"HELLO, NEPHEW," LANDING GREETING

Survivor of the Tuscania from Waupaca County Receives a Pleasant Surprise when He Reaches Shore

Among the soldiers on the transport Tuscania when it was sunk by a submarine on the north of Ireland several months ago was Kirk Durrant of the town of Lind, Waupaca county, who had enlisted in the Waupaca company. Durrant escaped in one of the lifeboats which made its way to a village on the west coast of Scotland.

The people of the country around gathered at the shore to assist in the rescue and watch the Americans come in. As the boat was rowed in, a man in the party of townspeople started forward as he saw the face of Durrant.

"What is your name?" he asked.

"Kirk Durrant of Wisconsin."

"My name is McCunn," said the stranger. "I am your mother's brother."

There was a joyful greeting between nephew and uncle. The young man from Waupaca county, cast into sea in the wreck, had drifted ashore at the little village where his mother was born and where most of her relatives still live. He visited several days with his people, according to letters received by his cousin, Miss Durrant, who is employed as stenographer at the office of the district attorney. Later he proceeded to England and is presumed now to be in France.

Waupaca — Veterans of Company C, 4th Wisconsin Infantry, did not allow the cold rainy weather to dampen their spirits as they gathered Sunday at Grand View, Chain o' Lakes, for a reunion. Captained as they were 23 years ago by Dr. C. W. Andrews, members present unanimously agreed that Dr. Andrews must continue as their leader, and as such he was in charge of all of the activities of the day.

Sixty-eight men of the 178 who enrolled in May, 1917, were present for their second reunion to make plans for a Last Man's club, completing a permanent organization to meet annually until five remain to toast the ones gone before, with a bottle of choice cognac to be placed in a vault of the Farmer's State bank until that day.

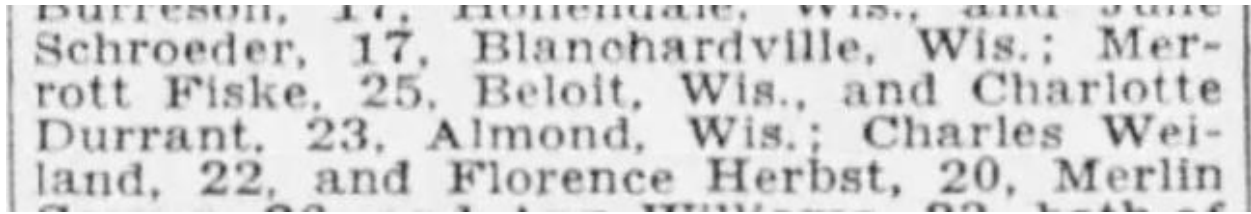

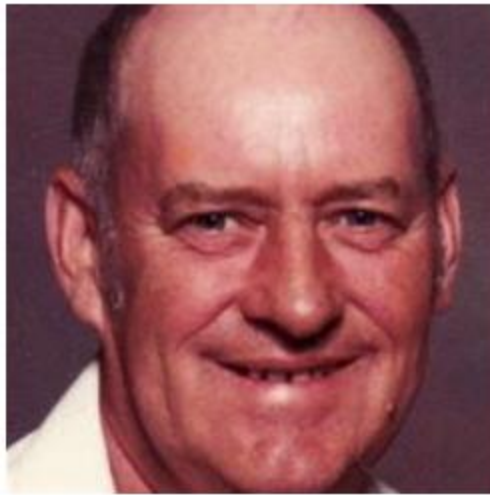

Survived by wife Hazel, 2 daughters: Mrs. Charlotte Fiske (Beloit WI) & Mrs. Lorraine Walotka (Oshkosh WI), 3 sons: Everett Durrant (Almond WI), Kenneth Durrant (Stoughton WI) & Willard Durrant (Oregon WI), sister Mrs. Jeanette Penney (Waupaca WI). "Wisconsin Rapids (WI) Daily Tribune" 9 Feb 1942 p 10 - NTSA reunion there. Kirwood [sic] Durrant of Waupaca Co., now a farmer, was a corporal., Co. A, 107th Supply Train. Is attending his 1st convention. He voiced a common sentiment (it's 2 months into WWII): "I only wish we had finished it up right when we were over there."

"Appleton (WI) Post-Crescent" 12 Aug 1947 p 20 – Almost 50 men attended the 4th reunion of Co. C, 4th Wisconsin Infantry & of the original Waupaca National Guard unit. It was held Sunday at the Waupaca Country Club. Of the 185 men who left on 17 Aug 1917 for Camp Douglas, all but 30 are still alive. While many live here, they also live from New York to California. Commanded by the late Dr. C.W. Andrews, the unit trained at Camp Douglas WI until it left 25 Sep 1917 for Camp McArthur in Waco TX. There, Co. C was broken up. One of the attendees was Kirkwood Durrant of Almond WI.

"Wisconsin Rapids (WI) Daily Tribune" 4 Apr 1951 p 16 – Mr. & Mrs. Kirk Durrant of Almond received word that their son, Everett Durrant, was injured when he slipped & fell on the Korean War front & is in a first-aid station.

"Appleton (WI) Post-Crescent" 17 May 1958 p 4 – Mrs. Kirk Durrant assumed the duties of matron at Fairchild Hall, Grand Army Home, King WI.
