OTTO F. SCHULTZ

Otto F. Schultz, a Centralia resident for the past 33 years, died in a Centralia hospital Monday, June 13, at the age of 88.

He was born Oct. 28, 1888, in Pierre, S.D., and was a logger and a farmer. He farmed in the Big Hanaford Valley from 1944 to 1968. Mr. Schultz was a U.S. Army Veteran of World War I and a member of World War I Barrack 184, Chehalis. He was a survivor of the torpedoing of the transport Tuscania in World War I coming ashore on the coast of Ireland.

Surviving are his wife, Christine M., at home; a son, Willard, Calgary, Alberta, Canada; five brothers, William, Bremerton; John, Spokane; Walter, Waconia, Minn.; Herb, Minneapolis, Minn., and Oscar, Ogilvie, Minn., and several nieces and nephews.

Services will be Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. at Newell-Hoerling's Chapel, Centralia, with the Rev. Robert Anderson officiating. Interment will follow at Mountain View Cemetery, Centralia, under the auspices of World War I Barrack 184.

The Yakima men are Robert Cecil Beal, Toppenish, and Eugene W. Snyder, Rimrock. Otto F. Schultz of Ellensburg is the only other man from this section of the state who was aboard. Others enlisting from here with the 20th engineers are in companies which were not on the Tuscania.

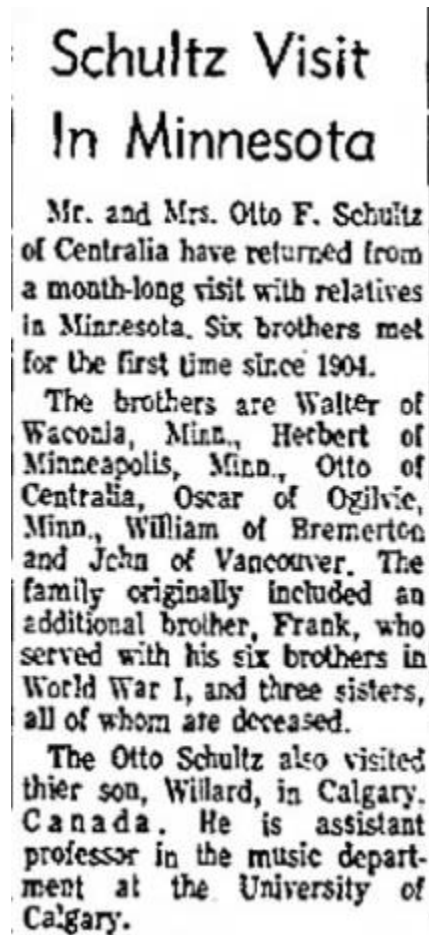

She was born June 19, 1897, to John and Susanna Nett, a German immigrant family of Chewelah.

She married Otto Schultz on Dec. 4, 1922, in Vancouver, Wash. They settled in Centralia on a dairy farm in 1944 and retired there in 1968.

Mrs. Schultz is survived by her son, Williard Schultz, Seattle; several nieces and nephews, grand nieces and nephews and four cousins.

Mrs. Schultz was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church, Centralia.

Master Teacher and co - founder of Seattle Young Artists Music Festival Association

Willard Schultz loved life, his work, and most of all his students. He was a gifted piano teacher who impacted many people over the long span of his very productive life. Wherever he went, he was loved by his colleagues and his students alike.

Willard was born on August 6, 1926 and grew up in Eastern Washington. At the age of 18 he joined the United States Navy and served on a ship in the Pacific during the end of World War II. When his ship was in port and his fellow sailors were out partying, Willard would look for a fancy hotel with a quality grand piano in the lobby and indulge his love of music and playing the piano, while attracting a crowd of the hotel guests. Willard's career carried him to many interesting places.

At various times he taught at the University of Calgary in Calgary, Alberta, Canada; at the Wuhan Conservatory of Music in Wuhan China; at Washington State University in Pullman, Washington; at Banff Center for the Performing Arts in Banff, Alberta, Canada; and at the Adamant Summer School for Pianists in Adamant, Vermont. He also gave presentations at many music conferences, including in London, England; Canberra, Australia; and the Czech Republic. He was also a Fulbright scholar in the Nordwestdeutsche Musik Akademie in Detmold, Germany.

Over his career, he became proficient in both the Chinese and German languages. Wherever Willard went he made numerous friends. He kept meticulous records of people he met and made sure to always keep in close contact with the people he loved. Willard was a single man who made his students his family. Many of his students have continued on to distinguished careers in the field of piano music, both as performers and teachers, including many with careers as University Professors.

Willard maintained an active piano studio in Seattle, Washington up until the day he collapsed in his home on January 13 of this year. He was never able to return to his home, and after spending time in various hospitals and recovery centers, he spent the last days of his life at Ida Culver House Ravenna in Seattle. Even in the few weeks he spent at Ida Culver, Willard made new friends who were sorry to see his life end on April 23, 2022.

Area Pianist Is Fulbright Study Winner

Willard Schultz, young musician formerly of the Spokane area, has been notified by the secretary of state that he has won a Fulbright award. It will entitle him to a year's study in piano at the Nord-westdeutsch Musik akademie in Detmold, Germany. He will sail September 4. The award, made under the Fulbright act, is part of the educational exchange program of the United States.

Schultz, whose parents are Mr. and Mrs. Otto Schultz now of Centralia, Wash., spent his early years in Chewelah, Wash. He had

his basic piano training with Miss Mary I. Short, who paved the way for his acceptance at the Cosmopolitan School of Music in Chicago.

He had four years' study there under the G. I. bill of rights after serving in the navy during and after World war II. His training in Chicago was with Clarence Eidam, president of the Cosmopolitan school. He received a bachelor of music degree there and a master of music degree in 1951 from Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N. Y. His teacher there was the Cuban pianist, Jose Echantez.

For the last two years he has been teaching in Chicago and continuing his study with Eidam. He has given recitals in Chicago, Rochester and on the west coast and has been soloist with the Cosmopolitan school orchestra.

Seattle Pianist Presents Concert

Willard Schultz, concert pianist and teacher, was presented in concert Monday at the Chehalis Bethel Assembly by the Lewis County branch of the American Association of University Women. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Schultz of Centralia.

Delighting the audience with his informal discussion of program selections, Mr. Schultz presented the music of Gabriel Faure, a contemporary French composer; Frederick Chopin; Wolfgang Mozart and Robert Schumann.

A bachelor, the young pianist lives in Seattle with a pet cat named Mozart, and between concert tours gives instruction in piano. He travels to Chehalis

once a month to give lessons to Douglas Forsyth, son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Forsyth; Ann Vander Stoep, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Vander Stoep; Lorin Garlicks, son of the Rev. and Mrs. Richard Garlicks, and Diane Dugaw, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. W. J. Dugaw, Toledo.

Willard Schultz became interested in the piano as a youngster in Chewelah, Wash., his home town. He taught himself to play and was 11 years old when his first lessons began.

Graduating from high school at 17, his enlistment in the Navy postponed further music training.

Four years at school in Chicago after his military service

and a master's degree in music from the University of Rochester New York led him to Germany for two years of study on a Fulbright scholarship.

Willard Schultz appeared in Chehalis two years ago when he was on tour as accompanist to the Japanese soprano, Teruko Uruguchi. In addition to his private teaching he is accompanist to Raymond Davis, concert celloist, and the last three summers has taught at the University of British Columbia.

Mr. and Mrs. Vander Stoep of Chehalis entertained with a reception for Mr. Schultz following his Monday concert.

Willard Schultz Piano Concert Set

Mr. Willard Shultz, concert pianist, will be presented in recital Sunday at 2 p.m. in the Bethel Assembly church, Chehalis, by the American Association of University Women.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Schultz of Centralia, Mr. Schultz is a graduate of the University of Chicago with a master's degree in music from the University of Rochester. He teaches piano at the Cornish School in Seattle.

His recent concerts include those at Cornish in October, at the Banff School of Fine Arts in August and spring appearances for the Community Concerts in California at which time he appeared with Raymond Davis, principal cellist of the Seattle Symphony orchestra. Mr. Schultz also served as adjudicator for the Duncan, B. C. and Spokane Music Festivals last spring and is scheduled for three more judgments in Canada early next year.

For his concert he will play a group of Spanish music from the 18th century, made up entirely of Spanish dance rhythms and ornamentation. Composers include Antonio Soler and Manuel Albeniz. Soler was a priest at Montserrat whose tremendous

volume of compositions were discovered in the last 20 years by an American, Frederick Marvin. In the first sonata to be played by Mr. Schultz are found the rhythm of the Fandango.

The Fandango has no form, only a variation idea, like improvisation using the hypnotic Flamenco guitar and castanet rhythms.

Other music to be played by Mr. Schultz on Sunday will be Beethoven, Brahms, Ravel and Chopin's Nocturne in C sharp minor.

Following his concert, Mr. Schultz will be guest of honor at a reception hosted by Mr. and Mrs. James Vander Stoep of Chehalis.

A former Twin City resident, Mr. Willard Schultz, now of Seattle, will be presented in a public piano concert at the Bethel Assembly of God Church, Chehalis, Monday at 8:15 p.m.

The concert is being sponsored by the Lewis County Branch of the American Association of University Women. The group has presented Mr. Schultz twice before in public concert.

Mr. Schultz studied music with Clarence Eldam in Chicago, with Jose Echaniz at the University of Rochester, and in Germany on a Fulbright scholarship. He appeared in the Twin Cities four years ago as accompanist to Teruko Uruguchi, Japanese soprano, and has appeared with her in joint recital in Japan.

The program will include "Phantasie in C Minor, K. 396" by Mozart; "Sonata in A Minor, Op. 143" by Schubert; and "Etudes Symphoniques" by Schumann. The three Chopin numbers chosen for the program are "Berceuse", "Mazurka, Op. 24, No. 4", and "Etude, Op. 25, No. 5".

Mrs. James Vander Sloep, Chehalis, is in charge of arrangements for the program.
