List of Texans on Torpedoed Tuscania

Washington, Feb. 8.—A large number of Texans and Oklahomans, members of army organizations, were on the ill-fated Tuscania, submarined off the Irish coast Wednesday. Who were lost probably will not be known by the war department for several days as it is necessary to cable the names of the survivors to the United States for checking.

The early estimate of 100 lost, of which approximately 75 were members of the military organization, appears from reports received today at the war department from the British admiralty, to have been too conservative. The number probably will be doubled.

The Texans and Oklahomans, for the main part, were volunteers, and are shown to have been members of practically every organization aboard but there was a detachment from Camp Travis, San Antonio. Three Dallas men appeared in the list. They are: Victor A. Mooner, whose address is given as "Dallas;" John Weatherall, Station A, Routel, and Patrick H. White of 711 South Akard Street.
