The United States grand jury at Winona, Minn., returned indictments against Conrad C. Miller for embezzlement of registered letters; Mathias Egger, for assaulting a letter carrier; George M. Felt and James Downing, burglarizing a postoffice; Louis C. Kittleson, for raising a postal note. Fred W. Smith was found guilty of violation of the postal laws. Miller and Kittleson pleaded guilty and Felt pleaded not guilty. George Shook and Andrew Shook, indicted for cutting timber on government land, were tried and discharged.

"Minneapolis (MN) Daily Times" Thursday 5 Jun 1890 p 1

Sheriff Spaulding, Chief of Police Barron and Judge Chipfield, of Brainerd, were in the city this morning, with five prisoners who had been sentenced to Stillwater from Crow Wing county during the recent term of district court. They came down on the Little Falls & Dakota, expecting to make connections with the train that should leave here at 8:43, but the latter was several hours late. The prisoners were:

James McCloskey, larceny, two years, John Willet, attempted rape, three years; Andrew Shook, larceny, nine months; Henry McGraw, robbery in the second degree, three years; Phillip Howard, robbery in the third degree, two years.

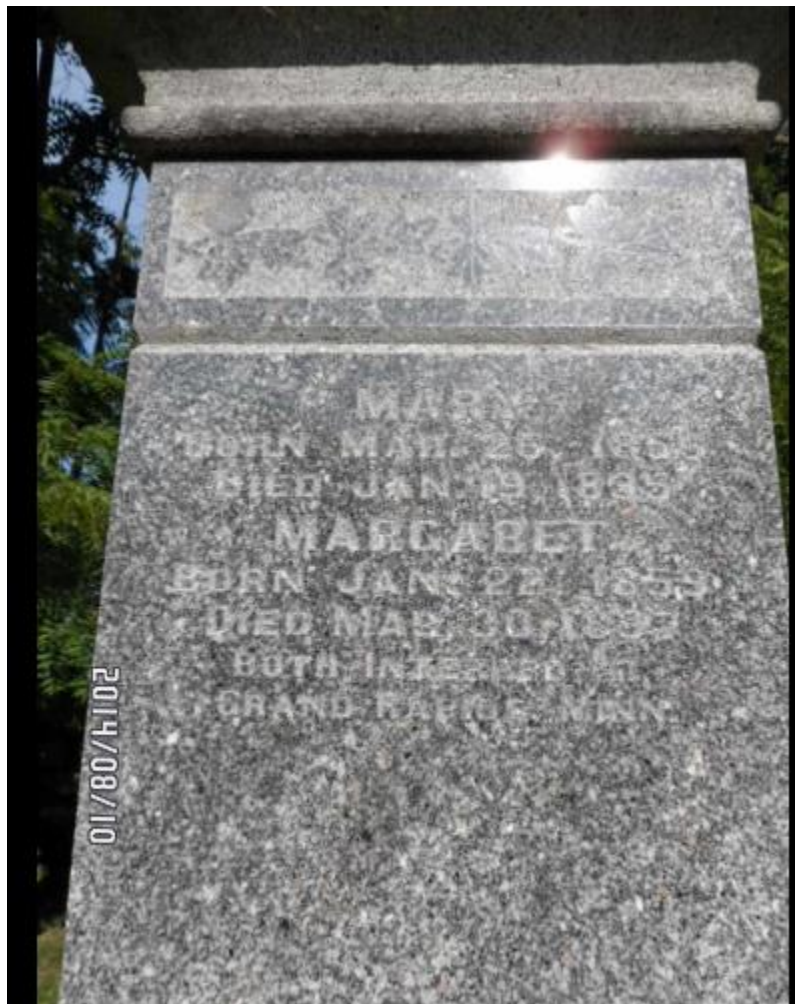

The Shook House

Steamboat captain Andrew Shook and his wife, Mary, built a fine clapboard house in the centre of Grand Rapids, but lived there only three years (Andrew died in 1893 and Mary in 1895). Ten years later, the house was purchased by State Senator Daniel Gunn by tax default and underwent a major remodeling. In March 1919, Frank and Ethel Gumm purchased it as their first family home. Ethel organized community shows and school plays, while Frank led the Episcopal Church choir and was a reporter for the Itasca County Independent newspaper. Frank also owned a part interest in the New Grand Theatre, where the family performed vaudeville acts between silent films. The youngest of the Gumm's three daughter Frances was born in the Shook House in 1922. In 1927, Baby Frances moved with her mother to Hollywood, where her name was changed to Judy Garland. Today, the Shook house has been lovingly restored to appear as it did when the Gumms lived here in the 1920s.

The Fawn

Andrew Shook was the captain of the Mississippi Steamboat, the Fawn (1882 - 1892) making the winding trip from Grand Rapids to Aitken and back in one week. After Andrew's death, the Fawn was used by Weyerhaeuser Co. to tow logs and break log jams. In 1894 it struck a snag below Swan River and sank. Dimensions: L - 85' W - 14' D - 3'

Judy's Life

Born on June 10th, 1922, as Frances Ethel Gumm at the Itasca Hospital in Grand Rapids, Minnesota.



In 1924

Baby Frances joined her sisters in a first song-and-dance routine performed at the Itasca Mercantile, located at the corner of Hwys 169 & 2, "When My Sugar Walks Down the Street." Her first solo was "Jingle Bells" performed in a white net dress created by her mother at her father's Grand Theater located on South Pokegama avenue next to the old Rialto Theater. Judy performed throughout North East and North Central Minnesota from 1924-1926.



In 1934

Comedian and emcee George Jessel suggested that she and her sisters change their last name to something more theatrical; he recommended Garland. "One year later, 1935, "Frances Garland" changed her first name to Judy, after the popular song ("Judy"), to become Judy Garland.



In 1939 - 1940

The release of "The Wizard of Oz" caused a national sensation. Judy received a special Academy Award Juvenile Oscar for "The Wizard of Oz" in 1939. It was quickly followed into theaters by an adaptation of the Broadway hit, "Babes in Arms", costarring Garland and Rooney. The box office triumphs of Oz and Babes placed Judy among the Top Ten Box Office Stars for 1940.

Perry W. Rathbun of this city has brought an action in Duluth against relatives and friends of his wife, charging them with enticing her away from his home and attempting to alienate her affections.

The defendants named in the petition are Edward S. Shook and Thelia Shook, his wife, of Northome; Percy R. Scribner and Florence Scribner, his wife, of Northome; Charles S. Carter and Nellie Carter, his wife, of Hines, and Mae Shook of Duluth. The plaintiff asks damages of \$25,000.

The petition states that the plaintiff and his wife were married June 3, 1912, at Hines, and that he supported her and treated her as a husband should all the time he lived with her. On May 1, 1913, the petition says, the defendants maliciously enticed the wife away and have kept her away from her husband ever since.

She has become the mother of a child since leaving him, and that defendants refuse to allow him to see either his wife or child. Rathbun and his wife, according to the petition, were residing here when the separation took place.

Mrs. Rathbun is well known in Bemidji and her many friends will watch the case with interest.

CLAIMS WIFE DESERTED

Percy W. Rathbun Asks Aid Of
Duluth Police In Finding Lost
Wife And 3 Weeks Old Baby

HAS DETECTIVES ON THE CASE

Perry W. Rathbun, formerly of Bemidji, but now a traveling salesman of Duluth and who represents the Plumbing Supplies company, wants the aid of the people of Duluth and the police in his search for his wife formerly Miss Harriett Stark, and their newly born child, whom he asserts are held in hiding in Duluth by relatives.

The story by Rathbun is only partly set forth in the suit he filed against his wife's relatives in the district court of Crow Wing county several days ago as reported in the Times charging alienation of affection and asking damages of \$25,000. Mae Shook 724 East First street a nurse is named as one of the defendants.

For weeks he has had detectives

For weeks he has had detectives searching throughout northern Minnesota in an effort to locate his wife who, he says, must have given birth to a child within the last three weeks. The representatives of a Duluth detective agency, declared that Mrs. Rathbun was seen at her residence in Duluth, but when Rathbun attempted to find her she was gone.

In his complaint Rathbun declares that on May 1, 1913, while he and his wife were maintaining their home at Bemidji, her relatives "wrongfully and maliciously conspiring and contriving and intending to inure the plaintiff and to deprive him of said wife's comfort, society, aid assistance and affections willfully, wrongfully, unlawfully and maliciously induced, persuaded, assisted and enticed the said plaintiff's wife away from and to leave the plaintiff and her then home and residence with the plaintiff."

Prominent Names Mentioned

Of the defendants named are Ed. S. Shook and Thelia Shook, his wife Percy R. Scribner and Florence Scribner, his wife; Charles S. Carter and Nellie Carter, his wife; Mr. and Mrs. Shook and Mr. and Mrs. Scribner live at Northome, Koochiching county, and Mr. and Mrs. Carter live at Hines, Beltrami county, Minn., according to the complainant.

Rathbun charges the defendants to the suit have cut off communication between him and his wife and that they are now secretly harboring and detaining her against his will. He declares that the defendants had made threats that they would bring about a divorce and that he should never see either Mrs. Rathbun or the child.

Rathbun who was in Duluth last week searched through the birth statistics in the city health office but could not find any record of a birth. He said that if the birth is recorded at all it is under an assumed name. He declares that he has supplied his wife with money since she left him, but that many of the letters he wrote to her were returned to him unopened.

Nurse Cannot Be Found

Miss Shook, who has graduated as a nurse from St. Luke's hospital some time ago, has not been in Duluth for several days. It was said yesterday at the place where she lives that she is out of the city on a nursing case.

Rathbun's plea was made that if any of the citizens of Duluth know anything of the whereabouts of his wife he be notified. The police of the city worked on the case for several days, but were unable to give Rathbun any clue.

Minnesota State Senator Daniel Gunn purchased the house by tax default 10 years after Mary Shook’s death. He sold it to Francis Avent Gumm & his wife, Ethel Marion Milne Gumm, in Mar 1919. Their daughter, Frances Ethel Gumm, was born 10 Jun 1922 in the Itasca Hospital in Grand Rapids, Itasca MN. In 1934, comedian George Jessel suggested Frances and her 2 sisters known as the Gumm Sisters change their surname to Garland & in 1935 Frances changed her 1st name to Judy – becoming better known as movie star & singer, Judy Garland. The Shook/Gunn/Gumm house is now part of the Judy Garland Museum in Grand Rapids, Itasca MN.
