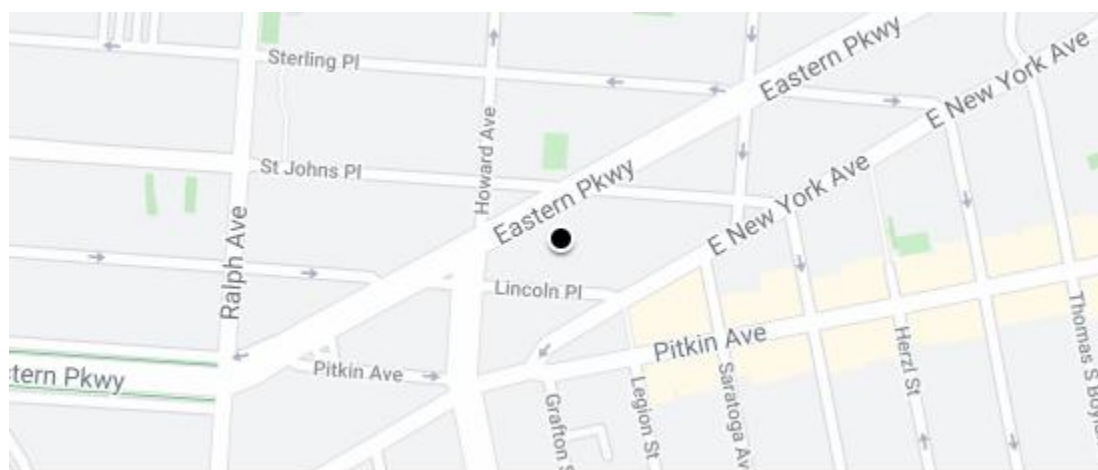

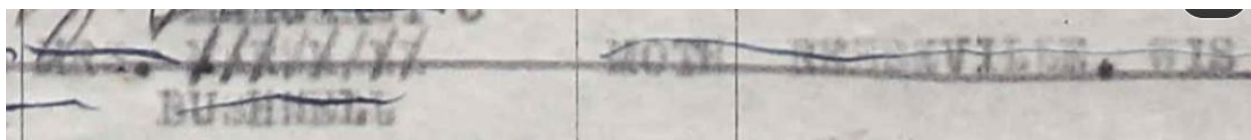

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—There were no new official figures on the losses available tonight and the war department's figures continued to differ from those of the British admiralty. The war department estimates 210 persons missing, 113 of them American soldiers while the British admiralty's figures put the loss at 166 missing, 147 of them American officers and enlisted men.

Partial list of survivors aboard the Tuscania were announced by the war department today as fast as received from the war zone, assuring that the American boys were safe "somewhere in Ireland."

'Ann Deegan Day' honors county's oldest employee

Ann Deegan got up for work this morning just like every other day, even though today is her 90th birthday.

In her honor, her boss — Westchester County Executive Andrew O'Rourke — proclaimed June 22, 1983 "Ann Deegan Day."

Mrs. Deegan, a White Plains resident who works five hours a day in O'Rourke's press office, may be the oldest worker in the county government.

To honor her "big 90," her co-workers gave Mrs. Deegan a birthday party a day early on Tuesday, with balloons and home-baked cakes, streamers and presents as Mrs. Deegan looked on dressed in a flowing purple dress.

She says the people she works with keep her going. "I love it," she says of her job. "The people here are wonderful."

Mrs. Deegan was born in Queens and was one of five children. Her father had a farm that ran through what is now the Jamaica and Hollis sections of the borough.

Of Mrs. Deegan's three children, only one, 42-year-old Jacqueline, is still alive and works with her mother in the County Office Building. They live together in White Plains with their cat, Alexandria.

Mrs. Deegan got her job, clipping and filing newspaper stories that concern the county, through the Westchester County Senior Community Service Employment Project.

At 90, Mrs. Deegan says she has no plans to retire; she says she'll work until she's 100. "Maybe I will find a rich man and marry him."

Employers find seniors making comeback

Four days a week, Ann Deegan, who is 93 years old, rises at 7 a.m., eats a breakfast of oatmeal and wheat germ, then walks six blocks from her White Plains apartment to her job at the Westchester County Office of Public Affairs. There she reads the morning papers and clips, copies and files articles about the county.

For Mrs. Deegan, working is more than a paycheck. It is also her prescription for health and longevity.

"One mistake too many older people make," she said, "is they don't walk enough and they don't use their minds enough. And you know, anything that goes unused gets rusty. It becomes atrophied."

Until recently there were not many opportunities for senior citizens who, like Mrs. Deegan, found their Social Security checks too small and their retirement too full of empty hours.

But labor shortages in Westchester County are spurring many companies and personnel agencies to recruit older workers for desks that would otherwise

be empty.

"Companies have not been open to recruiting from the ranks of seniors in the past," said Samuel Gabe, director of Good People Personnel Service, an agency for temporary workers in Yorktown Heights. "Today, companies are not just considering using senior citizens, they are actually using them."

The county's shrinking pool of workers is reflected in an unemployment rate of 3.2 percent in June, the lowest in the state, according

Ann Deegan: Westchester County office worker

Ann Deegan, a retired Westchester County office worker and a longtime resident of White Plains, died of heart failure Tuesday at her home in White Plains. She was 97.

In 1987, at the age of 94, Mrs. Deegan retired from a part-time staff position in county Executive Andrew P. O'Rourke's public affairs office.

"She was a firebrand, without a doubt," said Kara Bennorth, a spokeswoman for the county executive's office.

Mrs. Deegan was born in Queens on June 22, 1893, and grew up on her parents' farm in the Jamaica section of Quuens.

She married, and was later widowed.

Years ago she had an active business career that included the operation of a White Plains diaper service and hotel management.

In 1981, at the age of 88, Mrs. Deegan applied for and accepted a position in the county executive's press office. On her 90th birthday, O'Rourke declared "Ann Deegan Day" in Westchester.

"The only reason she left us was that she broke her hip," said Claire Palermo Flower, a spokeswoman for O'Rourke's office. "She preached that if you had a positive outlook on life, no illness or tragedy could get you down."

Mrs. Deegan is survived by a daughter, Jacqueline Deegan of White Plains.

Two children died earlier.

Arrangements are being handled by the McMahon, Lyon & Hartnett Funeral Home in White Plains.

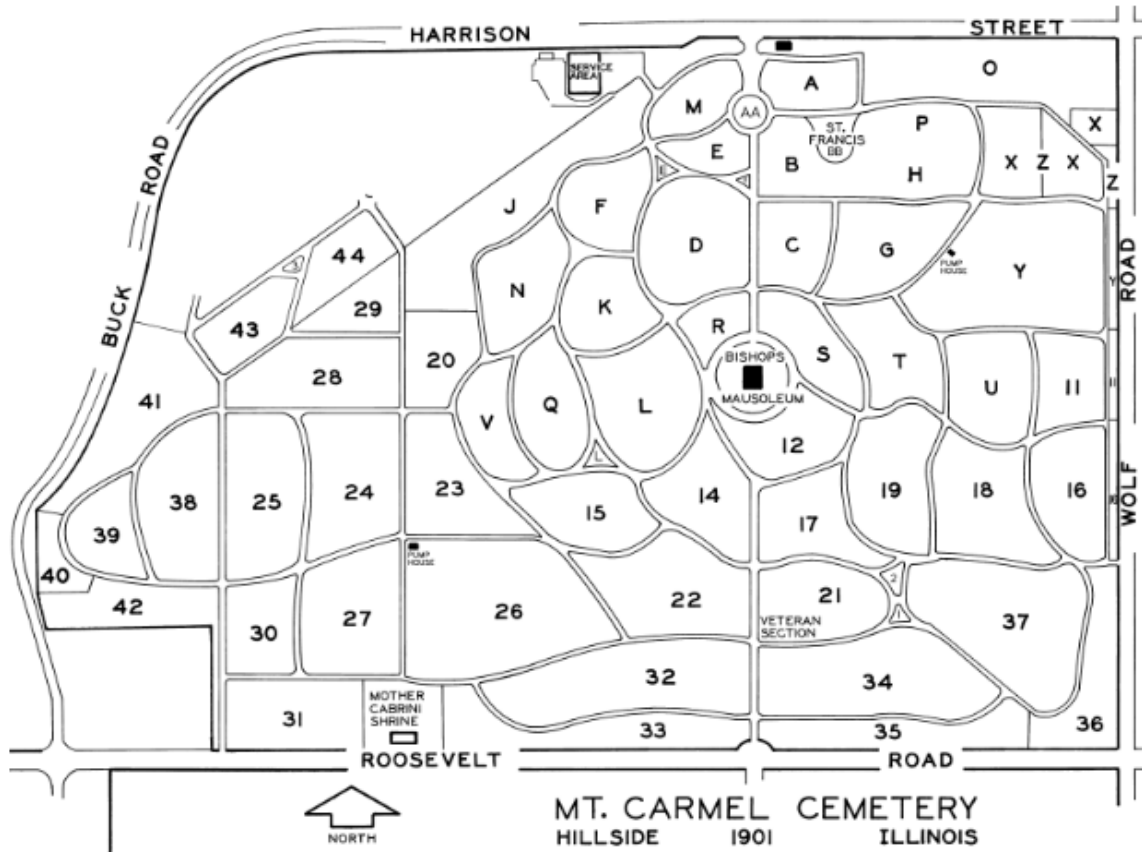

Information on James Edward Degan is very sketchy.

He may be the J.F. Degan who is a guest at the Mills Hotel on Bleecker St. in the 1910 census for Manhattan NY. None of the guests have any data – like age, state of birth, occupation, etc.

He lists himself as an invalid in the 1925 NY state census.

There was a Mary Jane Birge Bushnell, 5 Aug 1836 CT – 16 Feb 1935, married to Ensign A. Bushnell (1821-1892, F: 38204819) who is buried in Stone Cemetery, Rolling Prairie, Dodge Co. WI, F: 38204938, daughter of Augustus Birge, who may be the Mary Bushnell referred to in James's wartime next-of-kin records, but her obituary does not indicate she had any child named James Degan.
