All men registered for military service have been notified to hold themselves in readiness to appear before boards which will conduct examinations and consider exemption claims, in an order issued yesterday by the war department. Detailed instructions regarding the procedure to be followed have been prepared but are being withheld pending the completion of preparations in several delinquent states. The first draft will be for 687,000 men, to fill the regular army and national guard and provide 500,000 for the new army. About 50,000 men are needed in the regular army to bring that branch to full war strength, with 130,000 necessary for the national guard. Quotas are being assigned to the different states, based on population and registration. Word has been received in Washington that a number of states are ready for the draft, while all others are completing the detail. It is believed that the drawing of the men will take place during the latter part of the present week—possibly Saturday.

REPORTED YESTERDAY.

Man Summoned With Last Batch for Examination Failed to Get Notice.

Henry E. Dresher, a resident of Brinnon, reported to the sheriff's office yesterday and was later put through the physical examination by Dr. L. T. Seavey. Dresher was included in the list of men summoned for examination on November 5th, but failed to receive the notice sent to him by the local board. He hastened to the city as soon as he learned that his number had been reached. Dresher is a logger and a fine specimen of physical vigor. He made no exemption claim, but expressed a desire to see service in the marines, if possible, having a preference for that branch of service. While it is believed certain that he can have the opportunity, the failure of the military authorities to make a report concerning the status of the Jefferson county contingent at Camp Lewis will prevent this until such time as the local board is informed he is not needed to fill the quota demanded by the first draft.

All men examined not needed to fill the quota have been given the right to enlist in whatever branch of the service they choose, this offer being open until December 15th. This is a special ruling, replacing the former one which decreed that after a registrant had been notified by the local board to appear for examination he had no option but to enter the new national army.

Failure of the authorities to make a final report on the county quota is working hardship on several of the boys examined on November 5th. They have a desire to enlist in other branches, and a couple have been given an opportunity to receive training which will prove very useful, in addition to giving them a better rank in the navy. They are anxious to go, but this privilege cannot be extended to them until the local board has received formal notice of the status of the county contingent at the training camp. It is known that a shortage must be supplied, but the number has never been intimated by the authorities. In the meantime those on the eligible list cannot be released until it is certain that the quota is complete. Earl Thomas and Sid Wilmot of this city are among those in the last class who desire to go into other branches than the army. Both have had training which will fit them for positions where they can utilize this and fill technical jobs. Thomas is a gas engineer, with steam experience, while Wilmot is a chauffeur.

MRS. CRAWFORD TAKEN BY DEATH

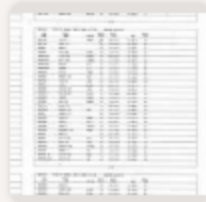

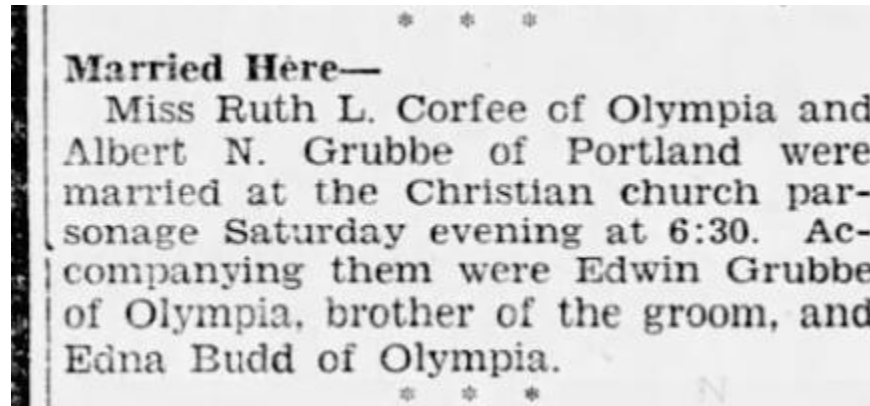

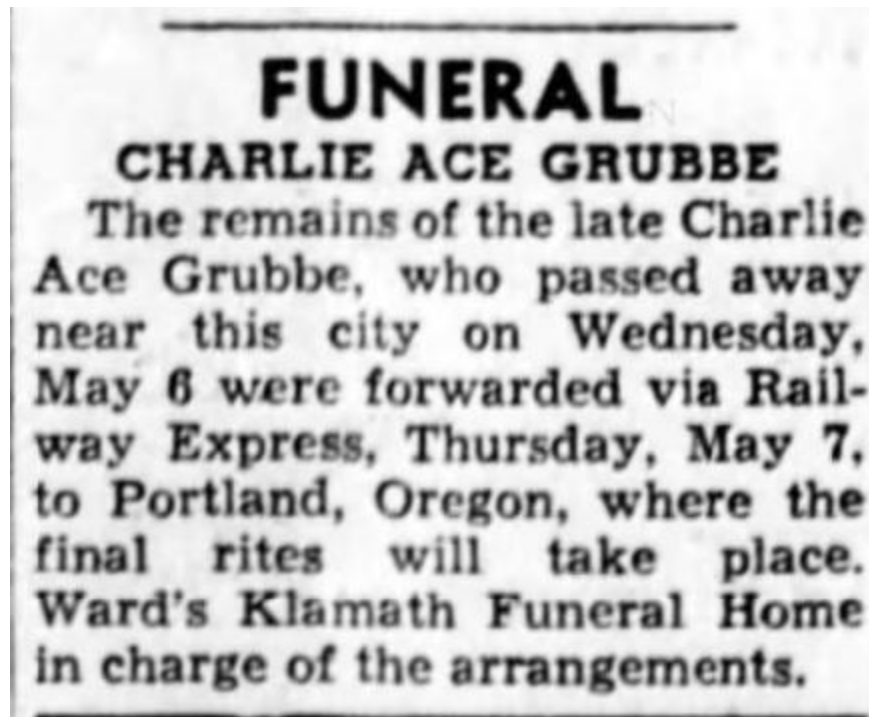

The remains rest in Ward's Klamath funeral home, 925 High street. The notice of the funeral arrangements will be announced later.

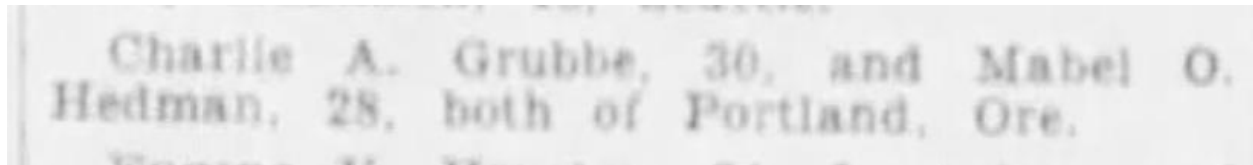

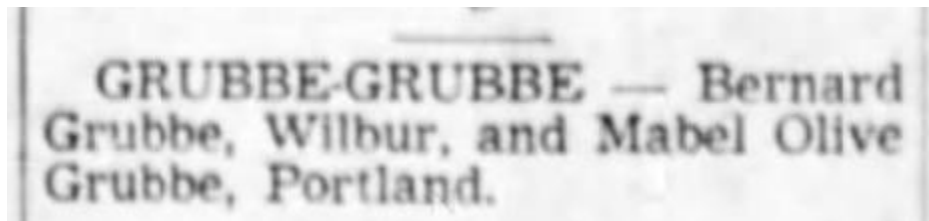

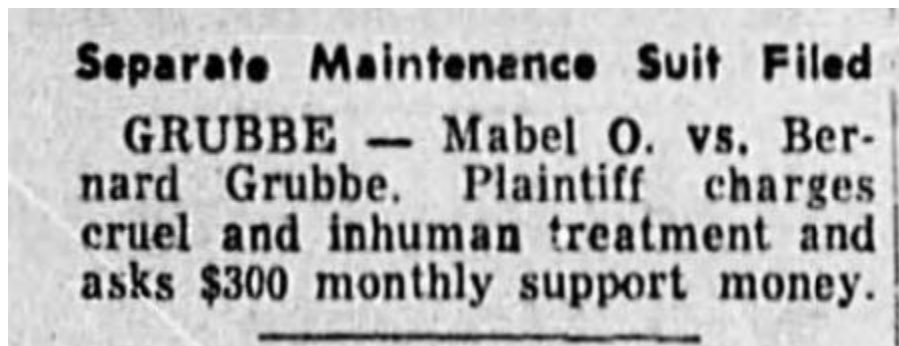
Seattle WA – marriage license with Charlie Grubbe

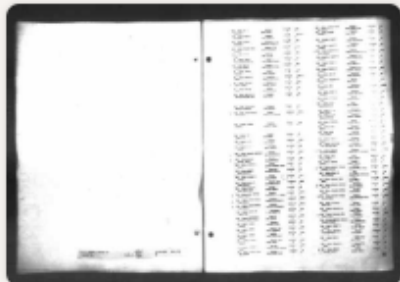

MI – 30 Sep 1961 OR. - WWI veteran. – Married Cecil Jones Waller on 26 Apr 1926 in Tacoma, Pierce WA in a double-wedding ceremony with his sister Clara Dresher & Roy Phillips. Cecil filed for divorce 2 months later, on 10 Jul 1926. This claimed their marriage occurred in Montesano WI. The divorce was granted 21 Aug 1926 in Chehalis, Lewis WA. – Henrietta Cecil Jones was born 7 Mar 1908 Centralia, Lewis WA, the daughter of Stephen Jones & Julia Gentry. She had married Joseph B. Waller; they had 2 daughters & divorced in Jul 1925. After her marriage to Dresher, “Cecil Waller” married Jesse Damitz, resident of Pe Elle WA, age 31, logger, son of Fred Damitz & Caroline Bigelow, on 11 Dec 1928 in Chehalis, Lewis WA. She reports this is her 3rd marriage. Cecil Damitz filed for divorce from Jesse Damitz (1897-1935) in Jun 1932 in Chehalis, Lewis WA, claiming she was “enamored” of another man. - In 1940, Cecil Smith (32 WA) is living in Waco, McLennan TX with husband Walter E. Smith (44 MT), attendant at a veterans’ hospital). In the household are 3 Smith children & 2 Waller children: Gertrude (15 WA) & Lora (15 WA). They had lived in the same place in 1935. The census was conducted 9 Apr 1940 – Walter Ernest Smith was born 7 Nov 1895 in Hall MT, the son of Gordon Smith & Adelaide Joyce; he died 3 Mar 1968 in New Braunfels, Comal TX. His body was donated to the Baylor University Medical School. Walter had served a prison sentence in Fort McNeil Federal Penitentiary WA in 1928 for counterfeiting. – Albert married Ellen Marie Muetz (1911-1993, F: 599445) two times: once on 13 Oct 1934 Vancouver, Clark WA and also 17 Aug 1942 Weiser Co. ID. In their 2nd marriage, Albert was age 46, Ellen was age 31; both indicated they were married previously. – Ellen was the daughter of Fred E. Muetz (F: 69601635) & Minnie May Connradt (spelling?) (F: 107443322) Resident of Portland OR in 1952. - Buried in Willamette National Cemetery, Portland, Multnomah OR. F: 599444
- **Clara Lora Dresher Phillips**, 2 Apr 1900 Turtle Lake, Polk WI – Jun 1972 Deming, Whatcom WA. – Apparently the “Bertha Dresher” of the 1900 census. - Wife of Roy Mitchell Phillips (1893-1973, F: 129376927) whom she married 1 Jul 1922 in Chehalis, Lewis WA. - Resident of Deming WA in Apr 1971. – Died of leukemia. - Buried in Greenacres Memorial Park, Ferndale, Whatcom WA. F: 8688108
- **Laura Christina Dresher Sherwood**, 16 May 1909 WI – 25 Feb 1990 Centralia, Lewis WA. - Wife of Earl Jack Sherwood (1905-1970, F: 13262987) whom she married 26 Apr 1926 in Tacoma, Pierce WA in a double-wedding ceremony with her brother Albert Dresher & his 1st wife, Cecil Jones Waller. - Resident of Centralia WA in Apr 1971. - Husband’s obituary: “Centralia Daily Chronicle” 22 Jun 1970- p 2 – Earl J. Sherwood of Centralia WA d. in a Centralia hospital on 21 Jun 1970 at age 64. Born 4 Jul 1905 Fort Worth TX; resident of Centralia past 15 years. Employed in railroad construction.
