R. E. Dayton Dies at 73

Rollin E. Dayton Sr., 73, resident of Taylor County since 1914, died at 5:30 a.m. Sunday in Hendrick Memorial Hospital.

He had been a patient there for about a week after suffering a heart attack at his Potosi community farm home, where he had lived since 1944.

Born Aug. 5, 1889 in McClellan County, he was a veteran of World War I. He enlisted in the Army in 1917, and re-enlisted in the Army following his discharge in 1919. He served in Germany during the occupation.

Mr. Dayton married Blanche Clements in Abilene in 1920. He was a member of the Potosi Methodist Church, the Abilene Masonic Lodge and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Funeral will be held Tuesday at 2 p.m. in Elliott's Chapel of Memories. Officiating will be the Rev. Bill Alexander, pastor of Potosi Methodist Church, assisted by the Rev. Biddy Wrinkle, pastor of Potosi Baptist Church, and two former pastors of the Baptist church, M. F. Richardson and Thomas Hall, now pastor at Fluvanna. Burial will be in the Potosi Cemetery.

Survivors include his wife; one son, R. E. Dayton Jr. of Merkel; four sisters, Mrs. Maple Kennedy of Rt. 4, Abilene, Mrs. Georgia Hardee of Freeport, Mrs. Jewel Satterfield of Las Vegas, Nev., and Mrs. Bessie Proctor of Channel View, Tex.; one brother, F. It was about 8:30 when they boarded the coach that had been set aside for them in their trip to San Antonio where they will enter first training. The roll was called to see that full quota of 59 were present, and it looked it every bit by the way the car was filled to one standing with the big crowd that thronged the depot to witness their leaving.

Heretofore they had been leaving singly and in small bunches but never before equal with this that brings the war a little nearer home to every one. Yesterday and last evening was given pretty much to their entertainment and the lawn was full of people from far and near coming to do them honor.

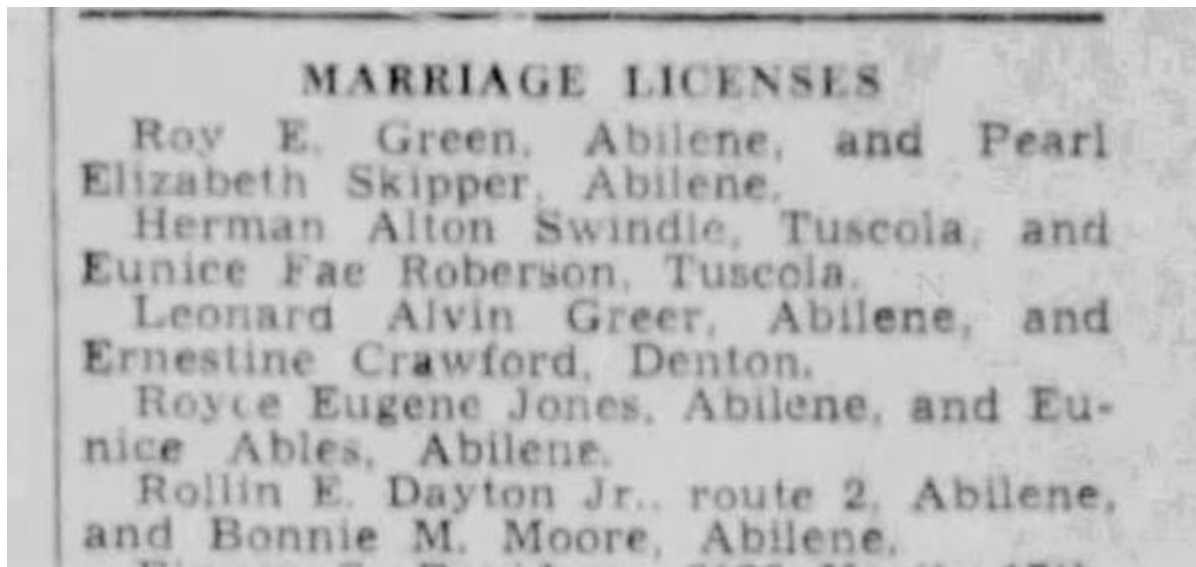

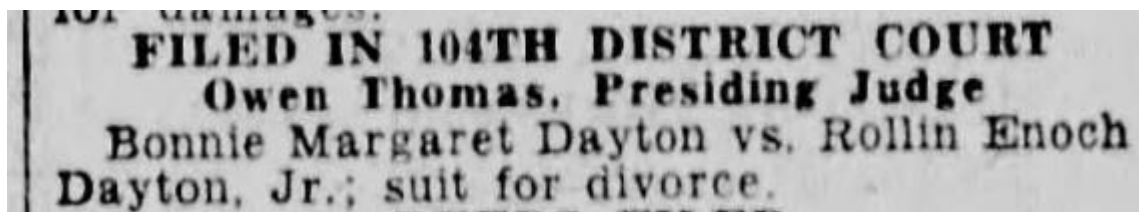

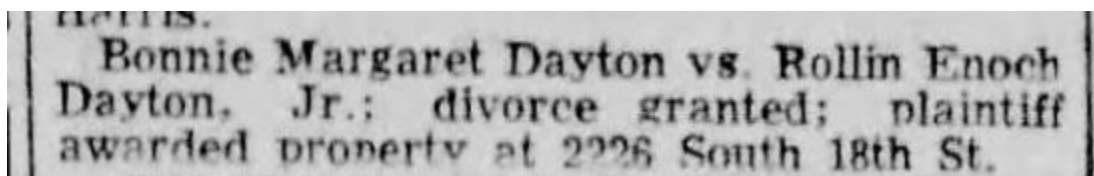
