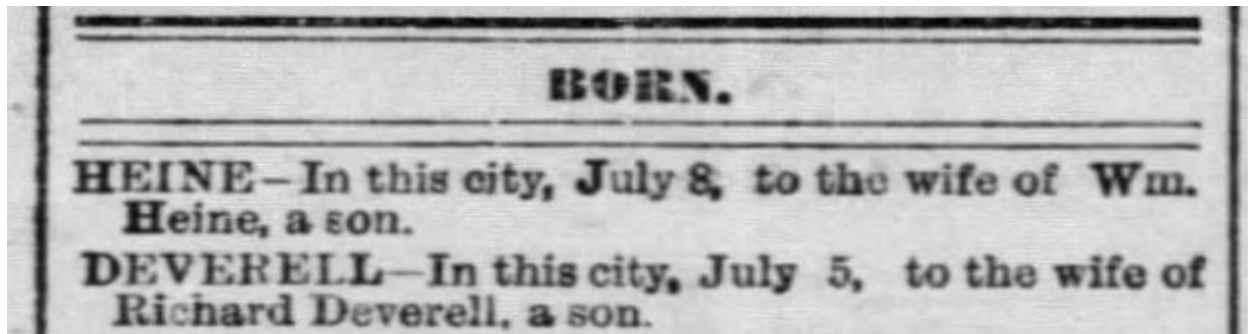

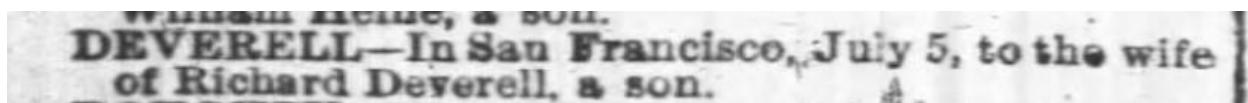

OTHER TROOPS DUE SOON

Soldiers Are Sent to Camp Merritt
Preparatory to Being Hurried
West for Demobilization.

NEW YORK, May 20.—(Special.)—

One of the happiest companies of troops to reach America was company H, 162d infantry, some of the old 3d Oregon national guard that has been in England for a long time. Only a few other Oregon men were scattered through the other units that arrived on today's troopships.

Several ships carrying troops are scheduled to dock here within the next few days and it is likely that a noticeable number of Oregonians will be among the men aboard them.

In the 162d infantry, which arrived on the Rochambeau today and went to Camp Merritt were the following Oregon men:

In company K of the 327th infantry was Ralph E. Schott, Condon, and in casual companies 548 and 552 were Harry R. Deverell, Linnton, and Benjamin A. Clark of Selma.

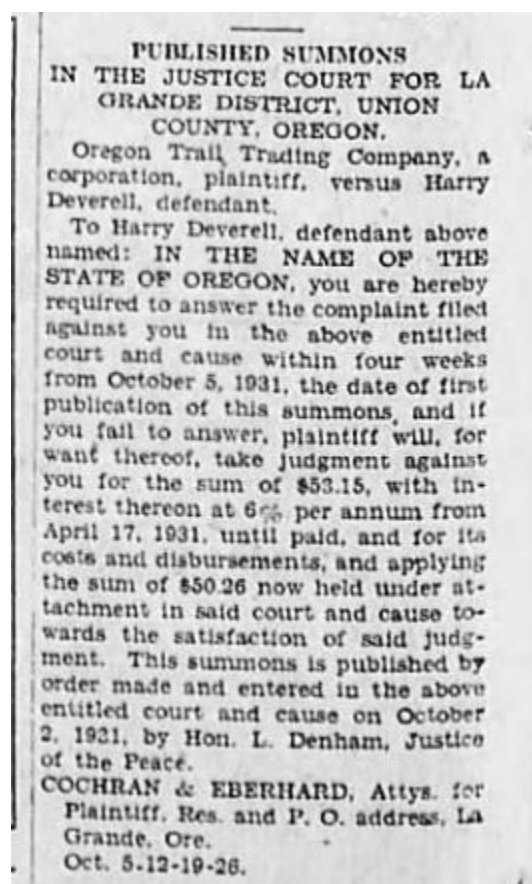

Detectives testified in court he had sold \$3,700 of the stock. He was held under \$10,000 bail.

His defense was that business conditions were delaying the formation of the company.

INVENTOR HELD IN PATENT CASE

Charged With Selling Stocks in Mythical Concern Also.

Nels Areson, 48, of 604 Arch street, inventor of the Areson self-locking boltless rim wheel, was held for court in \$8,000 bail by Magistrate Leo Rothenberg in Central police court yesterday charged with selling stock in an alleged mythical concern and on a patent which it is alleged he no longer owns.

Capital stock in the concern was \$125,000 of which \$25,000 was needed to begin production, Areson told police. Since he began selling stock detectives were informed that a boulevard automobile tire concern had bought the rights. City Detectives Edward Bailey, Walter Kaiser and John Callan said Areson collected more than the \$25,000 but production never began.

No certificates were issued to stockholders and all they got for their money was a receipt the officers said. Detectives were unable to locate all of the investors. Eight persons appeared yesterday and told of various amounts given Areson. The sums ranged from a few dollars to \$1,000 detectives said.

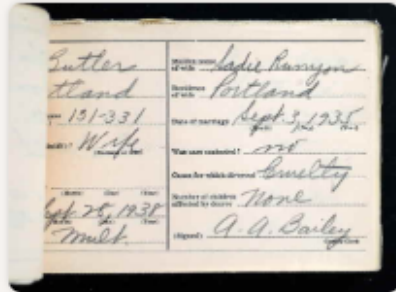

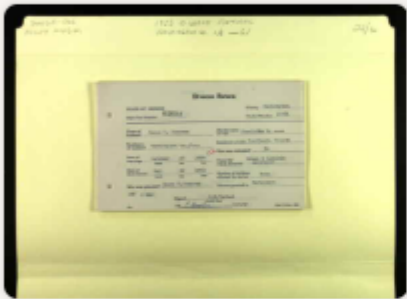

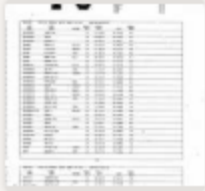

A BURSTED COAL DEALER.

He Attributes His Failure to His Wife's Slandorous Attacks.

Frederick Deverell conducted a profitable wood and coal business at the corner of Kearny and Union streets until a short time ago.

In an action for a divorce from his wife, Emma L. Deverell, he charges her with having been the principal cause of his failure and with having largely contributed toward the breaking up of his means of livelihood.

They were married in this city on September 1, 1875, and have two children as the result of their union.

The first few years of their married life were passed happily and without any incidents, with the exceptions of a few controversies, such as are occasionally indulged in in the best regulated families.

During the month of October, 1882, hostilities commenced, and ever since an open warfare has been waged between them. On that day the defendant called her husband a brute, and in very violent language reflected on his physical condition. After having unbosomed herself she left the domestic fireside, and did not return for three weeks.

When she again visited her domicile, she took advantage of her husband's absence and removed all the furniture from the house.

The plaintiff, upon his return from his business, found the premises desolate and void of any articles of furniture, and he was obliged to hire a nurse for his children, and engage rooms and board in some hotel.

The plaintiff alleges that after having broken up his domestic happiness, his wife started out on a trip among his customers, where she slandered him to such an extent that he was obliged to abandon his business.

In the month of August, 1883, however, articles of truce were signed, the hatchet was buried and everything was forgotten and forgiven. They pitched their tent at Port Costa, but soon indulged in the old altercations to such an extent that she threatened to kill him several times.

Last month was the most stormy episode of their union. One night when slumbering peacefully, he claims, his wife approached the bed and expressed her intention to cut his throat, but no bloodshed followed.

Again when leaving the house one morning to attend to his labor, she threw a bottle of ink at him, bruising him and giving him the appearance of Charley Reed rendering his popular Tamales song.

To make his life as unhappy as she could she finally refused to cook for him and to live with him as man and wife.

The plaintiff is now employed as a porter in a wholesale house, and charges his wife with being responsible for his ruin.

A CRUEL HUSBAND.

Divorce Granted His Wife After Years of Ill-Treatment.

When the divorce suit of Richard Deverell against Emma Louisa Deverell was called before Judge Finn yesterday there was no appearance on behalf the plaintiff, and the case was dismissed. A cross-complaint, brought by Mrs. Deverell against her husband, was proceeded with. The testimony revealed a shocking story of conjugal misery. The defendant is employed in a cigar factory on Sansome street, and is of herculean build. During their eight years of married life she swore that her person was rarely during that period without marks of her husband's violence. On one occasion, while living on Montgomery street, he dragged her along a corridor and jumped on her abdomen, and though her child was born alive, was sickly and died shortly afterward. Judge Finn granted a divorce to Mrs. Deverell and awarded \$7 a week alimony.

FRIEND OF ROYALTY DIES

**RICHARD G. DEVERELL SUC-
CUMBS IN LINNTON.**

**Man Honored by Queen Victoria
and King Edward VII Lives
to Age of 87 Years.**

Richard G. Deverell, who, on more than one occasion, was honored by the royalty of Great Britain, died Wednesday night in his home at Linnton at the age of 87. Until a comparatively short time ago Deverell had been hale and active and an employe of the Clark-Wilson Lumber company. An uncle, for whom he was named, attained the age of 115 years, he was wont to tell his friends.

Deverell was singled out for honors by Queen Victoria because of bravery exhibited in saving a woman who fell into the river at a grand naval review, the incident being witnessed by the late queen. She called young Deverell to her side and personally thanked him for preventing a tragedy on the festive occasion.

The young Englishman was personally acquainted with King Edward VII, son of Queen Victoria, though the prince of Wales at the time, through having served with him on the warship Black Prince, in the British navy. They were members of this crew at the time of the rescue incident.

Favor of the royal family was displayed on other occasions. When the prince laid the cornerstone of the chamber of commerce building in Liverpool, Deverell, then a lieutenant in the navy, was selected to hold the silver trowel for the prince. At the marriage of King Edward Lieutenant Deverell was one of the navy officers picked to serve as an escort at the ceremony.

Soon after quitting the British navy Deverell came to this country. He served as a marine officer both on the east and west coasts, eventually locating in Portland when he gave up the sea life. He is survived by the widow, a son and daughter.

TROUBLE AT LINNTON

A Squad of Detectives Sent Down
to Take the Smelter.

A DEPUTY SHERIFF PROTECTS IT

Messrs. Bunker and Selover Are Still
in Possession.

OUTCOME OF A LONG GROWING FEUD

Mr. Bunker Claims That the Board of Directors
of the Portland Smelting and Refining Com-
pany Are Trying to Force Him Out.

WHAT THE SMELTER IS DOING.

The smelter is working like clockwork. James McCambridge, the foreman on the day shift, says that in all of his thirteen years' experience he never saw a better one, and Richard Deverell, the night foreman, says the same.

The smelter is running at the rate of 100 bars a shift, or 200 bars of bullion weighing on an average 100 pounds, in a day. In other words, about forty tons of ore are consumed a day. There is about thirty days' run of ore yet on hand, including a small shipment that is coming and by Monday night Mr. Selover will have \$12,000 worth of bullion to ship. During the ten days the smelter was in operation last May it turned out \$45,000 worth of bullion.

TROUBLE EXPECTED TODAY.

Mr. Selover stated last night that he looked for trouble today. The squad of detectives are not there for fun, but as most of the men on the smelter are armed, the smelter will not be so easily captured.

APPLES OF GARDEN OF EDEN TOO SOUR TO EAT

Richard Deverall, Once Officer in British Navy and Often Honored by
Queen Victoria, Says He Knows Because He Tasted Them.



AN old British sailor, Richard Deverell, of Linnton, who was honored more than once by Queen Victoria, who participated in a noted public function with King Edward VII, then the Prince of Wales, and who served on the same man-of-war with Britain's present King, George V, when the latter was a young midshipman, celebrated the 80th anniversary of his birth on February 29 last. He has been a resident of Portland's newest addition for more than a quarter of a century. Despite his advanced age he is still active of body and mind, and in true sailor fashion can "spin yarns" of his many experiences during his long sea-faring life.

Mr. Deverell comes of sturdy English stock. He early took to the sea, passed his examinations at 18 years of age, and joined the naval reserve. He received rapid promotion, obtaining a lieutenant's commission in the navy when he was 22 years of age, and being assigned to service on the Black Prince, at that time, he says, the best warship afloat.

He received favor and distinction from Queen Victoria, first coming under her special notice when part of the British navy was passing in review before the Queen off one of the southern English ports. There were great numbers of people present, and steamers and ships and wharves were overcrowded. It chanced that one woman fell overboard and young Deverell, who was near, leapt into the water and rescued her. The incident was reported to Queen Victoria, and she at once called the young sailor before her and thanked him for his heroic deed.

Queen Remembers Action.

She did not later lose sight of him, for at the time of the marriage of King Edward VII and Alexandra of Denmark he was one of the picked naval escort that conducted the young Princess to London from the southern British port whither she was brought from Denmark on a Danish war vessel. And when the Prince of Wales, who became Edward VII, as Grand Master Mason, laid the cornerstone of the new Chamber of Commerce building in Liverpool, Deverell, an apprentice in the Masonic Lodge, was selected to hold the silver trowel for the Prince, and he, consequently, rode in the carriage with the Prince in the great civic procession.

Mr. Deverell has sailed the seven seas and made port in all lands and climes. He declares that when on leave of absence once, when he was cruising in the Mediterranean Sea, he visited what is reputed to be the spot where was located the Garden of Eden. He ate, or attempted to eat, of the fruit of the apple trees growing there,

and he pronounces that fruit very bad. Indeed, from his experience, he has become convinced that Adam never ate that apple at all, because Garden of Eden apples are too hard and sour to eat.

He visited the island of St. Helena and stood where the great Napoleon stood. This opportunity came to him because the captain of the vessel he was serving on put into port to save the life of one of the crew. A shark had been taken, so the old sailor narrates, and he offers to make affidavit that the tale is true, and the second mate cut its head off and threw the head into a barrel on deck. Six hours later he went to the barrel and put his hand down to take the head out when he was caught around the waist by the shark's mouth, and several of the crew had hard work to loosen the hold. The captain went to St. Helena to get medical aid so as to prevent blood poisoning.

After leaving the British navy, Mr. Deverell came to the United States, and for several years he was on the deep sea ships running from the Atlantic around Cape Horn to San Francisco. He gave this up later, because, he says, he found that his pay was cut almost in two, for he received it in greenbacks, and these bills the brokers discounted at about 50 per cent.

discounted at about 50 per cent.

Then he engaged in the coastwise trade, running between San Francisco and Portland. A good part of this time he was, he says, with the Jabez Hawes Company. He tells of making one of the fastest trips of those early days in one of this company's boats. He drifted over the bar at San Francisco Bay about midnight, caught a southeaster, ran before the wind, made Portland, unloaded and loaded his vessel, and returned to Astoria, where he met the Ajax and other vessels, which had been ready to leave San Francisco Bay when he was. Those were the days, he declares, when Portland extended west from the river only to Fourth street, and the river was so shallow that it sometimes took three weeks to get from this port to the ocean, the vessel being loaded at different points on the way down from barges of grain they took with them.

Ferryboat Service Taken Up.

He quit the coastwise trade one day in San Francisco when he had some difficulty in getting his clearance papers because some one had reported that he was not a citizen. He came to Portland, and for many years was at work on the Willamette and Columbia rivers. He served under Major Jones, U. S. Engineer, and Captain Edwards, the present steamboat inspector. Mr. Deverell has had charge of several ferryboats running on the Willamette. He had charge of the crew that constructed the jetty at the point where the Oregon slough runs into the Willamette, and he also superintended the building of the jetty at St. Helens, and drove the piling for the wharves

at Young's Bay, where deep-water vessels then were moored.

Mr. Deverell, though 80 years old, has charge of the dressed lumber shed of the big sawmill plant at Linnton. The capacity of this shed runs up close to 1,000,000 feet, and yet he keeps a record in his head of the quantity of lumber of the different kinds and grades that he has, and when an order comes he can tell, without hesitation, whether or not the lumber is on hand to fill the order. He is hale and hearty and seldom misses doing a hard day's work. His home is on the hill above the mill, and twice a day he walks up and down the 150 steps that lead to his home.

His uncle, Richard Deverell, after whom he was named, lived until he was 115 years, and the old British sailor bids fair to equal if not surpass his relative's record for longevity.

HIS TEMPER HURT BUSINESS

Mrs. Hengeveld Divorces Husband After Losing Her Boarders.

Mrs. Sadie L. Hengeveld has had hard luck with her boarding house at Linton. Once she had 22 boarders and was doing well. But the nagging nature of her husband, John Hengeveld, drove them all away excepting the star boarder and three others. The star boarder might have gone too, excepting that he thought quite a bit of her and used to take her out to the theater and to supper afterwards.

This boarding house tragedy was developed in the State Circuit Court yesterday during the Hengeveld divorce proceedings. Mrs. Hengeveld asserted that her husband's irritable disposition and his persistent cruelty and brutality have been the bane of her life. She has not only been compelled to support the family, but has been greatly inconvenienced in so doing by Hengeveld's lack of con-

sideration for the finer sensibilities of her boarders.

The husband was on hand to contest the proceedings. He had a side to tell as well. Once he had an argument on the stairway with Mrs. Hengeveld, and she expectorated in his left optic. True, he retaliated by pummeling her head, but that could hardly even up the score. Hengeveld, however, did not take the witness stand. He contented himself with gaining a cut of the property, in which he succeeded. Mrs. Hengeveld was given a divorce, together with \$50 in cash, a portion of their property and the custody of their three children.

The Hengevelds were married 14 years ago, when the wife was but 15 years old.

THROWS ACID IN HIS WIFE'S FACE

**John Hengeveld Angry Because
His Child Could Not Go to
Theater With Him.**

IS DISFIGURED FOR LIFE

**Burly Six-Footer Wreaks Vengeance
on Frail Woman Who Had Di-
vorced Him—Complaint Is-
sued for His Arrest.**

Angered because she refused to allow one of their children to accompany him to the theater, John Hengeveld threw the contents of a vial containing carbolic acid into the face of his divorced wife, Mrs. Sadie Hengeveld, while the woman was standing on the depot platform at Linnton, awaiting the arrival of a Portland-bound train, shortly before noon yesterday. Fortunately for the woman, none of the acid entered her eyes, but the right side of her face and neck are painfully burned and she will be permanently disfigured. Mrs. Hengeveld was brought to Portland, where a physician was called. Later in the day she swore to a complaint for the arrest of Hengeveld and the warrant was placed in the hands of Constable Wagner for service.

Following a series of domestic difficulties, the Hengevelds were divorced in the Circuit Court last February, the woman being given the decree and awarded the custody of the three children. Since that time the mother and children have been living at Linnton, where Hengeveld is employed in the Wilson & Clark sawmill.

A year ago Mrs. Hengeveld caused a warrant to be issued for the arrest of her husband for threatening to kill her with a razor, but she refused to prosecute the charge and it was dismissed. Nine months later she successfully instituted divorce proceedings.

"I am certainly fearful for my life," said Mrs. Hengeveld yesterday afternoon when she swore to the complaint for the arrest of her former husband. "He has frequently threatened my life and I have no doubt that he would not hesitate to kill me. Last week he wrote a note to the eldest daughter, asking her to accompany him to the theater tonight. This was the first attention he had shown the children since I was divorced from him. The girl was accompanying me to Portland yesterday and while we were at the depot she inquired what answer she should make to her father. I told her to tell him that she could not go with him tonight, for the reason that she was suffering from blood poisoning in her foot and it would not be safe for her to walk too much. Accordingly she walked down the platform to where her father was standing and told him she could not go this week, but would accompany him next Sunday night.

"This appeared to anger him, for he walked up to where I was standing and said: 'You will never see or hear from me again.' With that he put his hand in his coat pocket. I presumed to get a revolver. But instead he produced a small bottle.

"When he made his threat and reached into his pocket, I turned to run and I stumbled and fell to the platform. Then he threw the acid, which struck me on the side of the face and neck, instead of directly in the face, as he had intended. Had it not been for my falling, I am satisfied I would have lost my sight and been more seriously burned."

At the time the dastardly attack was made on Mrs. Hengeveld she was on her way to this city, where she had procured employment as a cook and was to begin her work today. The cowardice of Hengeveld is only magnified by the fact that he is a strapping six-footer, while the object of his insane anger is a small woman.

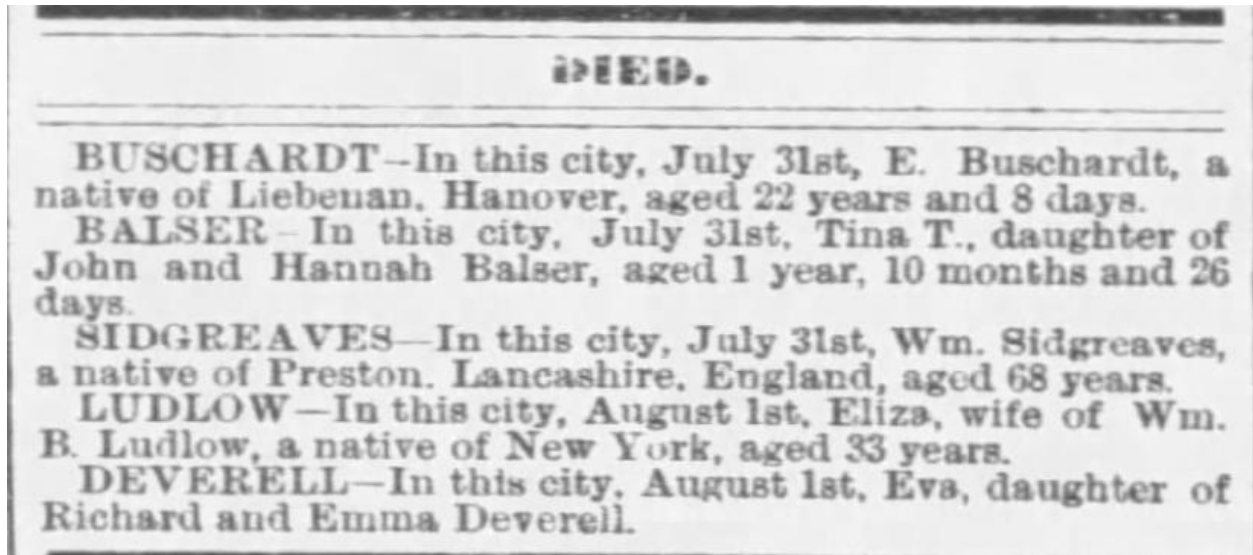

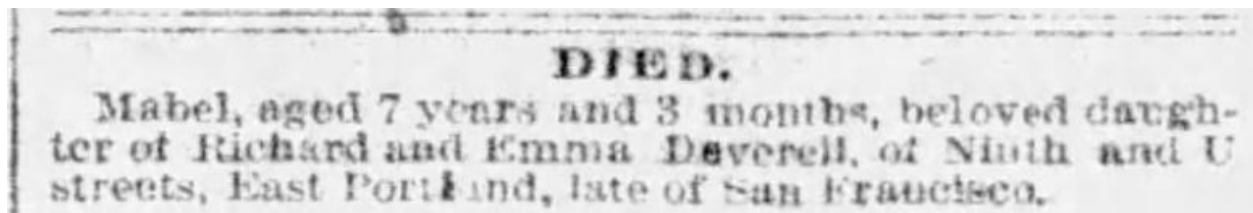

Daughter of David A. & Mary Elizabeth Runion (b. 1868, who died 7 Nov 1951 in Portland, Multnomah OR & is buried in Lincoln Memorial Park, Portland, Multnomah OR, F: 101110315).

In 1900 the Runion family lived in Livingston Co. MO.

Sadie and Harry Deverell married in 1909. In the 1910 census she was Sadie Deverell. They divorced in 1916.

Sadie marries Titus Edward Hambley 11 Feb 1918 in Clark Co. WA; she is age 25. Both indicate it is their 2nd marriage. In the 1920 census she is Sadie Hambly.

Sadie married Nels Areson on 17 May 1928 in Vancouver, Clark WA; both were residents of Multnomah Co. OR. Nels Areson, age 44, divorced, stated this was his 3rd marriage. He was

born in Norway & was an inventor, son of Ares [surname written over & unintelligible] & Anna Christine Johansen, both born Norway. Sadie R. Deverell, age 35, divorced, stated this was her 2nd marriage. She was born in MO, the daughter of David Runion & Mary Runion.

In the 1930 census Sadie Areson (37 MO, parents b. MO, age 16 at 1st marriage) was living with husband Nels Areson (46 Norway, parents b. Norway, age 21 at 1st marriage) & her son Edward Deverell (18 OR, father b. CA, mother b. MO) in Seattle WA.

Nels Areson is arrested in 1932 in Pittsburgh PA for selling stock in a company to produce the “theft-proof automobile wheel” he developed, with claims that the company was “mythical” & that he no longer owned the patent. He was also in legal trouble in King Co. WA from investors in the imaginary company.

Divorced by the time of the 1940 census when she is living in Portland OR with the surname Runyon.

Sadie Runyon obtained a marriage license & married on 3 Sep 1935 in Stevenson, Skamania WA to Arthur J. Butler. Butler was age 28, born in & resident of Portland OR, son of Arthur Joseph Butler & Lucy Burke. He was a window washer & this was his 1st marriage. {However, since he was born 25 Mar 1914, he was age 21, not 28.) Sadie J. Runyon was age 34, resident of Portland OR, b. MO, a seamstress. She said it was her 2nd marriage (instead of 4th). One of the two witnesses was Jennie Deverell.

Arthur Joseph Butler died 23 Feb 1967 Portland, Multnomah OR & is buried in Willamette National Cemetery, Portland, Multnomah OR, F: 446444, where he is linked to parents Joseph A. & Lucy Butler.

She is listed with the surname Butler in 1942 on her son Edward Deverell’s WWII draft registration.

In the 1950 census for Portland, Multnomah OR, conducted 3 Apr 1950, Sadie R. Butler, 57 MO, divorced, was a nursemaid in a private home; she was a lodger.

Buried in River View Cemetery, Portland, Multnomah OR.

Spouse Find A Grave: 98869215

Marriage: 13 Mar 1909 Portland, Multnomah OR. Divorced 17 Jun 1916 in OR.

“Oregon Daily Journal” (Portland OR) 18 Jun 1916 p 10 – divorced granted yesterday on grounds of desertion to Sadie Deverell from Harry Richard Deverell, who married in 1909 in Linnton OR. Social Security records for 540-10-2941 record her use of Butler surname. (untruthfully) claims this her 2nd marriage (instead of 4th). She lists her parents as David Runyon & Mary Elizabeth Runyon.

Second wife: 1925 – divorced from Harry

Spouse: Charlotte Marie McDonald/MacDonald Brown Matthews Deverell Donovan, reverted to Matthews, 29 May 1883 Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada (according to Canada birth record, 1891 Census of Canada & marriage license with Deverell) or Black Rock MI (according to delayed birth certificate filed in OR 16 Jul 1956 in Multnomah Co. OR) – 29 May 1969 Oregon City, Clackamas Co. OR (on her 86th birthday)

Because she filed her delayed birth certificate claiming a birth in MI, sometimes her birthplace is recorded as Oregon.

Daughter of James Albert McDonald & Amelia Archer, who were born in Canada (according to some records) or James was born in Illinois & Amelia in Michigan (according to Charlotte's revised 1956 birth certificate). On Charlotte's death record, her mother's maiden name is Walker.

James Albert McDonald, son of George & Mary Ann McDonald, was age 21 when he married Amelia Archer, age 18, daughter of Henry Archer, on 8 Jul 1882 in Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada.

In the 1891 Census of Canada for St. Georges Ward, Toronto City, Ontario, Canada, Charlotte M. McDonald was age 8, born 1883 Ontario, to parents b. in Ontario. Her religion was Plymouth Brethren.

Although she claimed on her 1956 delayed birth certificate filing that she had changed her name to Matthews by marriage on 1 Feb 1904, also listing her surname as Matthews on that form, she had married James McB. Brown on that date in Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada. He was age 21, the son of William Brown & Sarah Crosser. James had been born in Port Hope & was employed in paper cutting. Charlotte reported her birthplace as Toronto, York, Ontario, Canada.

In the 1930 census for Portland, Multnomah OR, conducted 4 Apr 1930, Charlotte M. Matthews, 42 MI, father b. Canada (English), mother b. MI, operator, paper box, a widow, emigrated 1921 & naturalized, lived at 80 E. 61st. In her household was son Rodney C. (8 Canada/English, father b. Wales, mother b. MI).

Charlotte's son Rodney Charles (Rod) Matthews was born 31 May 1922 Success, Saskatchewan, Canada & died 1 Apr 1998, a resident of Newport, Lincoln OR. He is listed as a son of Jack J. Matthews & Charlotte M. MacDona--.

On 23 Oct 1950 in Clark Co. WA, Charlotte M. Matthews, age 61, b. MI, widow, with 2 prior marriages, was a housekeeper, resident in Forest Grove OR. Charlotte was the daughter of James McDonald (b. Canada) & Amelia Archer (b. MI) She married James Henry Donovan, age 68, b. WI, divorced, with 2 prior marriages, a farmer. He was the son of Andrew Donovan (b. Canada) & Katherine McDivett (b. WI).

Charlotte and James Donovan divorced 22 May 1953 in Washington Co. OR. He was the plaintiff; the grounds were "cruel and inhuman treatment."

James Henry Donovan was born 22 Mar 1882 Merrill, Lincoln WI & died 14 Jan 1964 Clackamas Co. OR. His mother Catherine Donovan died 8 May 1934 in St. Louis MO & was buried in Merrill WI according to her obituary.

Charlotte reverted to the surname Matthews & is found mentioned in newspapers as Mrs. Charlotte Matthews in Aug 1947 (when her son Rodney married) & Sep 1954 & Dec 1955 when Rodney's children were born.

Her OR death record lists her spouse as John T. Matthews & she as widowed. She died at her home on High St., Oregon City, Clackamas OR. Her birth was recorded as 29 May 1883 in Black Rock MI, born to James MacDonald & Amelia "Walker." The informant was her son Rod C. Matthews. She died of a myocardial infarction.

At the time of her death, her surviving children were Rod Matthews, Richard Matthews & Beatrice L. Scott.

Third wife: 1942 – left Harry her surviving widower

Hengeveld is buried in Lone Fir Pioneer Cemetery, Portland OR (1860-1916), F. 92717248. – John & Sadie Hengeveld divorced in Feb 1937 & she was given custody of their 3 children. 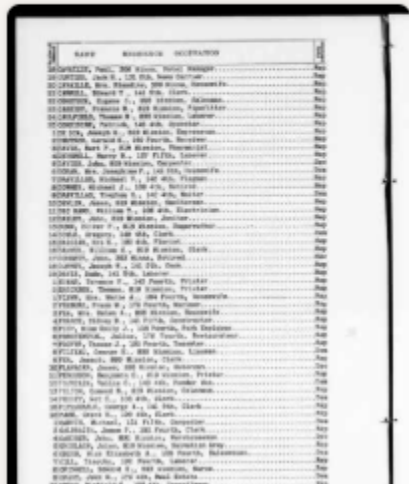
