Implement Salesman Dies

Ira A. Schultz, 59, one-time Elmira area sales representative of the James Mfg. Co., and lately of Petersburg, Va., died yesterday at McGuire Veterans Hospital at Richmond after several years of failing health.

A native of Waterloo, Wis., he came to Elmira about 30 years ago as a sales representative for the James Mfg. Co., a farm implement firm. He later was appointed eastern division sales manager, a post he held about 20 years.

Ill health forced him into semi-retirement several years ago and since then he has been engaged in a sales capacity in the Virginia-North Carolina District.

Mr. Schultz was a World War I veteran and a member of an American Legion post in Wisconsin. He also was a member of a Masonic lodge in Wisconsin and a former member of the Elmira Rotary Club.
