DeWitt S. Schwartz

A memorial service for DeWitt S. Schwartz, 70, of Windswept Farm, Blakely Rd., East Aurora, was held at 2:30 this afternoon in the First Presbyterian Church, Paine St., East Aurora.

Mr. Schwartz, a retired executive of the Chevrolet Division of General Motors Corp., died Tuesday (Dec. 8, 1964) in the Buffalo Veterans Hospital.

A veteran of 35 years with Chevrolet, Mr. Schwartz began his employment with the company in 1919 as assistant business manager of the St. Louis zone office.

Later he was business manager of the Denver zone office and also worked in the Harrisburg, Pa., zone office before coming to Buffalo in 1935 as regional business manager.

After six years here, he transferred to the Baltimore zone office as regional business manager and returned to Buffalo in 1946 to serve as assistant zone manager until retirement in 1954.

Since then, he has worked as bookkeeper and credit manager for Clements-Gillogly Chevrolet Inc., West Seneca.

A native of St. Louis, he was graduated from Washington University there and served in the Army during World War I. In the 1930s he was a deacon of the First Presbyterian Church of Buffalo.

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of East Aurora, the East Aurora Country Club, American Legion Post 362 of East Aurora, Blazing Star Lodge 694, F&AM, East Aurora, and was a past secretary of the General Motors Club of the Buffalo area.

He is survived by his wife, the former Mary R. Talmadge; two daughters, Mrs. James F. Albert of Buffalo and Mrs. Gordon F. Wepfer of Dayton, O., and five grandchildren.

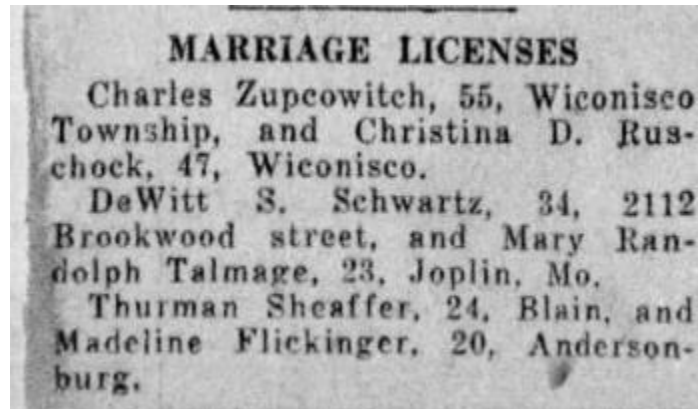

MOTORCYCLIST HITS BOY, LATER STRIKES AN AUTO

LaVergne Schwartz, 5560 Cates avenue, had two motorcycle accidents in the course of a few hours yesterday, one of which resulted in his arrest on a charge of careless driving and the other which resulted in injury to himself and damage to his machine.

Schwartz was riding north on Thirteenth street, when he ran into Millard Able, 14 years old, 1114 St. Ange avenue, who was riding on a bicycle. The Able boy suffered contusions of the head, chest and shoulders. Schwartz was arrested on a charge of careless driving and was released on bond.

Starting out from police headquarters on his machine, Schwartz later crashed into an automobile of Myron Sturdevant, 5591 W. Arman avenue, at Grand avenue and Lindbergh boulevard, while Sturdevant was waiting in his machine for a street car to pass.

Schwartz's machine was damaged \$25, and he was slightly bruised.
