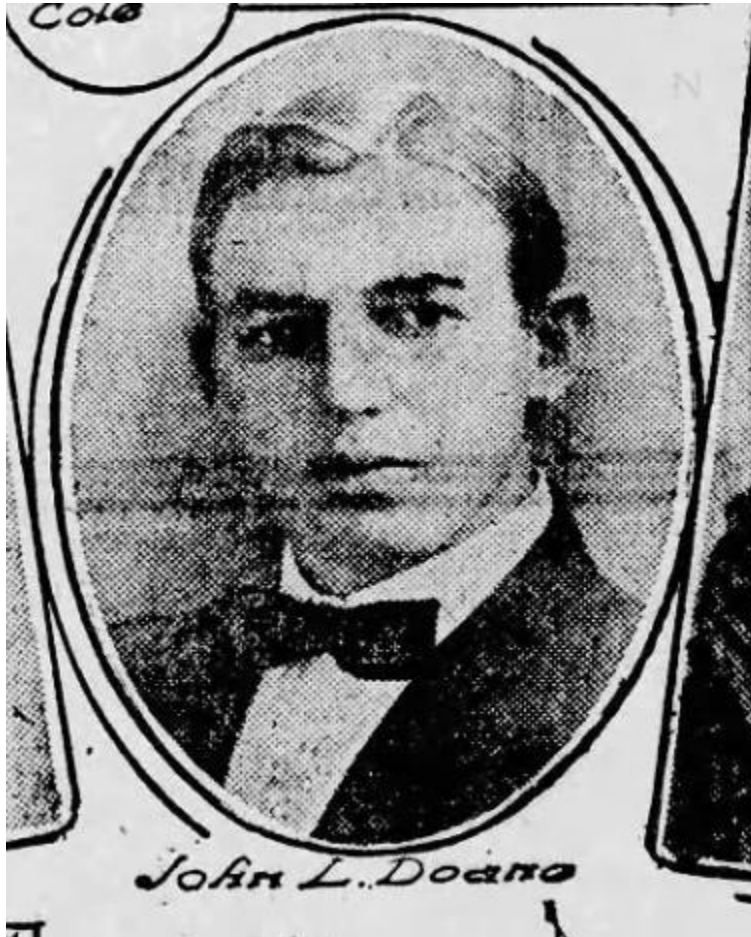

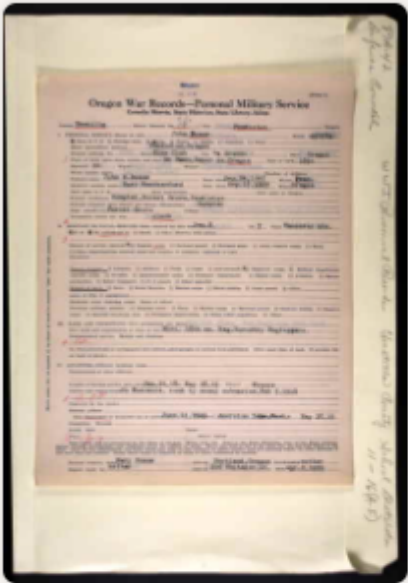

John L. Doane, of 12540 SE Powell Blvd., died Sunday. His funeral will be Thursday at 2:30 p.m. at A. J. Rose & Son, funeral directors.

He was born March 4, 1894 at MacEwen and had been employed as a machinist and warehouseman until his retirement. He was a veteran of Army service during World War I and survived the torpedoed troopship Tuscania.

Mr. Doane was a member of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Survivors include his widow Mabel; one son, Perry; one daughter, Mrs. Miriam Renwick, of Beaverton; two brothers, Leslie, of Portland, and Roscoe, of Chehalis Wash.; two sisters, Annie Allen, of Cornelius, and Alice Goldrainer; seven grandchildren.

FEW MEN INJURED

Tuscania Patients Soon Out of Irish Hospitals.

TOWNSFOLK KIND HOSTS

Disabled Americans All Comfortable and in Good Spirits and Make Cheerful Acknowledgment of Many Courtesies.

AN IRISH PORT, Feb. 9.—The correspondent of the Associated Press, who visited the sick and injured Americans confined in hospitals in two widely separated Irish seaports today, found them progressing favorably. In fact many of the men had been discharged from the hospital and had rejoined their comrades in camp.

There was only one dangerously ill out of a total of 100 in five hospitals—a lumberjack from the Northwest, who was suffering from pneumonia as a result of exposure.

There was a remarkably small number of injured men, probably not more than a dozen. They received fractures of legs or arms by getting caught between the lifeboats. The majority of the men are suffering from mumps, measles or pneumonia, of which there were many cases aboard at the time the Tuscania was torpedoed.

The correspondent found the Americans comfortable and cheerful. The townspeople at both places have done and are still doing everything to assist the local authorities in giving the best possible attention to the Americans who are loud in their praise of the courtesies extended on every hand.

The entire record of the 6th battalion is a most creditable one, and I want to have your men know that the character of their work in France is appreciated."

I wish you all a pleasant voyage and success in taking up the duties of civil life."

CLINGER RUSHED TO HOSPITAL IN PORTLAND BY AIR

**Gorst Plane Used to Trans-
port Injured Boy From
Bandon**

**TRIP TAKES TWO
HOURS 18 MINUTES**

**Bandon Pilot Makes Flight
To Save Life of Marsh-
field Boy**

The latest developments in Portland were that an operation was planned for this morning and that Mr. Clinger's condition was about the same. He is rational at times.

BANDON, May 16. — L. V. "Nippy" Clinger, 21-year-old Marshfield boy, whose fifth cervical vertebrae was broken in a fall into three feet of water at the Wecoma Baths Friday night, was taken to the Good Samaritan hospital in Portland in a Pacific Air Transport company Fokker monoplane at 6:42 p. m. yesterday and arrived at the Vancouver airport at 9 p. m. in the time of two hours and 18 minutes. Clinger has been paralyzed since his fall Friday evening.

Pilot Vernon Bookwalter, son of Mrs. M. J. Bookwalter of Bandon, Mechanic Lon Brennon, and a nurse, Miss Wilma Lett of the Leep hospital in Bandon, accompanied Mr. Clinger.

The trip from Vancouver, where the plane left within ten minutes after receiving the message, was made in two hours and four minutes. Pilot Bookwalter had expected that the return trip would require a longer time as the wind was against him.

Speed 120 Miles

The plane is capable of making 120 miles an hour but the average speed is 100 miles, said Pilot Bookwalter, who makes the air mail run between Portland and Medford. The engine is of the Wright whirlwind type, that which the Americans who plan to make the trans-Atlantic flight will use. It is capable of flying 500 miles without stopping for fuel. The plane has accommodations for carrying five passengers in addition to the mail.

The passenger seats were removed and a bed on the floor made for the convenience of the injured boy. The mail compartment, which is removable, was not taken out.

Clinger was taken from the hospital to the beach in a truck from which Alvin Combs, John Powell, Victor Tholix, Captain Joseph L. Nutter and J. A. Hemingway bore him on a stretcher down the beach and into the plane. They were assisted by State Traffic Officer C. C. Williams.

Semi-conscious

Clinger was in a semi-conscious condition and suffered no pain although no opiates had been administered to him since the night before. He recognized his mother, brother and niece who were at the beach to watch his departure.

Pilot Bookwalter, who was on a month's vacation, was at the Vancouver landing field preparing his own plane for a trip to Bandon to visit his mother when the call came. He immediately took a company plane and started within ten minutes. He plans to take his mother, Mrs. M. J. Bookwalter of Bandon, east in his own plane this summer.

Clinger was operated on Sunday morning by Dr. William Harroun of Portland and his organs resumed their functioning.

3 Survivors Of Tuscania Recall Tragedy In 1918

Ten years ago Sunday the Tuscania was sunk in the North Channel off the coast of Ireland. Sunday evening over 1000 troops aboard the British vessel heard the thud of the torpedo as their ship was struck and heard the screams of hundreds of men who were drowned on that same night.

Of those two hundred or more who drowned, one was a Coos Bay man, Sidney Bernitt. A monument raised in his memory is today in Sunset cemetery on the Coquille highway.

Of those hundreds who were saved were John L. Doane of Marshfield, head of the Business Men's Assurance Co., in this territory; W. G. Robertson, of the Empire Development Co., at Empire, and Bill Curtis of the Ekblad Hardware store.

John Doane while struggling in the waters, was picked up by a lifeboat and for weeks he lay between life and death in the hospital at Larne, Ireland. Robertson and Curtis were taken ashore by torpedo boats, Curtis having to be taken to the hospital suffering from pneumonia and shock. Robertson fared better, suffering little from the exposure and terrible shock.

The day still lives in the memory of the three men who recalled it today after ten years.

For Bulk Prices for Milk

PORTLAND—To the Editor: From a milk consumer's standpoint I should like to express a housewife's views on the attempt that is being made to raise the price of milk.

I am informed that this summer milk delivered in Chicago was 21 cents a quart, but if it was purchased at the store there was a 2-cent differential, making it 19 cents. Milk was also put out in two-quart containers and gallon containers at still further reductions, the two quarts costing 36 cents, or 18 cents a quart, and the gallons costing 64 cents, or 16 cents a quart.

In Portland there is no difference in the price of milk whether purchased at the store or delivered to the home—20 cents for a single quart or 39 cents for two quarts. Instead of a raise in the price of milk, why should not similar packaging be marketed in this city and the housewife afforded the benefit of a reduced price if she walks to the market and carries it home, thus obviating the delivery charge? In Washington, D. C., there is a 3-cent differential between that purchased in the market and that delivered to the home.

We have three small grandchildren under 7 years living in our home. The item of milk is of no small concern. I believe there are many, many other homes with small children that would be able to purchase more milk if we had similar packaging and price differentials between cash and carry and delivery that obtain in other cities.

John N. Doane Was An Indian Fighter

**Veteran of the Bannock War Could
Trace His Ancestry Directly Back
to the Mayflower's Passengers.**

Forest Grove, Or., Dec. 1.—In the death of John N. Doane passes a veteran of the Bannock Indian war and a man who could trace his family history directly back to the Mayflower. The Doanes took a prominent part in the early formation of this government and the late Forest Grove Indian war veteran was a relative. He was

the son of a Methodist preacher and was born 69 years ago at Springfield, Pa., and came to Oregon 36 years ago. Before coming to this city he lived in eastern Oregon. The funeral sermon was preached yesterday by Rev. J. Francis Ashley with burial in the local cemetery.

He is survived by a wife, two daughters, Alice M., at home, and Mrs. Annie L. Allen, living in Forest Grove, and four sons, Earl M. Doane, Salt Lake City; Rosco B. Doane, La Grande; John L. Doane, at home, and Leslie L. Doane, at Beaverton.

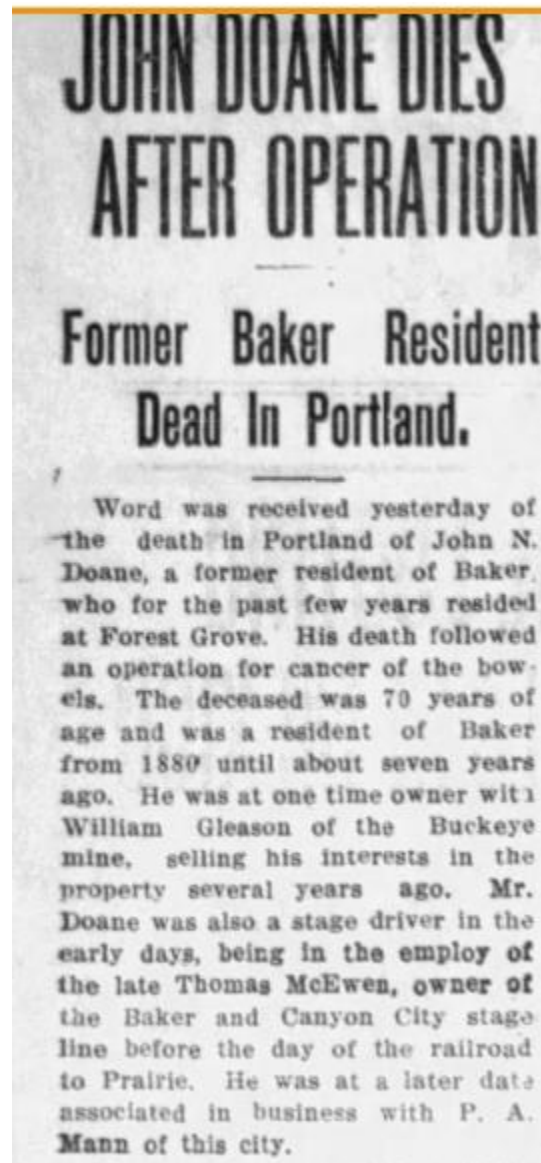

Note: The Doane family has a family association which holds family reunions in OR. According to newspaper articles, they are not descended from a 1620 "Mayflower" passenger, but from pilgrim John Doane who came to Plymouth Colony MA in 1629. Family members spell their surname also as Doan, Donne & Dunne. Famous family members include Nehemiah Doane, a Methodist minister who was one of the first presidents of Willamette University, and Gustavus Doane, a member of the Washburn-Doane Expedition, which explored & helped establish Yellowstone as America's first national park.

The "Bannock Indian" wars referenced in his father's obituary refer to the Bannock Indian War, fought in 1878 between the U.S. military against the Bannock and Paiute in Idaho & southeastern OR, which resulted in the Native Americans being interned at the Yakima Indian Reservation.



Mr. Doane was married to Molly Weatherford, daughter of the late Mrs. Thomas M. Britten. A sister-in-law, Mrs. L. H. Gardner of this city, and Byron Weatherford of Sumpter, a brother-in-law, are the only relatives living in this vicinity. Mr. Doane is survived by his wife, four sons and two daughters. The funeral and interment will take place at Forest Grove tomorrow.

was elected a Justice of the Peace while a resident of Euclid, and in 1810, became one of the Associate Judges of the county. The name Doane was often wrongly pronounced among the early settlers in and about Cleveland, and Mr. Doane thought to obtain a more correct and general pronunciation of the name by omitting the last letter, making it Doan. Two of his sons, Seth and Timothy, adopted the same method of spelling, while his other son John, kept to the old way. Thus it is that the descendants of the brothers Seth and Timothy write their name Doan while those of John add an *e*, after the original manner. (See letter of Timothy Doane Crocker in *Annals of the Early Settlers' Association*, Cleveland, 1881, No. 2, p. 69.)

MRS. EMMA DOANE PLUNGES TO DEATH

Oregon City, Jan. 15—Despondent over ill health, Emma A. Doane, 47, plunged into the icy Tualatin river from the Stafford-Willamette covered bridge about 5:25 o'clock yesterday morning and died of shock and exposure shortly after being taken from the river by state police.

Mrs. Doane, who had lived west of Willamette on the Stafford road for several months, left the family home without the knowledge of her husband, Leslie L. Doane, who is employed by a Portland dairy.

Tracks found by officers showed that she went directly to the bridge and leaped into the river. Her screams awoke J. W. Schuler, a neighbor, who summoned state police.

State Trooper Secanti responded, and with Schuler's aid, lifted the woman to the shore. Death was immediate. She had drifted about 100 yards down stream from the bridge and was lying in shallow water when found by the officer.

Mrs. Doane, who is survived by the widower and a son, Louis Leslie Doane, 21, of Salem, had formerly lived in Baker.

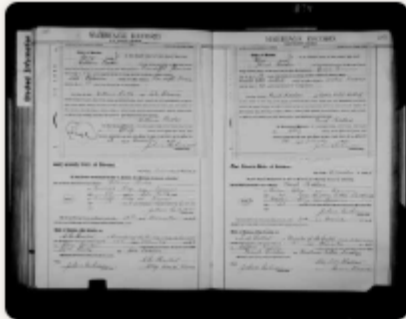

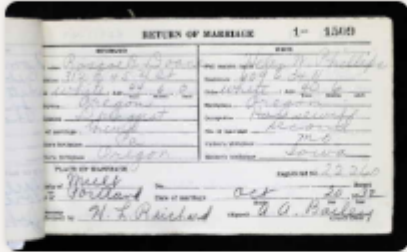

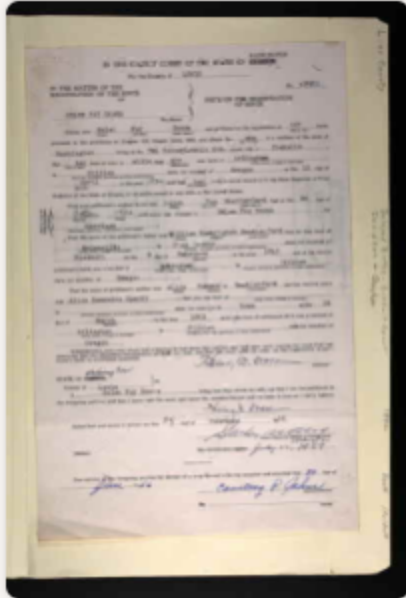

“Roseburg (OR) News-Review” 26 Feb 1918 p 3 – hospitalized at Larne, Tuscania survivor John L. Doane, 206 Whitaker St., Portland OR

“La Grande (OR) Observer” 31 Aug 1915 p 5 – Roscoe Doane, for several years a druggist here, accompanied by his mother Mrs. John Doane & sister Alice, left this morning for Pendleton OR, their future home, to which they have shipped their household goods.

He was flown to Portland for care in 2 hours & 18 minutes. The policy provides \$100 a month in case of disability.

“Coos Bay World” 6 Aug 1927 p 5 – Mr. & Mrs. John Doane left this morning by car for Portland where she will spend 2 weeks with a specialist. They took their children, Miriam & Perry, with them.

“Coos Bay World” 23 Sep 1927 p 1 – John Doane said that about a year ago he had written a \$1,000 life & disability policy on Robert Fromm, the 12-year-old of Port Orford whose left arm was chewed off by a mountain lion at a circus in Port Orford yesterday.

"Coos Bay Times" (Marshfield OR) 6 Feb 1928 p 1 - 3 survivors recall Tuscania. John L. Doane of Marshfield, head of Business Men's Assurance Co. in the territory, was picked from waters by lifeboat, hospitalized "between life and death" in Larne, Ireland. Other 2 were W.C. Robertson & Bill Curtis. [original & "25 years later" copied above]

"Coos Bay World" 29 Apr 1930 p 1 – John L. Doane, formerly of Marshfield, a salesman for Business Men's Insurance Co. of Portland, won a suit of clothes for the high sales lead in the organization last month, and he is in 1st place this month. He works in the Morgan Building.
