WERE 15 ARKANSANS ON LOST TRANSPORT

War Department Does Not
Separate Survivors From
the Lost.

LIST MAY BE LARGER

Several Reported on Tuscania Not In-
cluded—Lieut. John H. Sutton
Jr. on Board.

According to information which has been sent out by the War Department, 15 Arkansans, one officer and 14 enlisted men, were aboard the Tuscania when she was torpedoed by a German submarine. The list of survivors has not yet been announced. Lieut. John H. Sutton, reported aboard the ship when she was sunk, was born at Holly Grove, and is a graduate of the Second Officers Training School at Leon Springs, Tex. He is a brother-in-law of O. G. Stegman, 1904 East Ninth street, and his wife is now living with her brother's family. Following is the list of Arkansans:

MONROE COUNTY BOY IS SAFE

Lieut. J. H. Sutton of the
100th Aero Corp on the
Torpedoed, "Tuscania,"
Reported 'SAFE'

The sinking of the transport "Tuscania" by a German submarine last week and which sent more than 2200 U. S. Troops into the Atlantic Ocean off the Irish Coast, brought the war home to Monroe county, as one of our boys was aboard.

Lieut. J. H. Sutton, Jr., son of J. H. Sutton of Holly Grove was aboard the Tuscania, as a member of the 100th Aero Corp. In as much as there were 167 lives lost, naturally enough there was much anxiety over young Suttons safety, by his father and friends, until word was received telling of his life being saved.

THE FATHER HEARS THE GOOD NEWS.

The ARGUS man phoned the news as quick as it was flashed over the wire, to Lieut. Sutton's father and there was real rejoicing as the aged parent learned for the first time that his boy was not among the dead.

Lieut. Sutton will be remembered as having served in the army a few years since in the Phillipine Islands and later, upon his discharge, was a Monroe county candidate four years ago.

Lieut. Sutton, with the rescued American forces not detained in hospitals, was on Sunday transported to France and I'm hoping to hear that the young man will make a showing in the fight "over there."

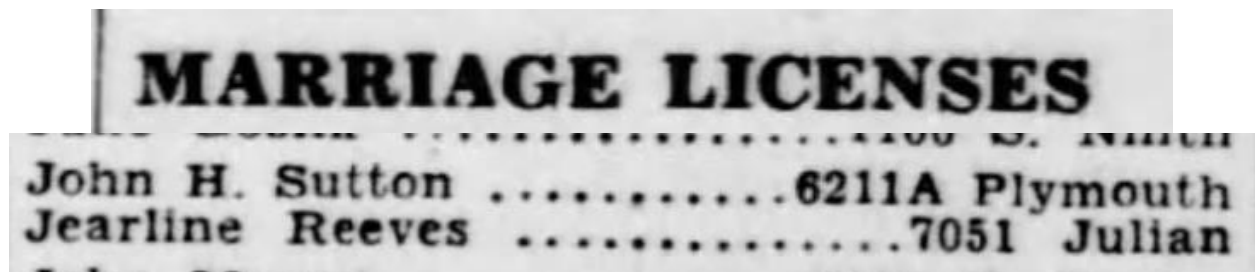

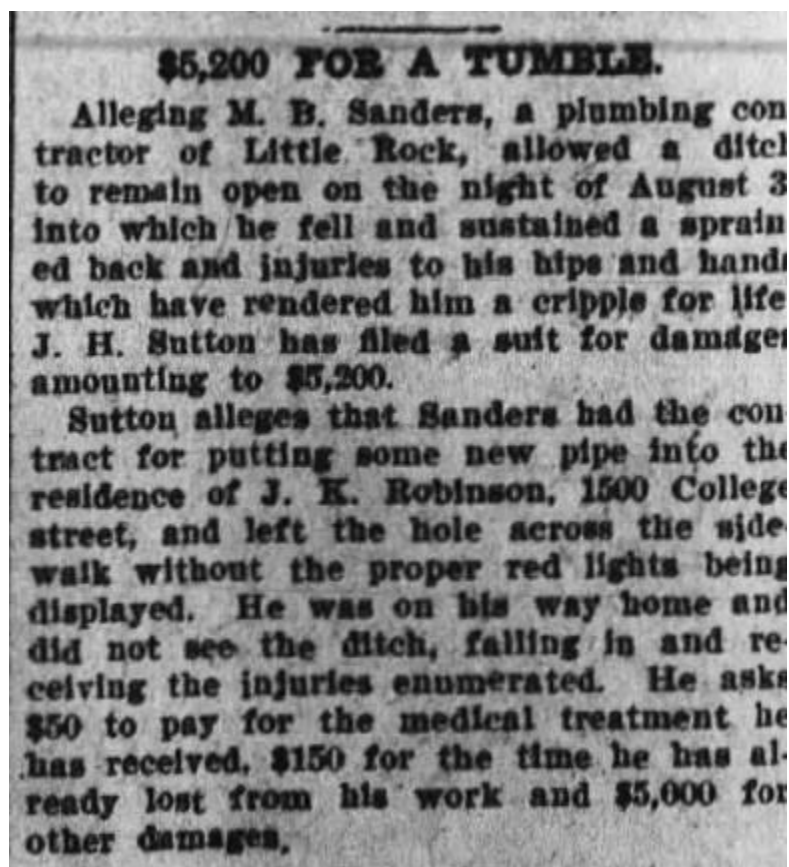

Was married to Dovie Rowland; their son was Philip Rowland Suggett (1916-1989) In the 1920 census, Ben, Dovie & son Roland live in Cache, Monroe AR with his mother, Mary Sutton. Ben died of pulmonary tuberculosis. According to his AR death certificate, Ben is buried in Shiloh Cemetery, Holly Grove, Monroe AR but is not on Find A Grave as of 25 Feb 2023.

In the 1900 census for Keaton, Arkansas Co. AR, conducted 3 Jul 1900, William V. Suggett (47 TN, father b. VA, mother b. SC, farmer) lived with wife Mary (27 MS, parents' birthplaces unknown, b. Oct 1888). They had been married 26 years, he said. Living with them were the Suggett children, all born in AR: Bessie B. (11, Oct 1888), Benjamin B. (9, Mar 1890), Fred D. (6, Jan 1894) & Miles J. (5 or 6 months, written over, Dec 1899).

Her marriage to John Sutton Sr., which occurred 27 Apr 1913, would appear to have been over by the 1920 census for Cache, Monroe AR. Mary Sutton, 53 IL, parents b. IL, lists herself as a widow. Living with her are "roomers" – actually her son, daughter-in-law & grandson – married couple Ben M. Suggett (28 AR, cutter at a button factory), wife Dovie M. (25 AR) & their son, Roland [Philip Rolaqnd] (4 AR). In the 1930, 1940 & 1950 censuses, Mary Suggett [not using surname Sutton], widow, resided in Clarendon, Monroe AR.

In the 1940 census, Mary Suggett is listed as the mother-in-law of Robert E. Hawkins. His wife, Bessie B. Hawkins (52 AR), is her daughter.

Her AR death record indicates a burial in Shiloh Cemetery, Holly Grove, Monroe AR – where first husband William Suggett was buried – but she is not on Find A Grave as of 25 Feb 2023.

Her father was Gottlieb Stegmaier, born 26 Jan 1854 in Baden-Wurttemberg, Germany. Her mother is found as Katerina Riegler or as Schauffler. Katharina Stegmaier, 15 Apr 1862 Germany – 27 Dec 1912 Monroe Co. AR, is buried in Shady Grove Cemetery, Clarendon, Monroe AR, F: 63581128. Gottlieb Stegmeire is recorded as marrying Katherine Schauffler on 6 Oct 1892 in Jefferson Co. AR.

In the 1930 census, while widowed Annie Sutton lives with her father, Gottlieb Stegmaier, in St. Louis MO, her 3 children - John Haywood III, Frances & Hope – live in the German General Protestant Orphan Home in St. Louis MO.

In May 1937, Annie K. Sutton applies for a marriage license in St. Louis MO with Frank Raymond Anson, 28 Feb 1891 Pittsfield, Pike IL – 4 Jul 1957 St. Louis, St. Louis MO. He is also buried in Slater Memorial Park, Slater, Saline MO, F: 91198211.

Annie died as Annie Anson & is buried in Slater Memorial Park, Slater, Saline MO.

Froeschner in St. Louis MO. – In the 1943 St. Louis MO city directory, Herbert F. Froeschner & wife Francis K. live at 5606 Lucas-Hunt Rd.; he is an instrument maker. Buried in Valhalla Cemetery, St. Louis Co. MO. F: 183332862
- Hope Patricia Sutton Drummond, 13 Feb 1923 Holly Grove, Monroe AR – 11 Feb 2015 Dallas, Dallas TX. In the 1930 census, age 7, she resides in the German General Protestant Orphan Home in St. Louis MO with her siblings John & Frances. - Wife of Henry C. Drummond, Jr., son of Henry C. (Sr.) & Isabelle Drummond. In the 1950 census for Dallas, Dallas TX, Henry C. “Drommond” (26 MO), an accountant for a newspaper company, resides with his wife Hope P. (27 AR). Henry was born 3 Jul 1923 in Slater, Saline MO & died 24 Jul 2017 in Dallas, Dallas TX. He is buried in Calvary Hill Cemetery, Dallas, Dallas TX but is not on Find A Grave – nor is Hope – as of 24 Feb 2023.
