ARTHUR STEFFEN

Arthur Steffen, Hortonville, a veteran of the World War died Tuesday morning at the hospital of the National Soldiers home in Milwaukee, following an illness of a year. He was 31 years old. Mr. Steffen had been at the soldiers hospital in Milwaukee several times in an effort to recover his health.

Survivors are his mother, Mrs. Mary Steffen; two brothers Irvin and Eli of Hortonville; four sisters, Mary Ellen of Hortonville, Mrs. Richard Kearns, Chicago, Mrs. Allan Balliet, Milwaukee, and Mrs. Irwen Breyer, Dale.

The funeral will be held at 10 o'clock Friday morning from St. Peter and St. Paul church in Hortonville. Burial will be in the Hortonville Catholic cemetery. The American Legion of which Mr. Steffen was a member, will be in charge of the funeral.

Mr. Steffen was a member of Co. B. 125th Infantry during the World War, and served overseas. He also served with company G. Appleton in the Mexican border trouble in 1913. Mr. Steffen was one of the survivors rescued from the transport "Tuscania" when it was sunk off the coast of England during the war.

BOY SHOT IN LEFT SIDE WITH RIFLE

ARTHUR STEFFEN OF STEPHENS-
VILLE ACCIDENTALLY SHOT
WHILE CLEANING GUN

Arthur Steffen, a 14-year-old boy, is at St. Elizabeth's hospital in a serious condition as the result of being shot with a 22 calibre rifle at his home in Stephenville on Wednesday.

The bullet entered the lad's left side. A physician from Hortonville was called, but he could not locate the bullet, and young Steffen was removed to the hospital in this city, but thus far all efforts to locate the bullet have been fruitless.

The boy was cleaning the rifle when it was accidentally discharged.

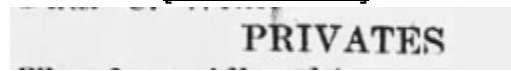

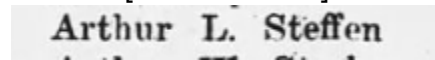

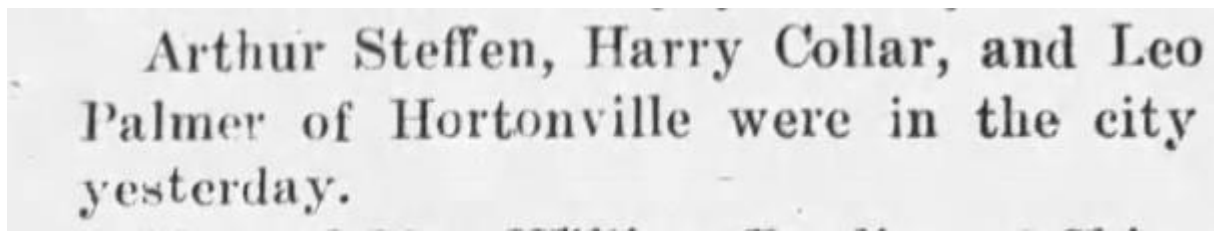

The waiting room of the Chicago and Northwestern railroad station of Hortonville was thrown into disorder one day last week when Leonard Schmall, station agent, was attacked by Harold Hittle and Arthur Steffen, according to complaint made by Schmall in municipal court Thursday morning.

Hittle and Steffen were each fined \$10 and costs when they were convicted of the charge of assault and battery. Schmall said he was struck by the men when he forbade them to eat fruit that was temporarily stored in the depot.

pital**

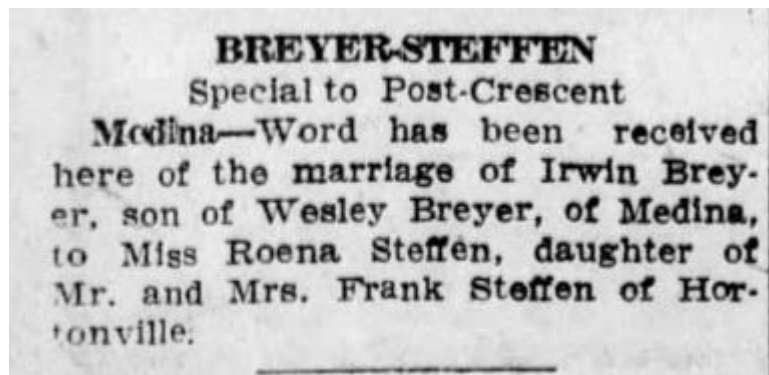

His companion, Nyle Schwebs, was reported to be improving Wednesday morning, and he is expected to recover. It was necessary to remove an eye Monday night.
