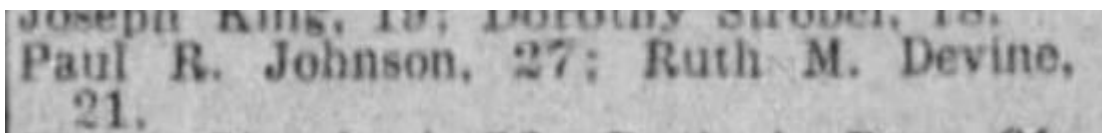

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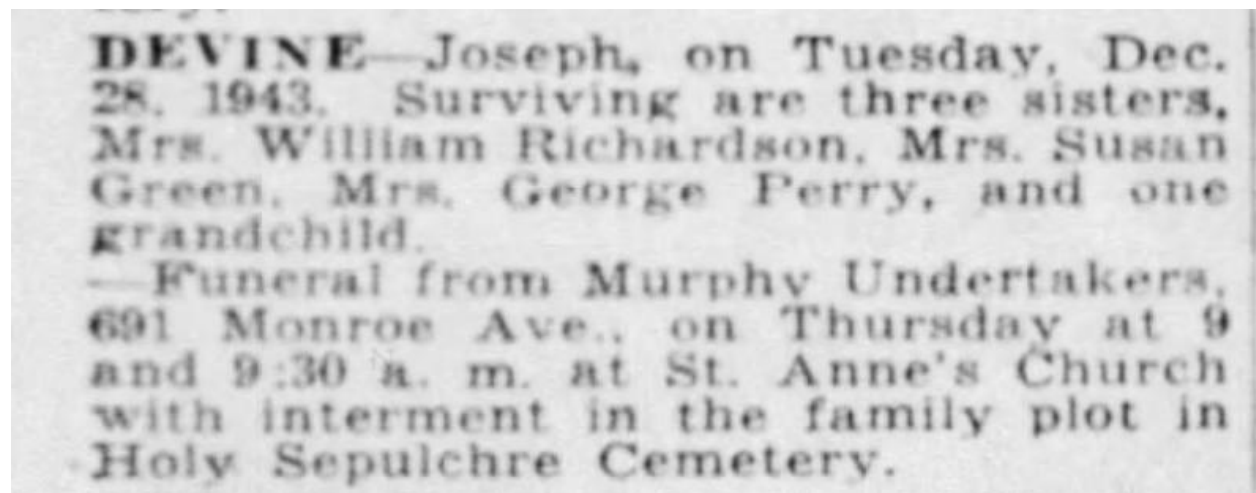

TRAFFIC TOLL IN '43 HITS 26 AS MAN DIES

Death of an elderly Buffalo man in Highland Hospital yesterday morning raised Rochester's traffic death toll for the year to 26, compared with 31 on the same date last year.

The victim, Joseph Devine, 71, was struck by an automobile at St. Paul and Main streets at 3 a. m. Christmas morning by a car driven by a motorist whom police charged with driving while intoxicated, reckless driving and leaving the scene of an accident. The driver, John Lanzalaco, 36, of 183 Otis St., is to be charged with criminal negligence as a result of Devine's death, police said last night.

They said Devine was crossing Main Street with the green light when Lanzalaco's car went through a red light at high speed and ran him down. The car was chased to Front Street, where it went to the wrong side of the street and struck a hydrant, then to Andrews and to North Water, where Lanzalaco was captured by policeman Milton Wahl and Detective Lester Louth.

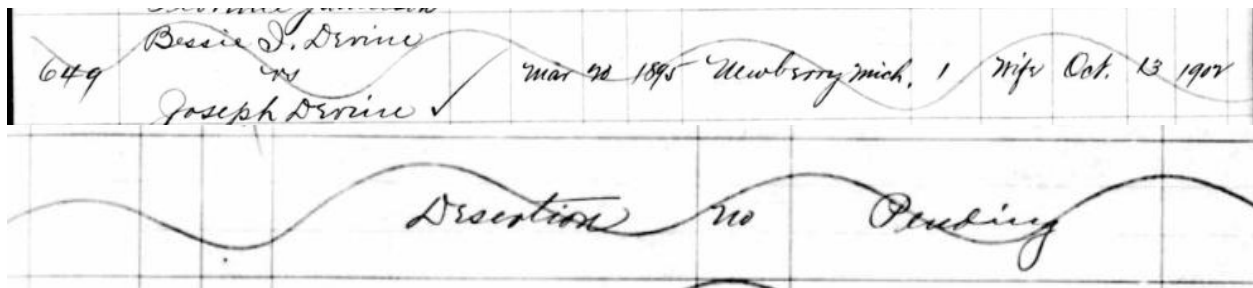

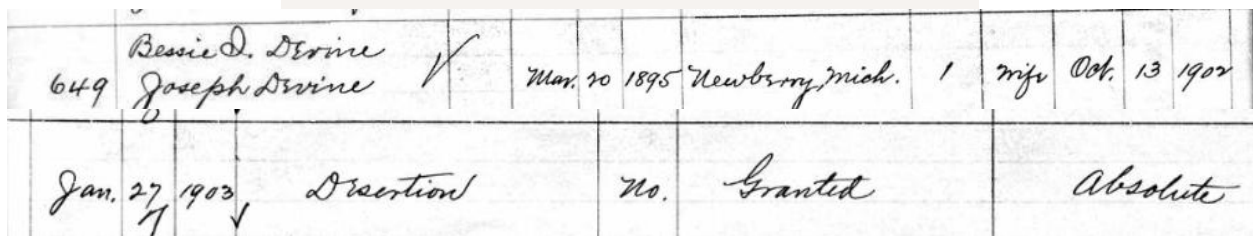

TWO ARE DROWNED

Their Launch Was Capsized in a Heavy Sea.

Third Member of Party Rescued from Overturned Craft in Exhausted Condition.

(Special to The Evening Press.)

Marquette, Aug. 8.—Details of a double drowning in Whitefish lake have been received from Luce county. The victims were Michael Neazor and a man named Owen. Robert McMinn was the third member of a party attempting to cross the lake in a small boat. A heavy sea was rolling at the time and the boat capsized. Owen sank at once, but Neazor and McMinn managed to get hold of the upturned craft and they clung to it for a considerable length of time. Neazor finally became exhausted and bidding his companion goodbye let go his hold and sank beneath the waves.

Parties on shore finally sighted the overturned boat and a launch put out to the rescue. McMinn was in a completely exhausted condition and was just about to give up. Neazor was a former resident of Newberry, having at one time been employed there as section foreman on the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic railway. The bodies of the men have not yet been recovered.

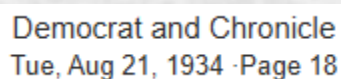

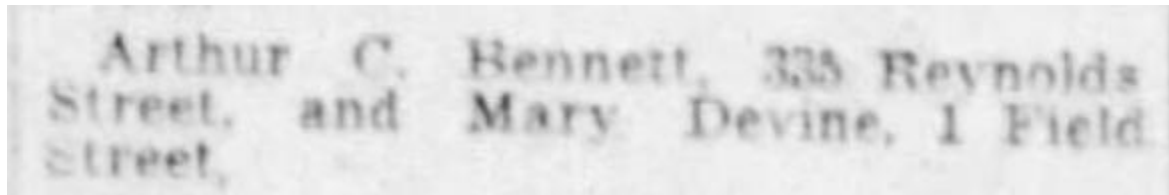

In the 1915 NY state census for Niagara Falls, Niagara Co. NY, Joseph M. Devine, 43 US, electrician lived with wife "Bessie" (i.e. Bridget), age 31 US, housewife & their daughter Mary E. (4 US) at 530 Seventh St.

Bridget Devine apparently died in Buffalo, Erie NY on 25 Dec 1917.

In the 1920 census for Buffalo, Erie NY, conducted 22 Jan 1920 (line 33), Joseph M. Devine, 47 NY, parents b. NY, widowed, was an electrician for a telegraph company. He was a lodger.

In 1940, Joseph M. Devine (68 NY, widower) was an inmate in the Monroe County (NY) Infirmary & Home for the Aged in Brighton, Monroe NY. Listed on line 21, he had been in the same institution in 1935. This census was conducted 9 Apr 1940.

Died at age 73 on 28 Dec 1943, three days after being hit as a pedestrian crossing the street on a green light at 3 a.m. on Christmas morning. John (Giovanni) Lanzalaco, age 36, ran a red light at high speed at St. Paul & Main streets, hit Devine, then sped off & hit a fire hydrant on the wrong side of the street before proceeding to Andrews & North Water

streets where he was arrested & charged with driving while intoxicated, reckless driving & leaving the scene of an accident. "Rochester (NY) Democrat & Chronicle" 29 Dec 1943 p 23)
