Former ASHP president Milton W. Skolaut of Durham, North Carolina, died February 22 at the age of 84.

Born in San Antonio, Texas, Skolaut earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Texas College of Pharmacy in 1941. He completed an internship at the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, and began his career in institutional pharmacy by serving for four years as the director of pharmacy at University Hospital in Baltimore.

Skolaut in 1952 became director of pharmacy services at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Center in Bethesda, Maryland, a position he would hold for 17 years. While at the clinical center, Skolaut established the pharmacy as the central supply point for drug distribution, a relatively new concept at the time but one that quickly became the norm for hospitals nationwide.

Other innovations Skolaut pioneered at the clinical center's pharmacy included the establishment of centralized radiopharmacy and i.v. additive services.

DURHAM - Milton Wilbert Skolaut, age 84, of The Forest at Duke, died Tuesday, February 22, 2005.

A native of San Antonio, Texas, he was born October 3, 1920, to Irma Anna Heidrich and Albert Joseph Skolaut Jr. Mr. Skolaut received his B.S. degree in Pharmacy from the University of Texas, interned at the John Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Md., and did graduate work at the University of Maryland.

Early in his career, Mr. Skolaut served as Director of Pharmacy at the University Hospital, Baltimore, Md., and Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy. Then he entered the United States Public Health Service and became Director of Pharmacy Services at its hospital on Staten Island, N.Y. In 1952, Mr. Skolaut became Chief of the Pharmacy Department and Central Supply of its Clinical Center at the National

Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Md. In 1969, after 20 years, he retired from USPHS as a commissioned officer with the rank of Captain (O6).

Next, he moved to Durham, where for 18 years he was Director of the Department of Pharmacy at Duke University Hospital, retiring in 1987. He was also Adjunct Assistant Professor at the University of North Carolina School of Pharmacy.

For 25 years he served on the Board of the American Society of Hospital Pharmacists, including the offices of Vice-President, President and Treasurer. He received numerous awards and honors, including the American Pharmaceutical Association Military Section's Literary Award; the Andrew Craigie Award of the Association of Military Surgeons of the U.S.; the Don Blanton Award of the N.C. Pharmaceutical Association, and the Harvey A.K. Whitney Award of the American Society of Hospital Pharmacists. He was named Hospital Pharmacist of the Year of the N.C. Society of Hospital Pharmacists.

Besides authoring numerous professional articles, he served as Consul to Project Hope and made 14 trips to Poland, plus others to Swaziland, Grenada, Malawi, and the Soviet Union. For pleasure, he and his wife traveled extensively in 11 European countries and made numerous trips (210,000 miles) in motor homes through every U.S. state except Hawaii, all Canadian provinces except Newfoundland, and 3600 miles in Mexico. At home he volunteered many hours at the Duke Children's Classic.

After moving to The Forest at Duke retirement community when it opened in 1992, he remained active in numerous projects there, including chairing the Greenhouse and the Health Services Committees, assisting in compiling two pictorial directories, and giving many slide shows for the monthly Armchair Travel and

Monthly Armchair Travel and

AAA Travel programs.

Surviving are his wife of 39 years, Rheta Leverett Skolaut; son Milton W. Skolaut Jr., of Newport News, Va.; daughter Barbara A. Skolaut, of Richmond, Va.; niece, Karen Lee Schindler (Mrs. John J. Morning); nephew, William Gordon Schindler; three grand-nieces and one grand-nephew.

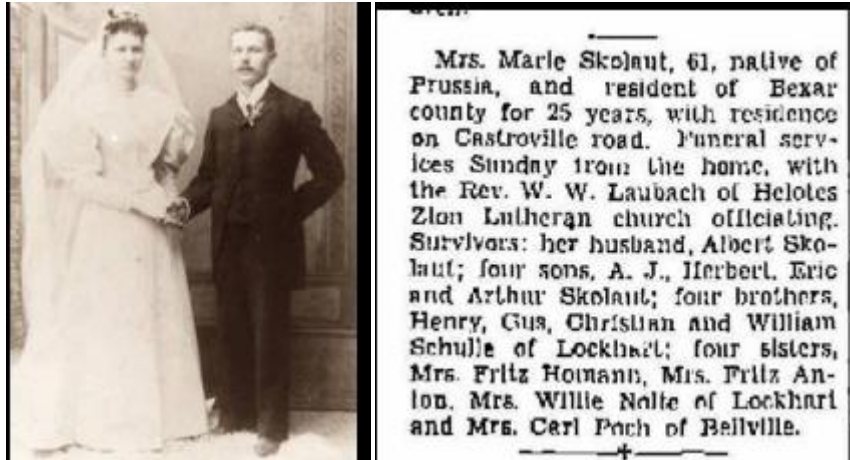

Anna Marie Schulle Anton was the daughter of Christian Friedrich Schulle & Dorteia Elisabeth Bunke, as was Arthur Skolaut's mother Marie Schulle Skolaut, so Arthur & his wife Hulda were first cousins. – Arthur & Hulda married 6 Apr 1927 in Lockhart, Caldwell TX. According to his TX death certificate, he is buried in Roselawn Memorial Park This cemetery is also known as Roselawn Cemetery & is listed on Find A Grave as San Fernando Cemetery #3, San Antonio, Bexar TX, where Arthur's parents are buried. He is not on Find A Grave as of 2 Dec 2022.
