GEORGE E. SHAW

George E. Shaw, Route 2, Cornell, died at Luther Hospital, Saturday, Jan. 24.

He was born in Holcombe, Wis., October 16, 1898 in the wilderness which is now the Town of Holcombe. He went to school at Holcombe, Sheldon and Crane, and served for one year and eight months in World War I in the U.S. Army. He was on the ship Tuscania on February 5, 1918 when it was torpedoed and sunk.

On July 7, 1922 he was married to Myra Nicolai, and she preceded him in death on June 8, 1965. Mr. Shaw worked at the Cornell Wood Products in Cornell for 15 years, and served as postmaster at Cornell for seven years before retiring in March of 1967.

He is survived by one brother, Erwin Shaw.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday 1:30 p.m. at the Cornell Funeral Home, with the Rev. Gary Simpson officiating.

Friends may call after 7 p.m. Monday at the funeral home. Burial will be made at a later date in the Holcombe Protestant Cemetery.

CORNELL — George E. Shaw, 77, Rt. 2, died Saturday at Luther Hospital, Eau Claire.

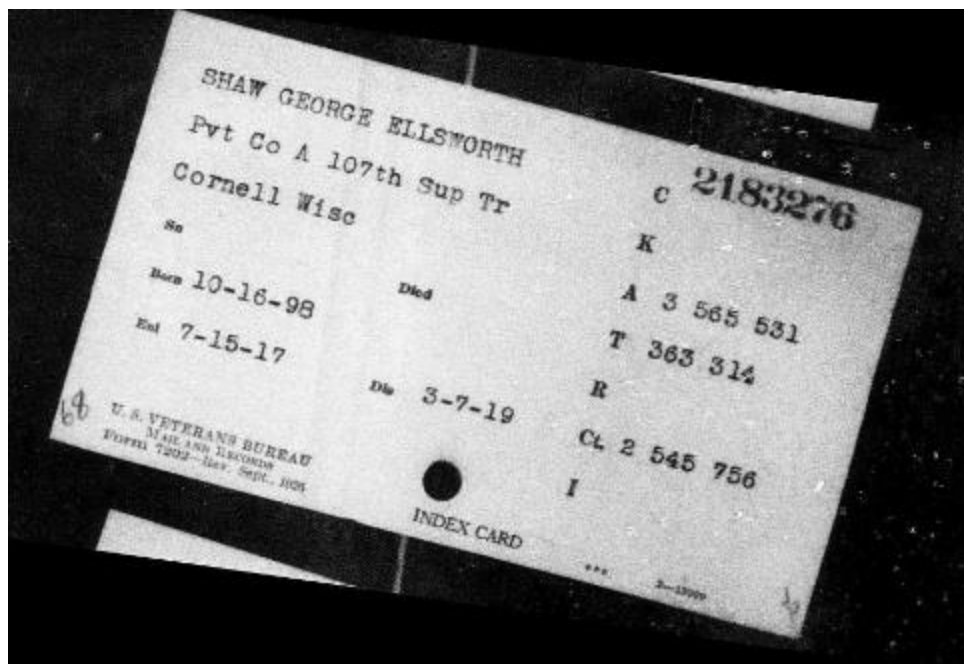

Robber Given Prison Term at Chippewa

CHIPPEWA FALLS (Special) — Robert Murphy, 18, Milwaukee, confessed robber of a rural Cornell tavern, was sentenced to serve one to 10 years at Waupun State Prison here Monday morning.

Murphy had pleaded guilty to the Nov. 2 robbery upon appearance before County Judge Orrin Larrabee on Nov. 4, and a pre-sentence examination had been ordered.

Two men arrested with Murphy after a high-speed chase near Wisconsin Rapids are awaiting trial in circuit court here. Both have pleaded innocent.

Thomas Venne, 19, Milwaukee, has been released on \$5,000 bond and James Dornbrook, 31, also of Milwaukee, is being held in the county jail here in lieu of \$10,000 bond.

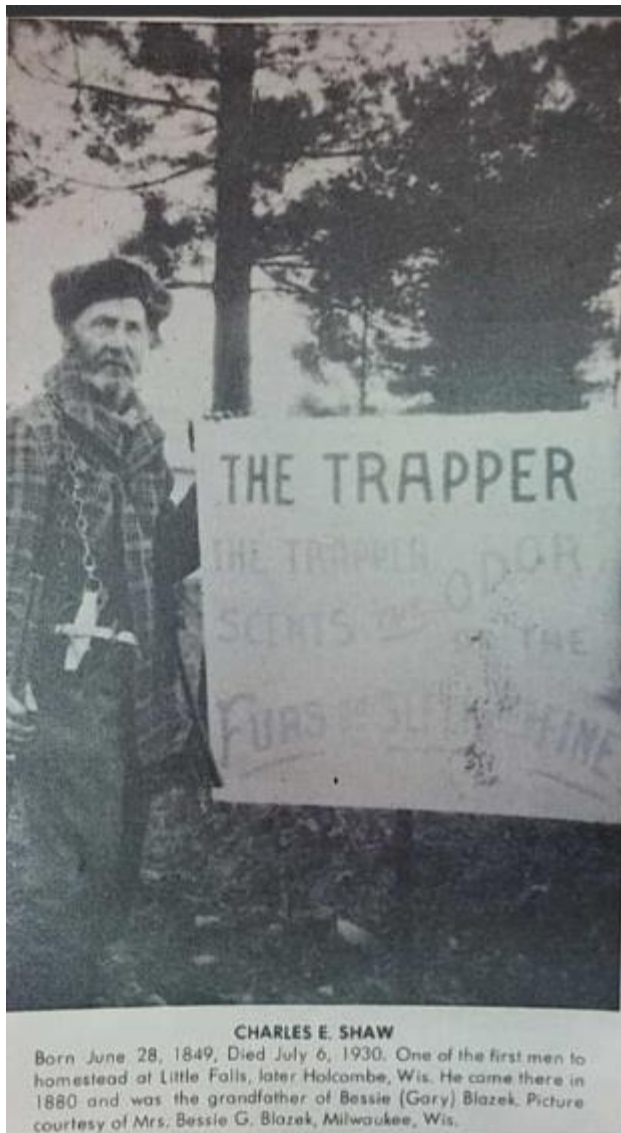
The trio was captured after the pickup truck in which they were riding went out of control and crashed while a police car was in pursuit. The truck, it was reported, contained "an arsenal" of guns but no resistance was offered.

George E. Shaw, Cornell area tavernkeeper, said that he, his wife, and a 13-year-old boy visiting at his home were tied up by robbers who stole about \$100 and four guns.

District Attorney Eugene Jackson had asked for a 20-year sentence for Murphy.

CHARLES E. SHAW.

Last rites for Charles E. Shaw, town of Holcombe's first white settler, were performed this week at the Holcombe Methodist church with interment in the cemetery at that place. Mr. Shaw, who was 81 years old, was born at Tippicanoe, Ind., June 28, 1849.

He came to Little Falls, now Holcombe, in 1880, and located on a homestead, which he cleared and cultivated and made his home. At that time the town of Holcombe was wilderness with no other inhabitants but Indians. Lumber companies were operating in the pine region north of there and the population of the town was comprised of river drivers who camped along the shores of the river. To them he was well known.

In 1884 Mr. Shaw was united in marriage to Esther A. Chamberlin of Delton, Sauk county, who survives with five children as follows: Albert L. Shaw of Shenandoah, Elmer Shaw of St. Paul, George E. Shaw of Cornell, Ervin Shaw of Holcombe and Mrs. J. A. Gray of Arnold.

Pallbearers at the funeral were Eugene JuVette, Thad. Loiselle, Fred Loiselle, K. C. Ecker, Otto Schmid-ders and O. Dehler. During the services, conducted by Rev. McEathron, Mrs. R. L. Cleaves rendered vocal selections with Mrs. A. Lotz as accompanist.

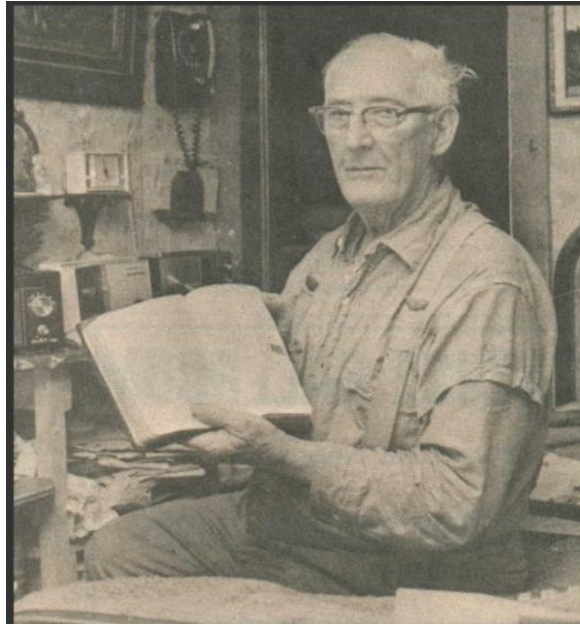

WORD OF DEATH

Funeral services for Albert L. Shaw, age 90 and formerly of the Chippewa Falls area, were held October 17 in Iowa. Mr. Shaw passed away October 15 at the Good Samaritan Home at Tabor, Iowa.

Mr. Shaw was born at Drywood, Wis., February 21, 1885 to Charles E. and Esther A. Shaw. In 1886 the family moved to what was called Little Falls and later named Holcombe. They lived on a homestead there where he attended the Russlow School and later did photography work. He also worked in lumber camps. On July 8, 1914 he married Esther P. Johnson at Chippewa Falls. They moved to Shenandoah, Iowa in September of 1921. Mrs. Shaw preceded him in death at Clarinda, Iowa. Several years ago Mr. Shaw became a resident of the Good Samaritan Home at Tabor, Iowa.

He is survived by three daughters, Irene, Margaret and Maralyn; two brothers, George E. Shaw of Cornell, Wis., and Erwin C. Shaw of Bartlesville, Okla., several grandchildren and great grandchildren; also nices and nephews, among them Mrs. Gary (Bessie) Blazek of Wadena; Minn., Mrs. Margaret Gary of St. Paul, Minn., and Mrs. Gary (Marion) Lyon of Hayward, Wis.; and his sister-in-law, Mrs. Elmer Shaw of St. Paul, Minn.

He was preceded in death by three brothers, Robert, Fred and Elmer, and three sisters, Lucy, Belle and Nettie.

Burial was made in a Shenandoah; Iowa cemetery.

Last rites for Laura Isabelle Gary of Washburn, Wisconsin were held at the Bralley Funeral Chapel at Washburn, with interment in the Holcombe Cemetery. She was born in Little Falls, now Holcombe, Wisconsin on March 6, 1888 on a homestead which her father, Charles E. Shaw, cleared and cultivated at the time Holcombe was a wilderness and had no other inhabitants but Indians, he being the first white settler to homestead in the area.

On April 29, 1911, she was united in marriage to James A. Gary at Moorhead, Minnesota, who survives with six children as follows: Bessie Grace (Blazek) of Milwaukee, James, Jr., of Bayfield, Margaret Belle, of St. Paul, Minn., Marian Laura (Lyon) of Hayward, Catherine Louise (Carlson) of Milwaukee and George Ellsworth of Tomah. She is also survived by four brothers, George of Cornell, Erwin of Bartlesville, Okla., Albert of Shenandoah, Ia., and Elmer of St. Paul, Minn. Also thirteen grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Relatives from out of town attending the services were all of her children and grandchildren, one great-grandchild; Mr. and Mrs. Henry LaBrec and Mrs. Robert Rose of Chippewa Falls. ELMER CHARLES SHAW

Elmer C. Shaw, 75, passed away October 18 at the Crosby, Minnesota, Hospital after a lingering illness.

Mr. Shaw was born December 15, 1893, at Little Falls, Wisconsin, (later called Holcombe). His parents were Charles E. and Esther Almyra (nee Chamberlain) Shaw. He grew to manhood in Holcombe and attended school there and at Northland College at Ashland. He served in World War I in the U.S. Army in Germany. He later taught school in Chippewa and Pierce Counties. On the eighth of September, 1920, he married Nina Smith of Spring Valley-Elmwood, Wisconsin, and they later moved to Holcombe and then to St. Paul, Minnesota, where they lived until six years ago when they retired and moved to Crosby, Minnesota.

Besides his wife, Nina, who survives him they have a daughter, Mrs. Sheldon (Arlene) Menier of St. Paul; one grandson, Bruce; one grand-daughter, Dawn Menier; and a great grand-daughter; three brothers, Albert Shaw of Shenandoah, Iowa, George Shaw of Cornell, and Erwin Shaw of Bartlesville, Oklahoma; also many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Robert in 1912 and Freddie in infancy; three sisters, Lucy as an infant, Nettie in 1922, and Mrs. James A. (Laura Belle) Gary in 1964. His father, Charles E. Shaw, was one of the first white settlers at Little Falls (Holcombe).

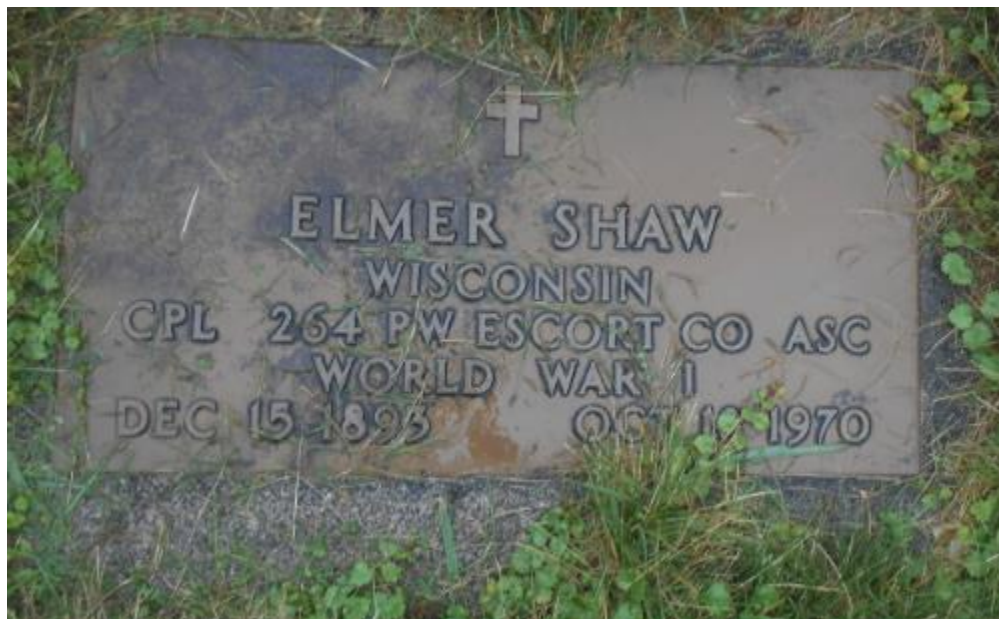

Erwin Charles Shaw, formerly of Lake Holcombe, died Monday, Dec. 24, 1990, at Forrest Manor Nursing Home in Dewey, Okla.

He was born on April 21, 1900, in Holcombe to Esther Almira and Charles Elmer Shaw at the family homestead. He attended grade school in Holcombe, and Chippewa Falls Senior High School.

He farmed the homestead after the death of his father in 1931. He also worked at the Cornell paper mill before moving to Bartlesville, Okla., where he was employed at Phillips Ranch.

Survivors include four nieces, Bessie Blazek of Wadena, Minn.,

Margaret Gary of St. Paul, Minn., Marion Lyon of Hayward, and Catherine Reith of Milwaukee; two nephews, James Gary of Bayfield, and George of St. Cloud, Minn.

He was preceded in death by his parents; five brothers, Robert, Albert, Elmer, George, and Freddie in infancy; three sisters, Nettie Shaw, Laura Gary, and Lucy in infancy.
