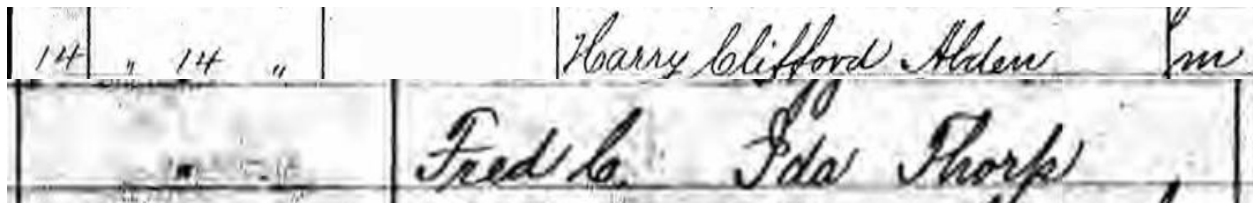

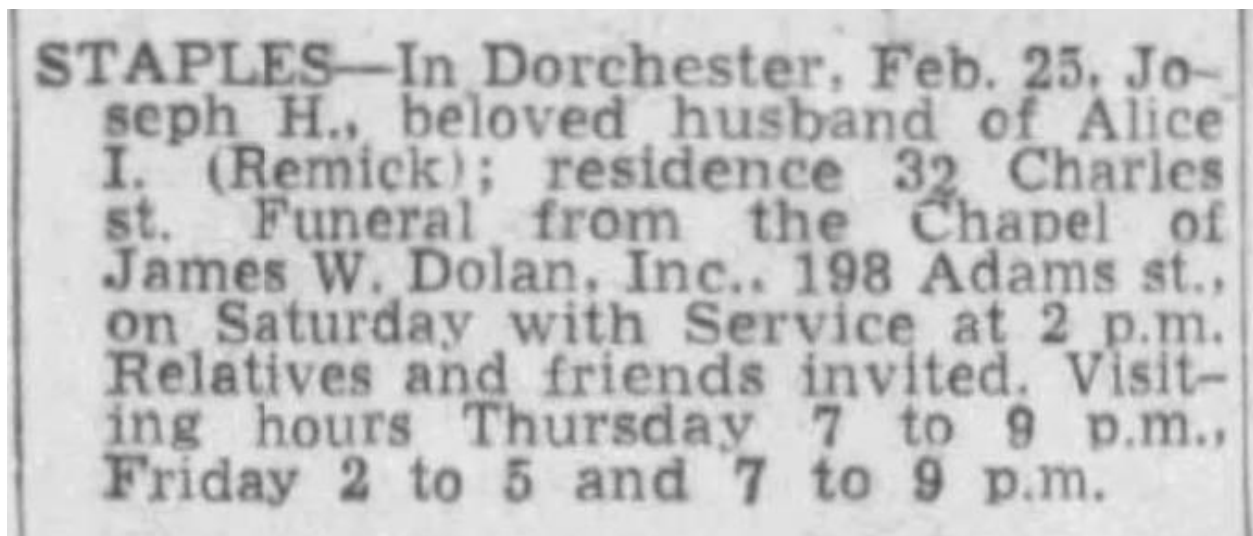

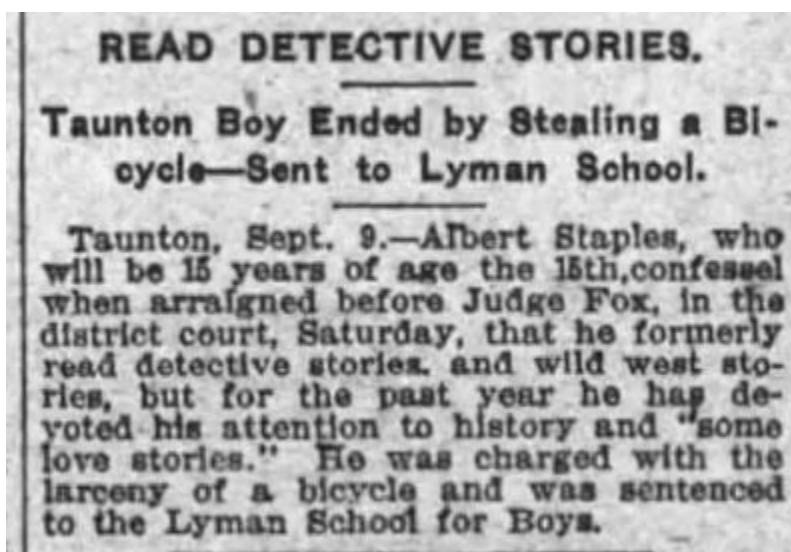

Thomas McNally was found guilty on continuance of receiving stolen property from his son, Michael, and was sentenced to three months in the house of correction. He was represented by Attorney C. R. Cummings, but the latter offered no evidence in defense.

The only evidence was that submitted by Albert Staples, who was brought from the Lyman School on habeas corpus papers. Staples' testimony was to the effect that after being sentenced to the Lyman School from his home in Taunton he managed to escape from the institution with Michael McNally, of this city, and that they went to Webster, and got \$42 through breaking into a grocery store. He said that McNally went into the store and that witness watched on the outside. They then came to McNally's home in this city, and the latter gave his father \$25, saying it was money he had stolen. They then gave him 30 cents, and he returned to his home at Taunton, and was taken back to the school.

Officer Mason, of the Lyman School, who was instrumental in bringing the case and mainly because he believes that McNally is keeping his son in hiding, did not testify, as Attorney Cummings declined to offer any defense on hearing the testimony of the Staples boy. He, however, appealed from the sentence.

There were very few Fall River cases before the jury in consequence of the new law which extends the jurisdiction of the district court. The Fall River district court took advantage of this new law and consequently there were only five or six cases that were to come before the jury and some of these were not reported.

The following indictments were returned: Sylvia Boutere, New Bedford, breaking, entering and larceny, two counts, not guilty.

John F. Burke, Somerset, breaking, entering and larceny from Somerset car barn of the Bay State Street Railway company, guilty on four counts.

Albert E. Staples, Taunton, breaking, entering and larceny; not guilty on three counts and guilty on three counts.

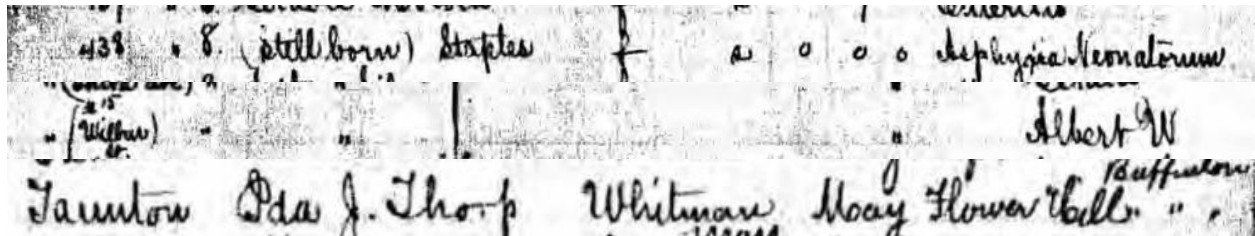
