List of Texans on Torpedoed Tuscania

Washington, Feb. 8.—A large number of Texans and Oklahomans, members of army organizations, were on the ill-fated Tuscania, submarined off the Irish coast Wednesday. Who were lost probably will not be known by the war department for several days as it is necessary to cable the names of the survivors to the United States for checking.

The early estimate of 100 lost, of which approximately 75 were members of the military organization, appears from reports received today at the war department from the British admiralty, to have been too conservative. The number probably will be doubled.

The Texans and Oklahomans, for the main part, were volunteers, and are shown to have been members of practically every organization aboard but there was a detachment from Camp Travis, San Antonio. Three Dallas men appeared in the list. They are: Victor A. Moorer, whose address is given as "Dallas;" John Weatherall, Station A, Routel, and Patrick H. White of 711 South Akard Street. The other Texans listed were:

The sudden illness of F. A. Lange, of Brookshire, one of the jurors in the Mack mail fraud case, interrupted the taking of defense testimony in federal court shortly after the noon recess Friday, and caused the adjournment of the court until 9 a. m. Monday.

Mr. Lange was stricken while sitting in the jury box waiting for the trial to be resumed. He had complained of feeling badly early in the day. Dr. H. L. Fountain was called and said that he had suffered a slight heart attack, and that he would be all right after a rest. Mr. Lange was taken to the home of Walter Ebel, a relative, and was reported to be resting well late Friday afternoon.

Taking of defense testimony in the Mack case continued during the morning session of the court. Two witnesses took the stand, one the fiscal agent for the sale of the company's stock, and the other one of the trustees of the concern.

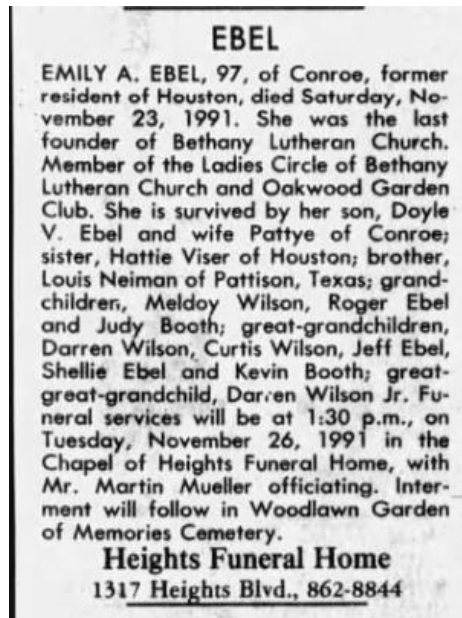

Doyle Victor Ebel went to heaven on March 18, 2017 at the age of 93. He was born March 17, 1924 in Houston, Texas. He joined the Army Air Corp March 18, 1943. He married Pattye Hambrick August 24, 1943.

He served in the Pacific Theater during WWII as a member of the 26th Bombardment Squadron and the 11th Bombardment Group. He flew on a B24 bomber named the Jeeter Bug. Among many decorations, he received the Distinguished Flying Cross. Many years later a film was broadcast on PBS about the perils of the Jeeter Bug Crew after their plane engine was shot out over Chi Chi Jima and was forced to make an emergency landing on Iwo Jima during the battle. The crew was also memorialized in a book "Brothers At Daybreak".

At the end of the war he returned to Houston and eventually found his way into the Houston Fire Department. He was one of the first firefighters to complete the Associate Degree in Fire Science Technology. He ascended to the rank of District Chief and retired after more than 40 years of fire service. He never forgot his "boys".

His favorite past time was working in his woodshop creating inlaid projects. During his life he enjoyed camping and fishing. He was a member of the 11th Bombardment Group Association and a member of the Tree of Life Lutheran Church.

He is survived by wife of 73 years Pattye Ebel, son Roger Ebel and wife Katherine, daughters Melody Wilson and husband Clenton and Judy Booth and husband Rick, grandchildren Darren, Wilson, Shellie Sauber, Curtis Wilson, Jeff Ebel, Kevin Booth and their spouses and 7 great grandchildren. KINCH WRITES FROM PACIFIC

Jeter Bug Gets Crack at Japs After Texans Fly 31 Missions

BY SAM KINCH.

WITH THE 7TH AIR FORCE BOMB GROUP, OKINAWA, July 29 (Delayed).—The B-24 Jeter Bug on which four Texans have flown 32 combat missions together during the past 13 months, got its first crack at the Japanese homeland this week.

The big Liberator dropped its bombs on Honshu, and Staff Sgt. Doyle Ebel of Houston, tail gunner, said "we got more flak there than on all our other 31 missions put together."

The plane, a veteran of 81 combat missions, has been hit by anti-aircraft fire five times but no member of the crew has been hurt.

It is named for the first pilot, 1st Lt. W. F. Jeter, Dallas.

Other Texans in the crew are 1st Lt. Herbert Harter, Amarillo, co-pilot, and Staff Sgt. Victor Crowell of Lamesa, nose gunner.

The Jeter Bug is part of the oldest bomber squadron in the Air Forces, the one of which Capt. Colin Kelly was a member before he crashed to death while bombing the Jap battleship Haruna.

The squadron was at Hawaii when the Japs struck Pearl Harbor, and its fliers have fought back up through New Caledonia, the Solomons, Tarawa, Guam and now

Okinawa. The squadron has made 29 moves during this war.

The Jeter Bug crew is sweating out its required eight more combat missions, after which members are due to go home for a rest.

Jeter's wife and two children and his mother, Mrs. Minnie Jeter, live in Dallas.

Harter's mother, Mrs. Edna Harter, lives in Dumas, and Ebel's wife lives in Houston. Ebel's parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Ebel, also live in Houston.

Crowell's wife and parents, Mr. and Mrs. L. C. Crowell, live in Lamesa.

Group navigator for this outfit is Capt. Cecil Smith Jr., West Los Angeles, who formerly lived in Fort Worth. His father, former oil operator in Texas, is a mining engineer in California.

Smith is a cousin of Miss Betty Claire Schmid and Ens. Mickey Schmid of Fort Worth.

This veteran outfit, accustomed to making itself comfortable on uncomfortable islands, has a carbonated water machine that is the ultimate in GI ingenuity.

With two reclaimed airplane oxygen tanks and a drum of carbon dioxide gas, the fliers are able to mix soft drinks with carbonated water—something unusual for combat outfits.

Mrs. Louise Auchbach Ebel, wife of W. M. Ebel, deceased, who died last Thursday morning at her home near Brookshire was buried Friday afternoon.

The greatest testimonial as to the marked esteem in which she was held in this community and also the surrounding county, was the fact of its being attended by the greatest gathering of friends and loved ones of Mrs. Ebel, known in this section of the country for some time.

But the post office was known as Patterson's Station when it was established in 1879, and then as Patterson in 1883, although the railway stop was always known as Pattison. The name "Pattison" was adopted in 1916. Germans were the predominant immigrant group & established the German Methodist Church there in 1875. The rail line to Pattison ceased operation in 1899, and nearby Brookshire, on the Missouri-Kansas-Texas
