Adam J. Zielke, 80, of 1512 Beech St., died today at 12:35 a.m. at Mercy Medical Center, following an extended illness.

He was born in West Rosendale on Oct. 12, 1892, son of Julius and Pauline Zielke, and was married here to Amy Clark on Oct. 17, 1925.

Mr. Zielke had been employed at Paine Lumber Co. before retirement. He served with the Army in Company F in World War I, and was a survivor of a torpedoed troop ship, receiving a distinguished service citation on discharge. He was a member of Bethlehem Lutheran Church and charter member of the local post of Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Surviving are his widow; one son, Donald Zielke, Oshkosh; one sister, Miss Eva Zielke, Pasadena, Calif.; and three grandchildren.

Services will be held Thursday at 1:30 p.m. at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, with the Rev. Walter Moll officiating. Burial will be in Ellenwood Cemetery.

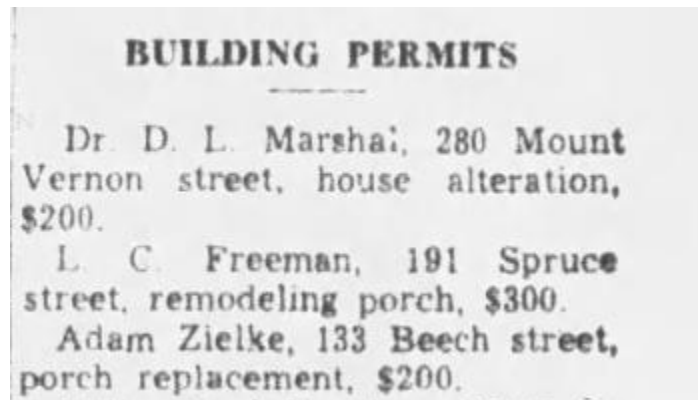

Adam Zielke, 65, of 154 Beech St., was seriously hurt when his auto struck a Soo Line passenger train at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the Light Street crossing.

Relatives today reported that he suffered lacerations of the head and an ear, and X-rays were to be taken for possible head and chest injuries. He also suffered shock.

Oshkosh police said the entire front end of Zielke's auto was damaged when hit by the passenger train while headed north on Light Street. Train crewmen said he apparently failed to see the flasher warning signals in time to stop.

Zielke could remember nothing of the accident, officers said.

Not Fair to Require Repayment of Relief

To the Editor:

I do not believe that it is fair for the City of Oshkosh to force the people who received relief during the depression in the early thirties to pay it back or take it out of the estate. It was a national emergency. There was no work to be had and those who had work were fortunate to stay off the relief rolls. Also did not the State and Federal governments furnish part of the relief funds?

Since then a lot of people have died and some have moved out of the city and a good share will never have anything to collect from. But the people who worked hard and scrimped and saved and finally got a home and a little money for old age, those are the ones who they want to collect from, even after they are dead.

I think that money should go to the children as they helped earn some of it, instead of the city fund where some of it has been squandered. Also it was not a loan, it was doled out. They gave us what they saw fit, although we could not use some of it and some of it was not fit to use. In the few cases where people paid back voluntarily that was their wish and I think there were few who did.

But the people who had it taken out of their estate, I think the city should pay them back. A lot of us who were on relief at that time have been paying taxes before and after the depression. Furthermore, I would like to know what cities besides Oshkosh have collected or are trying to collect for the relief that the people received in those days.
