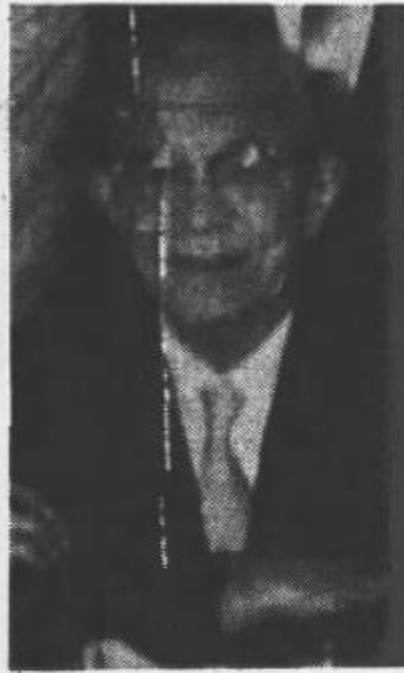

Hilton Doege, 71, dies after long illness

Hilton A. Doege, age 71, 368 Maynard Street, city, passed away at St. Joseph's Hospital Sunday morning at nine o'clock following a lingering illness.

Mr. Doege was born December 16, 1894 in Almond, Wisconsin. At about the age of two the family moved to Stanley until 1915, when they came to Chippewa Falls.

In April of 1917, Mr. Doege enlisted in the National Guard and served overseas in World War I. He was aboard the Tuscania when it was torpedoed and sunk on February 5, 1918. After his honorable discharge in May, 1919 he returned to Chippewa Falls. He was united in marriage to Lydia Dubberke at the Zion Lutheran Church.

Mr. Doege worked as an automobile mechanic until 1926, when he started the Doege Garage at 33 East Willow Street. In 1941, he sold the garage and worked for the Chippewa County Highway Department for a short time. In 1943, he bought into a partnership with Don Griffin in the business known as Griffin-Doege Auto Parts. Because of ill health Mr. Doege retired in November, 1963.

Mr. Doege was a member of the Zion Lutheran Church where he held the offices of President, Elder, member of the Stewardship Committee, and had served on the Building Committee. He served for many years on

the Chippewa County Board of Supervisors from the First Ward.

He was a member of the American Legion, Tuscania Survivors, the Last Man's Club, and the United Commercial Travelers.

Mr. Doege is survived by his wife, Lydia; his mother, Mrs. Helena Doege; one daughter Mrs. Ward (Dorothy) Liddell; one son, Robert Doege, and eight grandchildren, all of this city. He was preceded in death by his father, two sisters and one brother.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock at the Zion Lutheran Church with Rev. A. Ira Grimm officiating.

Friends may call at the Hogseth-Pederson Funeral Chapel from two p.m. Tuesday until Wednesday noon. The remains will then be taken to the church to lie in state until funeral time.

Interment will be in the family lot in Forest Hill Cemetery.

To those who registered on June 5th, a word or two of information may be said at this time.

1. Your draft number will not be the number on your registration certificate, but the serial number given your registration card in the county series, which begins with number one and ends with 3148.

2nd. The numbers will be drawn by lot in Washington and as soon as the local board receives advice of the numbers drawn the names of those whose numbers are drawn will be given to the press for publication and at the same time a notice will be mailed to the person drawn at the address on his registration card. This notice will state on what day and place you are to appear for physical examination.

3rd. Exemptions from draft will be made on claims presented, to the Local Board, supported by affidavits. This varies for the different classes of exemptions, and each person drawn will have to inform himself of his individual exemption.

4th. There will be two boards to handle the exemptions. The local board will handle the physical and dependants exemption. The district board will handle the occupational exemptions and also appeals from the local board.

5th. Exemptions, after a physical examination has found you fit for military service, is made mostly on affidavits. It is therefore important that these affidavits state the absolute facts otherwise you become liable under Sections 37, 125 or 137 of the Criminal Code of the United States. It is well in this connection to call the attention of Notary Public and Justice of the Peace to these sections that they may not become liable under them.

6th. Absolute fairness will be used by the boards, but no misrepresentations will be tolerated.

CHRISTENSEN WINS IN RIFLE CONTEST

**Pangborn Scores Highest But

Although second in scoring, W. C. Christensen, Chippewa Falls High school agriculture instructor, was Wednesday night awarded the automobile spotlight donated by Peter J. Pangborn to the winner of the Chippewa Falls Rifle club indoor shoot. Mr. Pangborn topped the list of marksmen with a total of 227 but refused to take the prize and passed it on to Mr. Christensen, whose score was 216. Third place in the match went to Lawrence Vincent with a score of 208.

Hilton A. Doege, who at the end of the second round of the shoot led the list, dropped to fourth place with a total of 178 when he made the low score of thirty in the final shots. The shoot was held in the Battery C armory basement.

The principal reason for the match Mr. Pangborn said today, was to discover the ability of the various members. Those who shot with high scores will be placed in one class and those who did not do so well will be placed in other classes.

Equipment for the outdoor rifle range which will be set up by the club at the Rod and Gun clubhouse this summer will be received within a few days, Mr. Pangborn made known today. When the club has completed its range it is planned to use both heavy rifles and twenty-two specials. Plans to allow women to take part in the club shoots are also being made.

State Tuscania Survivors To Meet Here On Feb. 6



Wisconsin survivors of the troop ship *Tuscania*, which was sunk by a torpedo fired from a German submarine during World War One, will hold a reunion in Chippewa Falls on Saturday, February 6, it was announced today by William Gereaux.

The *Tuscania* was sunk 11 miles off the coast of Scotland on the evening of February 5, 1918, as the 2,100 soldiers aboard were at mess, or awaiting their turns to eat.

Immediately there was a rush for the life boats, some of which worked and some did not, but out of the 2,100 soldiers, aboard all but 213 were rescued. How many of the crew were lost is not now recorded.

Of the 213 men lost, three were from Chippewa Falls — Earle Weisenberg, Art Harvey and Claire Metzenberg.

The survivors, picked up by convoy ships and life boats and other craft, were taken to Ireland, Scotland where they recuperated before

continuing their trip to France.

The units aboard the *Tuscania* included the 20th Engineers, the 107th Supply Train and the 107th Engineers train, all of the 32nd division.

The reunion meetings will be held at the American Legion Club, with a banquet to be held at the Empire Café. At 5:45 o'clock in the afternoon, the hour on which the torpedo struck the *Tuscania*, a memorial service for those who were lost will be held on the new bridge over the Chippewa River.

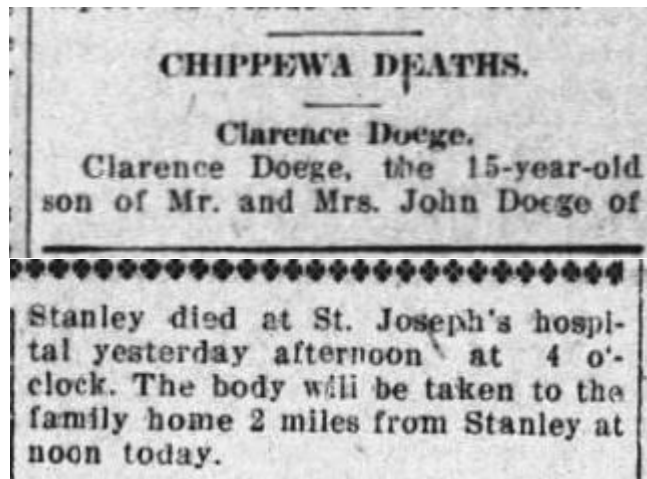

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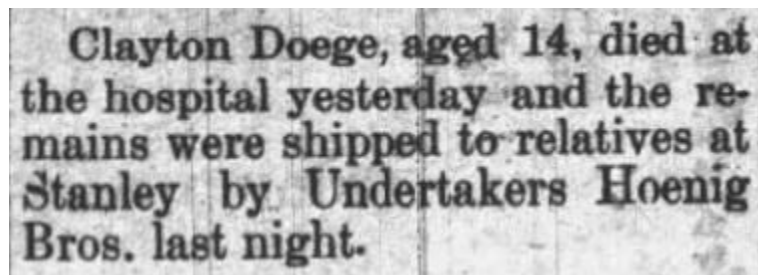
