DEATH SAT AT THE WHEEL

**Bicycle Policeman horrified to find
Driver of the Car he was chasing,
stone dead.**

New York, July 15.—Bicycle Policeman Carty saw an automobile with two men in it flash past him on Ocean parkway late last night and ordered the driver to slow down. When no attention was paid to the order he leaped on his wheel and gave chase. After a pursuit of many blocks and when the automobile had almost reached Coney Island he overtook it.

"You are under arrest," he said to the man sitting at the wheel. There was no response.

Carty climbed into the automobile and found the driver was dead. The other man in the machine was John D. Lord of Jamaica, L. I. He managed to bring the automobile to a stop. The driver of the car, who had died during the chase, was Stephen W. Anderson of Brooklyn. He purchased the car he was driving earlier in the day and this was the first time it had been out.

DIES AT THE WHEEL OF SPEEDING AUTO

A miraculous escape from death was experienced yesterday by John B. Lord, of Jamaica, and Lillian Cohen, of 577 Classon avenue, when the owner and driver of the automobile in which they were riding fell dead at the wheel. The machine was speeding along the Ocean Parkway at such a clip that Policeman Carty decided to intercept it. The owner, Stephen W. Anderson, 24 years old, of 257 State street, apparently ignored his signals and sped past the bluecoat.

Lord, fearing that his friend was becoming reckless, as the ocean wall was but a few blocks away, leaned over and touched him on the shoulder, but received no response. A second glance at Anderson's face, which was ghastly pale, told him something was wrong. He jumped into the front seat and stopped the car within but a short distance of the ocean wall.

The "cop" soon reached the spot, and a call for an ambulance brought Ambulance Surgeon Michaelis, of the Reception Hospital. He pronounced Anderson dead of heart disease.

DEAD AT RACING AUTO WHEEL.

Anderson, Chased by Brooklyn Policeman, Died in His Car.

Stephen W. Anderson, 237 State Street, Brooklyn, bought a racing car recently, and last night invited Miss Lillian Cohen of 577 Classon Avenue and John D. Lord of 29 Washington Street, Jamaica, to accompany him on a spin while he tried out the machine. With the young woman seated beside him and Lord occupying a seat on the rear deck of the car, Anderson drove down Ocean Parkway.

Anderson was driving the car at close to thirty miles an hour. Lord had all he could do to cling to his shaky perch, and when he saw Mounted Policeman Carty motion to Anderson to stop and the driver did not reduce speed, Lord tapped Anderson on the shoulder and shouted in his ear:

"There's a cop after you! You'd better slow up."

Anderson was hunched over his steering wheel, and paid no attention to Lord. Then the latter noticed for the first time that blood was dripping from Anderson's mouth. He shouted to him again, and then realizing that he was unconscious he climbed over the back of the seat and stopped the car just as Carty dashed up.

The two men found that Anderson could not be aroused. Miss Cohen agreed to hold the man while Lord took the driver's seat and speeded to the Reception Hospital at Coney Island. The policeman tied his horse to a tree and took Lord's former place on the rear of the car. Then Lord drove at top speed to the hospital a mile or more away.

There the men carried Anderson inside, and Dr. Michaelis examined him.

"This man was dead probably when Mr. Lord discovered him bleeding," he said. "He has had a hemorrhage of the lungs."
