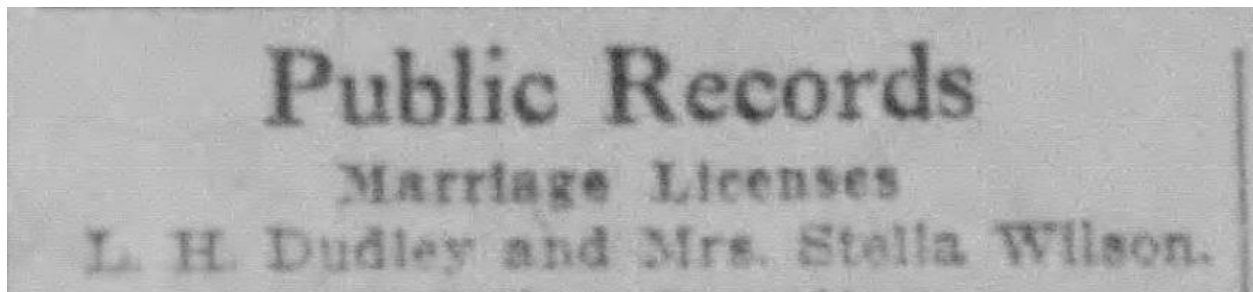

Dudley, at Camp Dixon on South Scurry street, was killed instantly, and his friend, Monroe Ashley 18, residing 311 Fourth street, received lacerations about the scalp and body bruises when the open model T Ford touring car in which they were riding, overturned in the 1600 block on South Scurry street at 12:30 Monday morning. It was not known late Monday afternoon whether the car struck another, or Overturned after striking an object.

HEARS CRASH

J. P. Utlay, residing at 1606 Scurry, told officers he was awakened by a crash in front of his home around 12:30 and later Ashley knocked on his door to tell him of the accident. He immediately called the officers and notified an Eberly ambulance, who responded quickly. Upon reaching the scene, attendants said they found Washburn's body near the overturned car, and was partly covered with shattered glass. It was believed that Washburn was thrown through the windshield of the car, and struck the pavement violently. His face and head were badly mangled. His neck was broken.

Doesn't Remember

Ashley, who was not seriously injured, told a Herald reporter Monday morning at his home that he didn't remember anything about the accident. He appeared dazed and suffering from shock as he talked to a reporter early this morning. Ashley was treated at Big Spring hospital soon after the accident. Two stitches were required to sew up a scalp wound, Dr. M. H. Bennett, who attended him, reported. The doctor said the injuries were not serious.

"I don't remember a thing about the accident," Ashley said. "I don't even remember who was driving or which way we were going. I do remember going to church earlier in the evening with my friend Washburn in Jones Valley. We stayed at church only a short time, and then went riding in Washburn's car," he said.

Discovers Accident

Harvey Williamson, returning from work in the oil field early Sunday morning, discovered the accident before officers arrived. He immediately notified a doctor, who in turn, also notified the Eberly ambulance of the accident.

Mrs. A. M. Underwood, also residing in the duplex apartment at 1606 Scurry, said she was awakened by the crash. Mr. Underwood was not at home at the time.

Car Headed Toward Town

Officers, who said the two men had been drinking, believed the car was coming towards town, and either struck or sideswiped another car. The car's left hand front fender was demolished, indicating a collision of some sort. The windshield was shattered. The car was completely upside down on the east side of the road. Blood splashes were plainly visible in the area of the wreck.

Officers were continuing their investigation of the crash late Monday afternoon.

Funeral Pending

Washburn is survived by his father, R. J. Washburn, Longview, who was notified of his death early Monday morning, and who is en route to Big Spring; three sisters, Mrs. L. H. Dudley of Big Spring; Mrs. W. E. Johnson of Longview, who is expected here tonight; and Mrs. T. A. Mann, Phoenix, who will be unable to come here.

Funeral arrangements are pending arrival of relatives. The body is being held at Eberly Funeral Home.

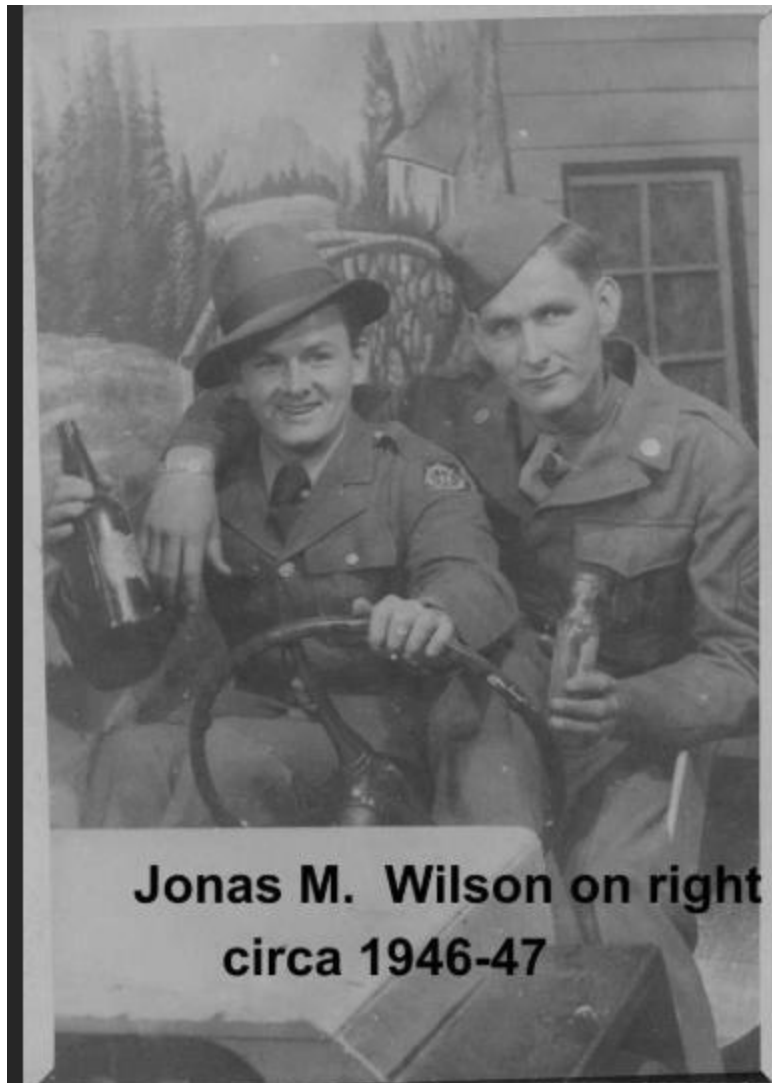

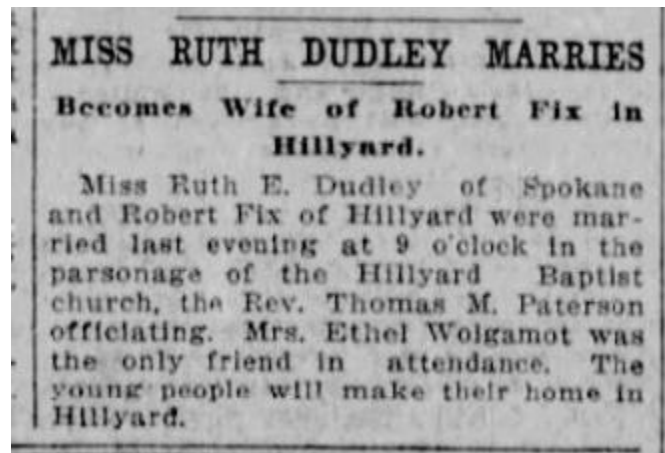
Youth of 17 Years Is Said to Have

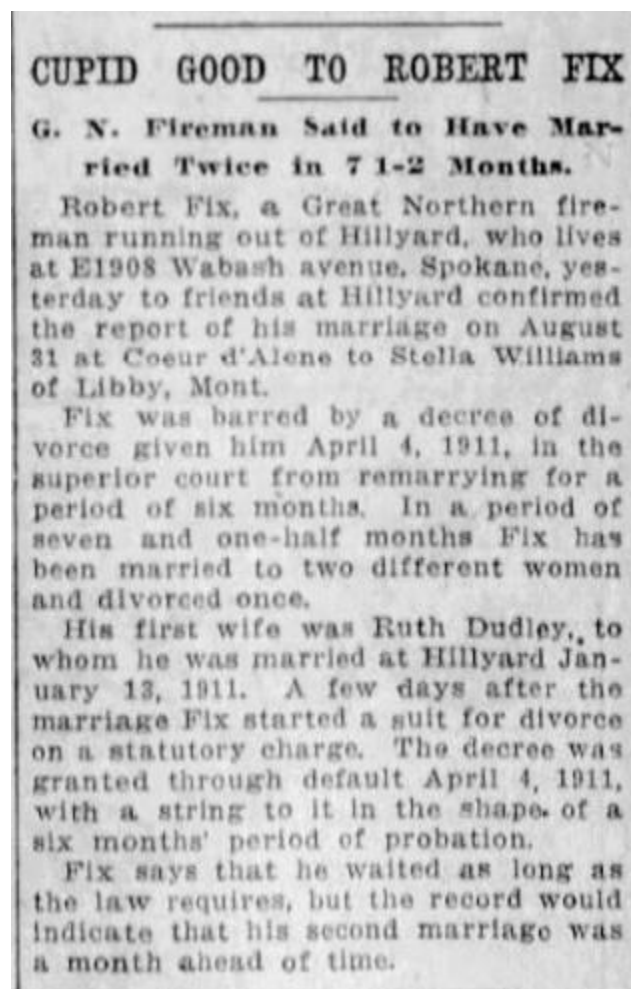
