14—PRIVATE JOSEPH BAUER—Wautoma, Wis. Born February 27, 1891. Son of Louis and Mary Bauer. Enlisted at Wautoma, Wis, July 22, 1917. Sent to Camp Douglas as a member of Co. L, 5th Wisconsin Infantry. Transferred to Camp McArthur, Co. C, 107th Supply Train, 2nd Division. Sent overseas on the ill-fated Tuscania, January 24, 1918, and served 19 months. Discharged at Camp Grant August 14, 1919. Battles: All the operations of Second Division.
