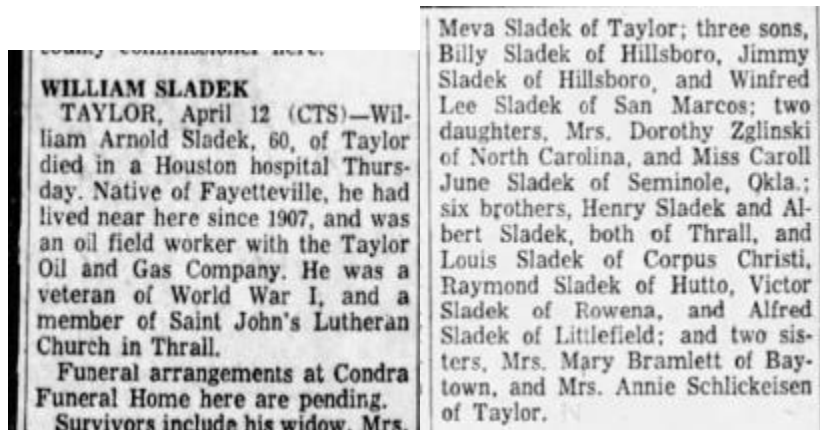

CORP. W. A. SLADEK ON THE TUSCANIA

A Taylor Lad on That Ill-Fated
Transport When It Was Tor-
pedoed February 5.

Under date of December 10, Miss Anna Sladek of this community is in receipt of a letter from her brother, Corporal William A. Sladek, of Company L, 165th Infantry, with the American Expeditionary Forces somewhere in France." William writes as follows to his sister:

"I will tell you something of my army life. When we left the States we sailed from Hoboken on January 14th on the Tuscania, and off the Irish coast on February 5th we were torpedoed about 5:45 o'clock, in the afternoon. I stayed on the boat for two hours and thirty minutes after she was torpedoed, and in two hours and forty-five minutes after being struck she sank, so we didn't have much time to save our lives. We landed in Ireland February 6th at 3 p. m.; stayed over in Ireland five days and then went to England, where we stayed seven weeks and didn't do a thing but write letters, but since that time things have changed. I don't worry about anything at all now, and am glad of it, too.

"We arrived safely in France on March 27th. The first time I went to the trenches was on July 5th at the Champagne front. We were at the Champagne front fourteen days and were then transferred to Chateau Thierry on offense work. We drove the Germans about three miles but had some rough dealing over here, but I came out without a scratch. We then went to the St. Mihiel front, close to Metz, where we chased the Germans over twelve miles in three days and captured fifteen thousand prisoners. Some good work—wasn't it? From Metz we went to Verdun and made a drive over there. Just before the armistice was signed we were at the front again. We chased Germans over fourteen miles and when the armistice was signed let me tell you I was a happy soldier. From this front we started to Germany, stopping a few days in Belgium, and now we are in Germany. They sure treat us nice over here. We talked to many Germans who were at the same front we were and at the same time. One of them told a friend of mine that when we charged he went too fast to be captured."

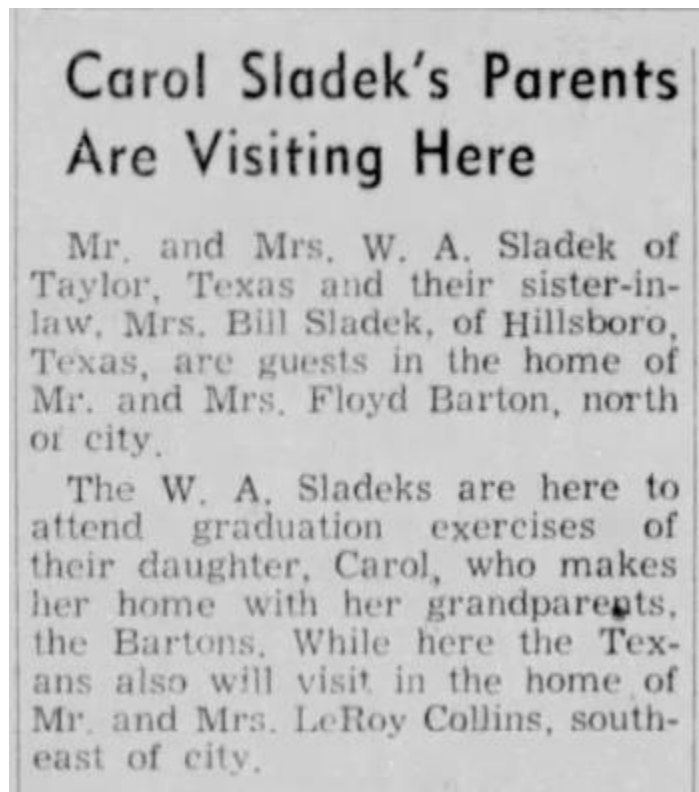

"Fort Worth (TX) Star-Telegram" Saturday 9 Feb 1918 p 8 – among the Texans on board Tuscania: W.A. Sladek of Taylor TX

"Taylor [TX] Daily Press" 13 Jan 1919 p 2 - letter dated 10 Dec 1918 from Cpl. Sladek, Co. L, 165th Inf., to his sister Miss Anna Sladek of Taylor. His ship was torpedoed at 5:45 p.m. on 5 Feb 1918. He was on the ship for 2 hours & 30 minutes – and it sank at 2 hours & 45 minutes so "didn't have much time to save our lives." He landed 6 Feb 1918 at 3 a.m. in Ireland, where he stayed 5 days, then went to England for 7 weeks, where he only wrote letters. All has changed - "I don't worry about anything at all now, and am glad of it, too" – was in France 27 Mar 1918 & in trenches 5 Jul 1918 at Champagne for 14 days, then went to Chateau Thierry (where he got not a scratch), then St. Mihiel, then Verdun. And "when the armistice was signed let me tell you I was a happy soldier." He then went to Belgium, then Germany where he was treated nicely.
