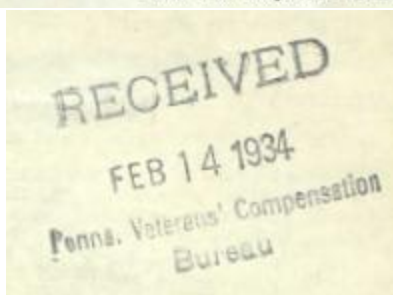

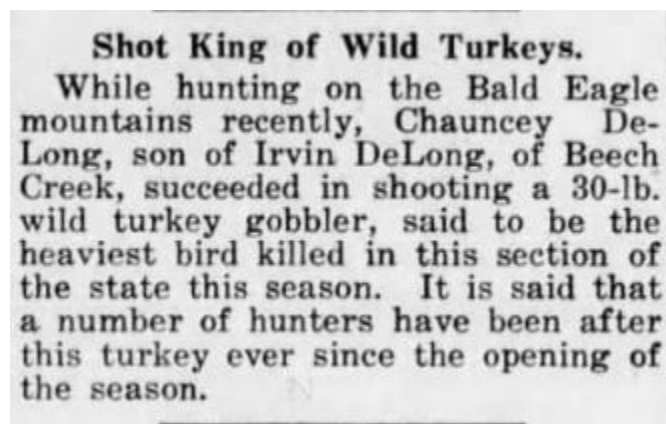

(Special to News by United Press.)

Washington, D. C., Feb. 8.—Out of the war zone came the names of hundreds of American soldier boys, survivors of the Tuscania sinking, to ease the anxiety of relatives and friends in this country. These names are coming across the water today in a steady stream and are being compiled for publication, but not until all of them have been received.

Up to this time the names of five Pennsylvania survivors are contained in the list as follow: Joseph Burkhardt, Johnstown; Chauncey I. DeLong, Beech Creek, Clinton county; Poland E. Duncan, Wilmerding; Charles J. Fisher, Oakdale, Allegheny county, and Charles E. Feather Lyndell, Delaware county and Robert F. McCormick, Lemoyne, Pa.

BEECH CREEK BOY WRITES OF HIS EXPERIENCE WHEN TUSCANIA SUNK

The following letter, written a few days after the Tuscania was sunk by a German submarine, is from Chauncey DeLong, son of Mr. and Mrs. Irvin DeLong, of Beech Creek boro, in the 13th Aero Squadron. His account of the torpedoing of the vessel and his own experience will undoubtedly be read with unusual interest:

Dear Mother:

Have a little more time now and will try to give you an idea of our adventures.

We sailed from New York January 24 and besides some rough weather, the trip was uneventful until the evening of February 5. Half of us had just gotten our suppers and were receiving orders to be on deck with life belts, and there were about seven hundred below decks together when "she hit".

The lights went out immediately and the hundreds went up the stairs in fine style and perfect order.

The ship took a heavy list to starboard and all the soldiers went to their appointed boats. I went to my boat, but all boats on that side were destroyed by the explosion, and I was knocked into the sea by a falling boat, and was among struggling men for half an hour, when a captain of engineers helped me on board with a line and I was stationed with his company on the stern, and drew up to "atten-

tion".

The destroyer had been receiving our men, and I with the engineers was last off the ship. The ship had by this time listed so we could hardly stand upright, but we did, and every minute expecting to go under, we sang "America," and "Nearer My God to Thee".

It was fine, wonderful. We were drawn up there in perfect order and as calm as if preparing for an ordinary drill. As we finished our last song the last destroyer came up and we boarded in perfect order and started to steam away. Just then the Hun appeared and let drive at us again, the torpedo just missing our boat. Our destroyer immediately signalled another and she came up and in less than half an hour blew the Hun clear out of the water, taking two prisoners.

We landed in Ireland and traveled continually in that country, finally landing in England. The hospitality and good will of the British and Irish soldiers and sailors was fine. They gave us everything and tried to make us forget in a way our "little picnic."

The loss of our brave fellows has only fired up with a deep, burning desire for revenge which will not be quenched until we come face to face with the Hun and exact one hundred lives for every one of our boys who went down.

One of the survivors of the torpedoed Tuscania, Private Chauncey I. DeLong, of Beech Creek, has been wounded. He sailed with the Fifteenth aero squadron and when the Tuscania was sunk he was landed safely on the coast of Ireland. He is a gunner on airplanes, and has been wounded by a mine planted by Germans.

"I added three more notches to my pistol holster before the Germans did me up," he writes to his parents. He is now in a hospital.

Chauncey I. DeLong, Beech Creek's first wounded soldier to return home from the fighting line in France, has arrived home from Hampton, Va., to visit his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Irvin DeLong, and is accompanied by his wife, whom he married shortly before he went over seas last May.

FOURTH MAN HELD FOR COURT TRIAL IN LARCENY CASE

Theft of Property From General Refractories Plant at Mill Hall Reviewed

SACHETTE ACCUSES ONE

Witnesses Tell of Visits to the Brick Yard and Disposal of Iron and Copper

Lester DeLong was held for court under \$500 bail this morning on a charge of breaking, entering and larceny of property belonging to the General Refractories Company. He had a hearing before Alderman M. J. Lipez.

DeLong is the fourth man implicated in the theft of \$1,836 worth of iron and copper from the abandoned plant at Mill Hall. The others are Guy Sachette, Elvin Burke and Richard Sees, who have pleaded guilty.

B. L. Haag, district attorney, declared the commonwealth had made a prima facie case and that was all that was needed for an alderman to hold a man to court.

Sachette, who has pleaded guilty to entering and larceny of the machine parts, copper wire, door sashes and other articles, testified at DeLong's hearing that DeLong was with him once in March, 1936, when they got a quantity of copper wire and once in November, 1936, when a quantity of cast iron pieces and geared wheels were taken, which, he said, they later sold to a local junk dealer.

Roy Boone, 710 East Bald Eagle Street, said that about a year ago he saw Sachette and DeLong in the Sachette yard next door to his place and that Sachette was breaking up some geared wheels. The pieces were placed in the rear of the Sachette car, he testified.

He said he did not see DeLong breaking up the iron but that he was standing talking to Sachette.

Ray Kline, Draketown, told of seeing DeLong and some other men whom he did not know, coming from the property of the Refractories Company during the week of Armistice Day this year and each had a burlap bag with something in it slung over his shoulder. They came up the railroad a short distance and were seated on the bags as he passed them, he said. He did not know DeLong then but later learned who he was through Russell Shimmel, Mill Hall, when DeLong spoke to Shimmel a few days later as they were coming from work, he added.

William Hollis, defense attorney, made a motion to discharge the case in that the information had been made by Sheriff Jacob B. Bryerton who did not own the property and that there was no evidence to connect DeLong with the thefts except that of Sachette who has pleaded guilty to the charge of larceny.

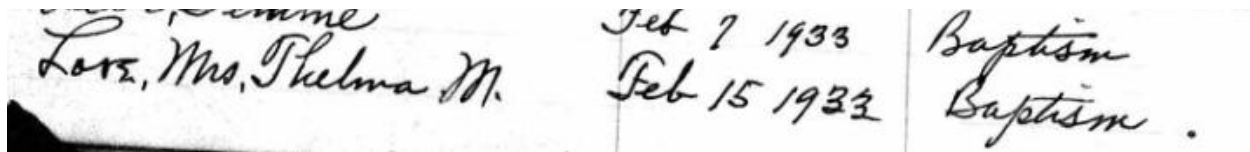

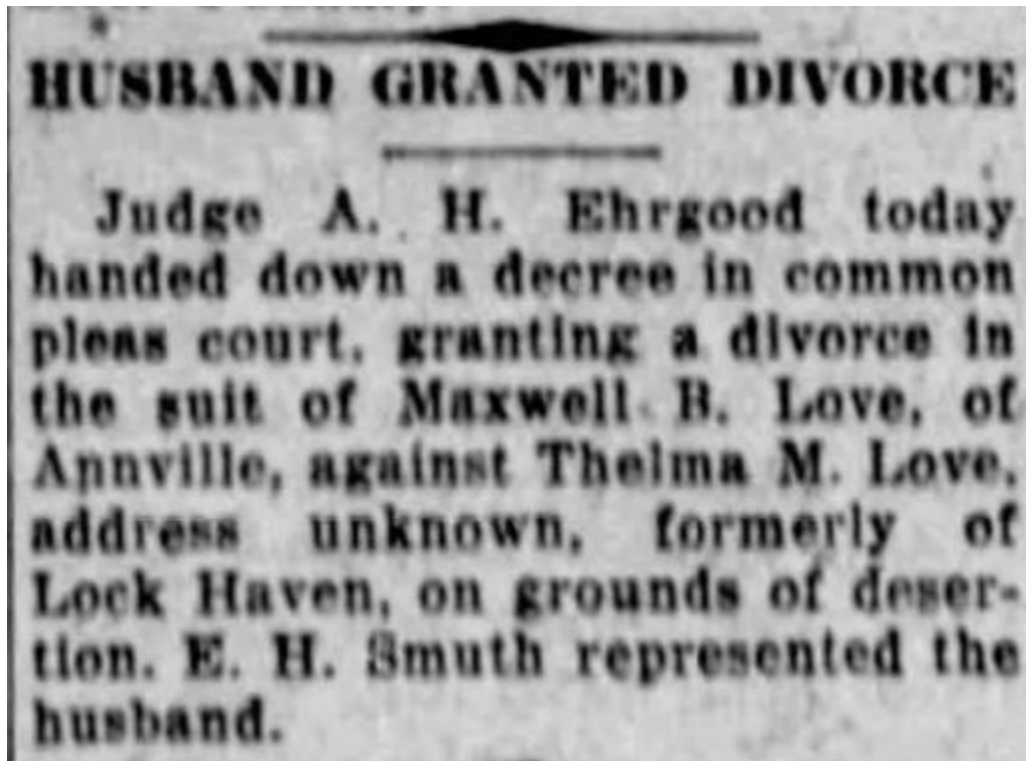
