WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Seventy-nine Wisconsin men who were on the transport Tuscania sunk by a torpedo are known to have been saved, the war department announced today.

Brookfield Police Radio Has One Of Few Licensed Women Operators

BROOKFIELD — Several years ago Mrs. Toni Bendixen quit her stenographic job and thought she was headed for retirement. Today she is one of the few women licensed by the federal communications commission as a police radio dispatcher and the only police dispatcher in this area.

Mrs. Bendixen, however, wants it understood that although she has been a day dispatcher for the Brookfield police department since its radio was installed July 7, 1953, her job is now only part time. Full time dispatcher is Raymond Rohr of Elm Grove, who formerly held down the night shift.

"When he's busy, I take the overflow," Mrs. Bendixen says.

Each conversation via the police radio must be recorded immediately in the log book, setting down the time, location, party making the call, and patrolman sent. That's another part of Mrs. Bendixen's job.



As dispatcher she is the important link between the Brookfield public and its police force. An emergency telephone call to the police department will bring a hurried radio call to a cruising squad car, and an officer is on his way.

Mrs. Bendixen — nearly everyone calls her Toni— comes by the dispatcher's job honestly. Her father, John T. Burns, was a dispatcher for the Milwaukee fire department for 43 years.

Another help was the fact that she has a long time knowledge of the Brookfield area, having lived in Elm Grove for 18 years. Only last year, she and her husband, Chester L. Bendixen, an oil salesman, moved to Wauwatosa.

While living in Elm Grove Mrs. Bendixen had been

secretary - treasurer of a Milwaukee oil firm. She remained at that post until 1947. Then one day in August, 1952, she was hired to help the Brookfield town clerk "for a few days."

"I'm still here," she said laughing.

In addition to dispatching, she is secretary to the town clerk and police chief, and acts as receptionist. When town offices moved into the present, modern town hall last April, town officials searched up a special nameplate for Mrs. Bendixen's desk. "Town secretary" was decided upon as an appropriate title.

Until the Brookfield police installed its own radio, a number of emergency police calls came to the office

by telephone, and Mrs. Bendixen also took care of these. Following the installation a year and a half ago, and after she was granted the FCC license required of dispatchers, she took over the radio "all day long from 8:30 to 4:30."

"It takes a sense of humor sometimes," Mrs. Bendixen admits, like the icy day when a tearful voice pleaded for police to come get her cat out of the tree. Lost dogs, fires, traffic cases, even a baby born in a speeding ambulance, have all been part of her log.

Her job, she says, affords her "nothing but pleasure. What you put into your job you get out of it. If you put 100 per cent in, you get it back."
