SANDY (Special) — Funeral for Cecil O. Duke, former mayor of this community, will be at 10:30 a.m. Monday in the chapel of Carroll Funeral Home, Gresham. Mr. Duke died May 11 in a Portland Hospital after a brief illness.

Born Dec. 26, 1894, in Portland, he spent his childhood at Troutdale, attending Cedar School, and later Benke-Walker Business College.

At 19, he moved to Sandy and worked in the W. A. Proctor mill. After serving with the Army in World War I, he returned to Sandy, joining the Clackamas County Bank. He was assistant cashier at the time of his death. For more than 40 years, he was associated with the Duke and Proctor Insurance Co.

Mr. Duke was past commander of the American Legion Post here, past master of the Masonic Lodge of Sandy, longtime Kiwanian, and a member of the Tuscania Survivors Club.

He is survived by a son, Charles C. Duke of Bend.

Interment will be in Willamette National Cemetery.

Washington, Feb. 11.—The war department, through Secretary Baker Sunday night announced an additional list of names of survivors of the Tuscania disaster.

Cecil Duke and Jesse E. Rice Among Tuscania Survivors.

Cecil Duke, member of an engineer regiment, and son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Duke of Gresham, was aboard the Tus-

cania submarined in the North sea. From "somewhere" in Ireland Duke has written the following letter to his parents.

"Just a line to tell you that I am feeling fine. Have been in Ireland for about 10 days now at the little isolated hospital. I took the mumps on the steamer Tuscania. Nine of us boys were sent to the hospital where we have been getting the best of care from the people here at this place.

"A lady was here from the American Red Cross yesterday. She brought us some oranges, grapes, cigarettes, tobacco and some games so we had something to occupy our time. The Red Cross is doing all that could be expected. I will join my company in a few days."

LEGION TO VISIT HOOD

DELEGATES WILL BE TAKEN ON LOOP TRIPS.

National Convention Workers in Session to Make Final Arrangements.

GRESHAM, Or., June 11.—(Special.)—National convention workers for the American Legion met Friday night at the Arrah Wanna hotel at Wemme with representative groups from Gresham, Hood River, Sandy and Mount Hood, in the interests of plans for the Mount Hood loop trip to be given legionnaire visitors.

Jim Fiske, adjutant for the California state department of the legion, was present, and assured the gathering that of the 20,000 or 30,000 to come from California, many would take advantage of the trip. Vic McKenzie of the convention commission and Mrs. Ladocia Cobb of Prineville, state legion auxiliary president, also attended.

Benjamin H. Davies of Gresham, president of the Mount Hood Loop association, which was formed for the purpose of boosting the trip, acted as chairman and was assisted by Cecil O. 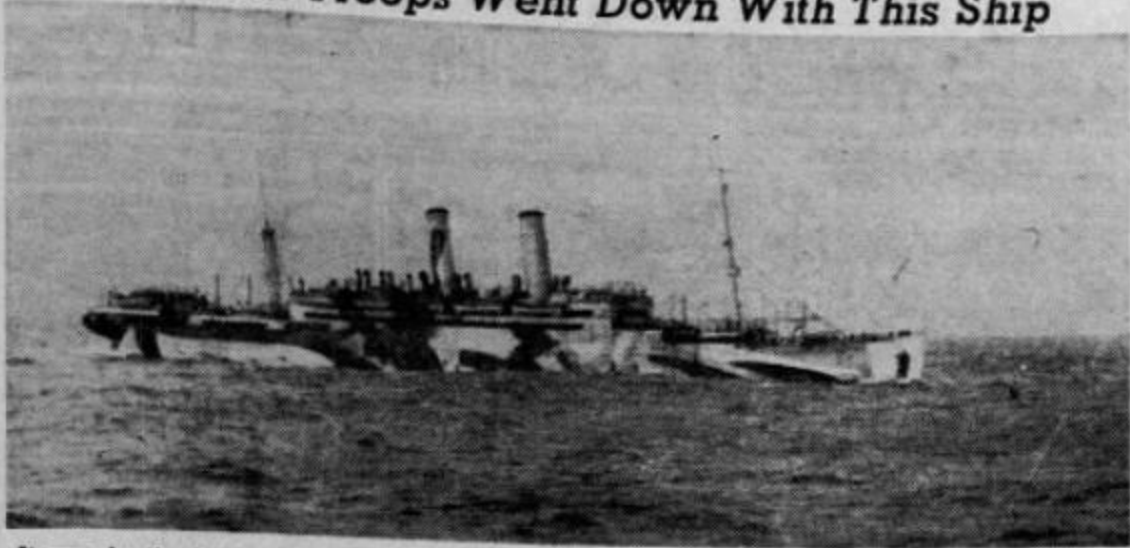

Tuscania Loss To Be Relived

A group of northwest men who know the horrors of being on a ship torpedoed at sea will gather at the Multnomah hotel next Saturday night at 6:30 o'clock for the annual reunion of the Tuscania Survivors association.

Yes, it was the transport Tuscania and the incident was one of the highlights of the last world war in 1918.

The same thing is going on in European waters again, and the gathering of the men who survived the sinking of the Tuscania has more significance this year than usual as a result of present conditions.

It is an old story, but one that bears repeating.

German Sub Waiting

The British troopship Tuscania, carrying United States troops overseas in 1918—many of those men were from the Pacific northwest—reached the Irish channel on February 5. A German submarine was there. The torpedo struck about 6 P. M.

On the Tuscania were 2300 men of the 16th, 17th and 18th companies of the 6th battalion of the 20th (forestry) engineers. These men were from Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Wisconsin. A total of 225 lost their lives.

Stories of the hardships the survivors underwent, of the bravery and the rescues will be repeated Saturday night when the members of the association, organized 20 years ago, reunite for their annual banquet. Many other yarns—some sad, some funny—will be repeated.

Cecil Duke President

The men who were on the ill-fated Tuscania will relive those days of war and in the same breath will hope this country will never again be engaged in such a conflict, according to Cecil O. Duke, Sandy banker, who is president this year of the association.

New officers will be elected at the reunion.

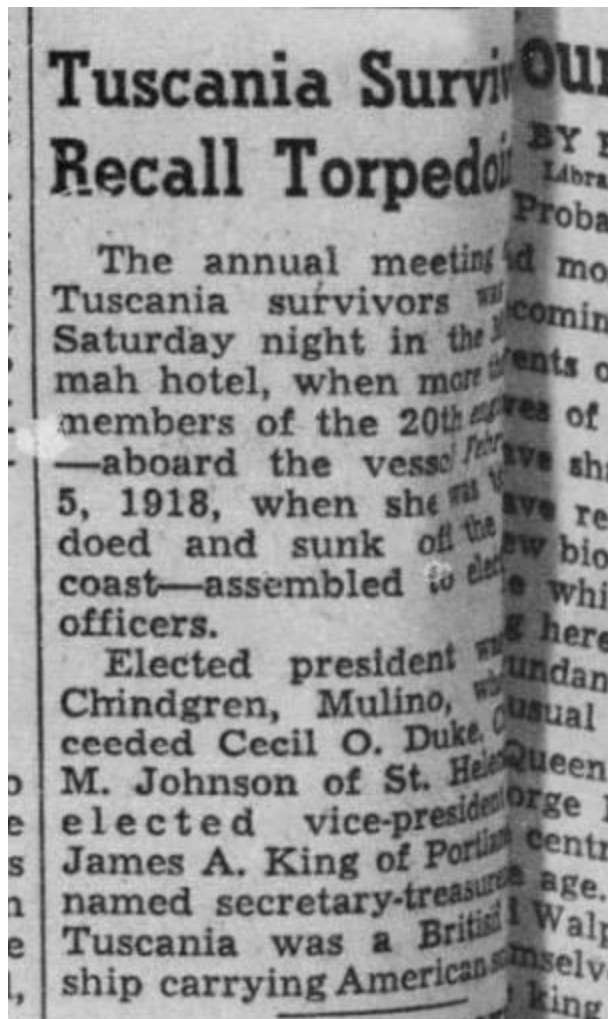

Cecil O. Duke, Sandy banker, is president of the survivors' association.

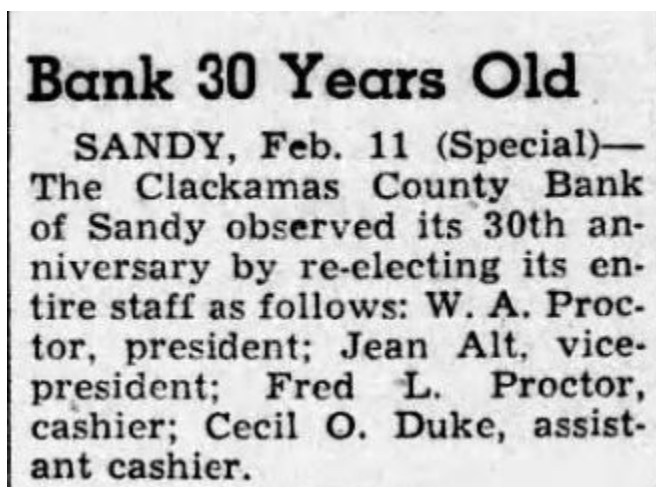

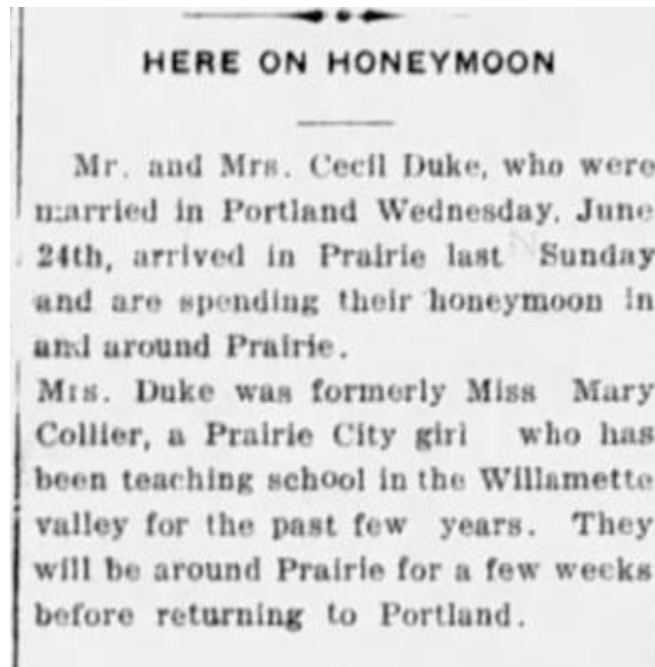

Olson, who will take over Naylor's duties here, is a native of Oregon and attended business college in Portland. He served in the U.S. Army from 1943 to 1946. Before going to Umatilla as administrative assistant in 1956, Olson served in the regional fiscal agent's office and on the Mt. Hood National Forest.

Active in Civic Affairs

In Pendleton, Olson has been active in civic affairs and served as Umatilla district finance chairman of the Boy Scouts, and was a director of the Umatilla County United Fund. Mr. and Mrs. Olson and their son will come to Bend from Pendleton in the near future to establish their home.

Stickney, also a native of Oregon, attended Kingman Business University, in Spokane, Wash. He was in the Army from 1942 to 1946, and started his career with the Forest Service on the Wallowa in 1946. In 1953 he was promoted and transferred to the supervisor's office of the Fremont forest, in Lakeview, from where he came to the Deschutes. Mr. and Mrs. Stickney and two children will move to Pendleton in the near future.

Naylor entered the Forest Service at Chelan, Wash., in 1915, but was out of the service between 1920 and 1934, part of the time in business in Eugene. He is a native of Minnesota.
